Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

June 11, 2017 The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity Exodus 34:4b-6, 8-9 Daniel 3:52, 53, 54, 55 2 Corinthians 13:11-13 John 3:16-18

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life.

For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him. Whoever believes in him will not be condemned, but whoever does not believe has already been condemned, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God.

Focus questions:

- 1. Describe the hardest sacrifice you ever made.
- 2. Relate a time when you experienced the Spirit challenging or nudging you.
- 3. John 3:16 is such a popular verse that people will cite it by chapter and verse only. And it is understood. What do these words mean to you?

Family and children's question:

Talk about the time when you failed to act as Jesus and how you felt Jesus forgive you after.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Teacher: You can be sure that if Moses were alive he would be considered a remarkable man.

Student: He sure ought to be – he would be more than 2500 years old. The teacher expressed Moses as a great gift from God qualitatively while the student understood Moses quantitatively measuring his life span in years. True, each of us is quantitatively a measurable entity. At the same time every one of us has within us something immeasurable.

Today, the Feast of Pentecost revives 'the immeasurable within us'. Jesus, the incarnated Son of God lived among us to make us grasp the 'immeasurable within us.' His whole life, his deeds and words were his ways of making us realize that we can live God's immeasurable life in our human measurable bodies just as Jesus lived the immeasurable God in his measurable human body.

Now He sends His Spirit from Heaven , The HOLY SPIRIT to abide within us so that we might always be reminded of the immeasurable Godly qualities within us. We have received the Holy Spirit who can make us live the Godly potentials. If we cooperate with the Holy Spirit we will receive His seven gifts (wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of the Lord). His seven gifts will make our lives bear his 12 fruits: charity, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, generosity, gentleness, faithfulness, modesty, self-control, and chastity. Let us live the immeasurable in our measurable body.

Please pray to St. Thomas More, who himself was a family man with children and grandchildren, to intercede for us to God for heavenly grace upon our families.

This is just an outward expression of the spiritual truth that you and your household are filled with gifts of Holy Spirit. School to Teacher: Don't Pray for your Colleagues:

Maine: H.S. educational technician, Toni Richardson, filed charges of religious discrimination and retaliation with the Equal Employment Opportunity Commission (EEOC) in May, after being instructed to never use phrases like, "I will pray for you" and "You are in my prayers" in private conversations with coworkers.

Toni had tried to privately encourage a coworker with whom she attends church, by saying, "I will pray for you." Yet months later, after a falling out, this coworker lodged a complaint against her and the school gave Toni an official "coaching memorandum" which told her that stating, 'you were in my prayers', is not acceptable. The memorandum said that she could not use "phrases that integrate public and private belief systems" while at school. The memo specifically explains she will face discipline or dismissal in the future for using these phrases.

"What Augusta Public Schools did by punishing Toni for discussing her faith in a private conversation with a coworker is unconscionable," said a Maine law firm. "The law is clear: employers cannot discriminate against employees who privately discuss their faith while at work."

"School employees are not required to hide their faith from each other while on campus," said First Liberty Senior Counsel.


