



FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Bill: I'd move heaven and earth to break my 110 score in today's golf game.

Phil: Try moving heaven. You've already moved plenty of earth today.

Every day we try our best to achieve what we wish or plan our life to be. We are ready to move heaven and earth to become what we would like to be.

In today's Gospel Jesus calls the moment of his death as the moment of being glorified by God, His Father. How can His painful and shameful death on the Cross be an event of Divine Glory? In last week's Gospel we heard that God so loved the world that God offered His only son. Thus the purpose of Christ's death on the Cross is the expression of God's love for us. This week Jesus proclaims that the purpose of God is being fulfilled in his death on the Cross.

Jesus calls his hanging on the Cross as "lifted up from the earth." And when He will be lifted upon the Cross, He will draw everyone to Himself, meaning that the moment of his death is the time when God will gather all of us as God's family around God in Jesus. Jesus' death on the Cross is a free invitation from God to become God's family of love. Whoever we are and however unworthy we may be, we can become God's loving children by believing in Jesus' death and resurrection. Let us get ourselves prepared to celebrate and participate in this mystery of Gods love, the death and resurrection of Jesus in Holy Week.

Friday, March 23rd at 6:00 pm is the Soup Supper. If you wish to attend please bring a meatless soup to share with others. Soup supper will be followed by Stations of the Cross. This is the last Stations of the Cross before Good Friday. We will pray it in a special way laying down all our burdens at the foot of the Cross. All are welcome.

Next Sunday is Palm Sunday. We begin Holy week. Palms will be blessed and distributed at all the masses.

Next Monday, March 26, confessions will be heard from 3:00 pm and 9:00 pm in our church and in all the churches of our Diocese.

HAMS, HAMS, HAMS!!!



Religious Liberty Eroding in Canada - *A Cautionary Tale for Americans:*

Canada's Catholic bishops say the government's new Canada Summer Jobs grant policy "conflicts directly with the right to freedom of religion and conscience which is enshrined in the Charter of Rights and Freedoms ..." This new policy requires that employers sign a form supporting abortion and transgender "rights" in order to receive student summer job grants, thus restricting the voices of faith communities in Canada and limiting their participation in the public square.

"It seriously undermines the right to religious freedom since the Government of Canada is directly limiting the right of religious traditions to hold, teach and practice their principles and values in public," the bishops wrote.

Non-profit groups, small businesses, and private sector employers can apply for funding for wage subsidies for students ages 15-30. However, some in government did not want pro-life groups receiving any Canada Summer Jobs grants, so this year they added the new requirement that pro-life individuals and businesses cannot, in good conscience, sign.

Some unfortunate consequences of this new policy will be: summer camps will be forced to close; the services of numerous non-profit organizations will be reduced; apprenticeship opportunities will be lost. "These effects, to name but a few, will be felt in Catholic dioceses and organizations as well as in many other faith communities across Canada." 
