



April 1, 2018 Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord Acts 10:34A, 37-43 Psalm: 118: 1-2, 16-17, 22-23 Colossians 3: 1-4 John 20: 1-9

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him." So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first; he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in. When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A man bought a small farm and was visited by his neighbor. He asked him, "Can you tell me where the property line runs between these farms?" The man replied "Are you talking owning or mowing?"

If we ask God what is the love-line that runs between God and ourselves, God will show us the Cross on which Jesus hangs. Because God so loved us that he gave his only Son on the Cross as an expression of His divine unconditional love. Jesus was crucified for the good works he did. But he changed his punishment, the Cross, into redemptive blessings for us. Jesus used the instrument of punishment to offer God's love to us. This is the message of Holy Week.

We begin Holy week with Palm Sunday. Holy Week commemorates the events that happened to Jesus during the last week of His earthly life. Palm Sunday celebrates how people saw Jesus as their Messiah entering the city of Jerusalem. <u>Holy Thursday</u> is the Last Supper during which Jesus offered his presence in the form of Bread and Wine – the Eucharist. <u>Good Friday</u>, Jesus died on the Cross expressing God's incredible love for us. <u>Holy Saturday</u> evening we will celebrate the vigil of Jesus' Resurrection from death.

The events of Holy Week show us how God chiseled the best sculpture in Jesus. In Jesus, God reveals to us how God can chisel the best out of each one of us if we too allow ourselves like Jesus did.

Holy Week invites us to be like Jesus. We too can become God's wonderful act of victory even over death. As St. Paul says, 'if we die with Jesus we will rise with Jesus'.

I extend a personal welcome to each of you to celebrate the mysteries of Holy Week. Let us journey with Jesus. We have something going on in our Church every day of Holy Week. <u>Please go through the Holy Week Schedule</u> and allow yourselves to be chiseled by God for the best of yourselves to come out as God's wonderful work of art.

Reconciliation Monday: Monday 26th is Reconciliation Monday. Confessions will be heard from 3:00 pm to 9:00 pm in our Church and in all the Catholic Churches of our Diocese of Rockville Centre. Individual Confession cleanses and illumines our hearts to enter into the mystery of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday. All are welcome.

Lenten Cantata, 'Weeping Tree'. Our Choir has put a lot of effort and practice into this Spiritual Musical. I have personally heard and enjoyed it. Please don't fail to come. It is on Wednesday March 28th at 7:30 pm. It would spiritually prepare us to enter the mystical meaning of the Holy three days-- Holy Thursday, Good Friday and Holy Saturday of Holy Week.

Another moving way of entering into the somber mood of Good Friday is Tenebre, which is an evening prayer celebrating the Redemptive death of Jesus with candles in the dark and listening to the scriptures. Please come on Good Friday, March 30th at 7:30pm.

Our Parish Outreach is preparing the Easter Baskets and Easter Dinner for the poor and needy of our Parish. Please support them to help the poor.



Freedom of Conscience & Religion Rights Ignored: Washington State: A bill containing no religious or moral exemptions, requiring the state's insurers who cover maternity care to also cover elective abortions and contraception, was passed by the state legislature and awaits the governor's signature. The bill also requires that as of 2019, health plans must provide free sterilizations, contraceptive drugs and devices. ~The Washington State Catholic Conference, along with pro-life groups and churches, strongly oppose the bill because it would promote abortions while violating constitutionally-protected conscience rights of individuals, churches, businesses and others. "We strongly believe that even those who do not share our unconditional commitment to the dignity of every person from the moment of conception, have every reason to support our right to exercise our conscience in accord with the teachings of our faith," a Bishop's letter states.

Little Sisters of the Poor Freedom of Conscience & Religion Still Threatened:

In October, 2017, the government issued a new rule admitting that it violated the law when it tried to force religious ministries like the Little Sisters to violate their faith and include abortions and contraception in their health insurance plans. The rule fulfills the 2016 Supreme Court ruling and the President's 2017 Executive Order, but the Little Sisters still need permanent court protection to finally end their yearslong lawsuit and go back to serving the elderly poor. ~The case has been on hold ever since the Supreme Court unanimously overturned the lower court rulings against the Little Sisters, ordered the government not to impose \$70 million in fines, and ordered the lower courts to allow time for the federal government to "accommodate the petitioners' religious beliefs."


