



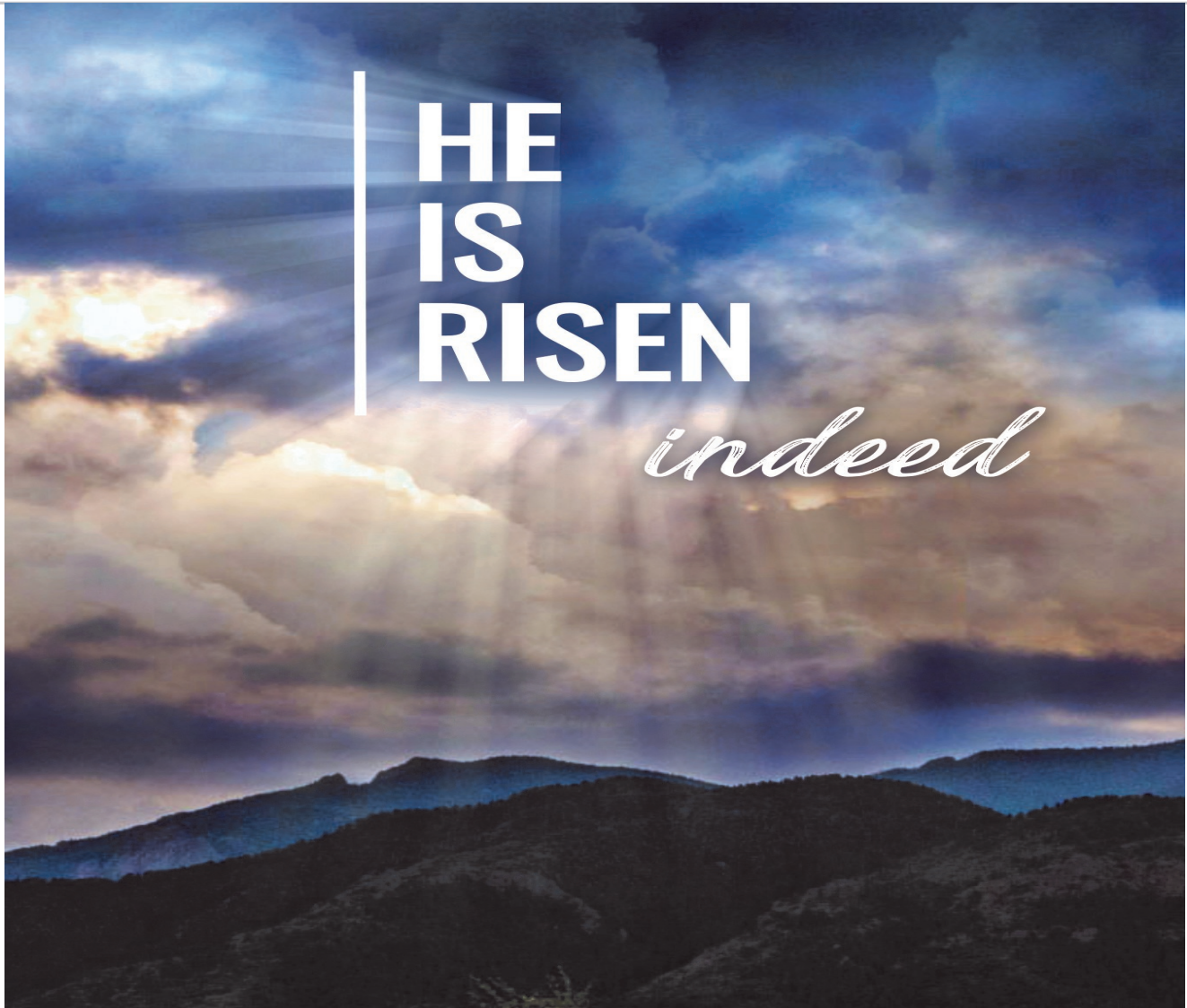

Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

April 8, 2018
Second Sunday of Easter --Sunday of Divine Mercy
Acts 4:32-35
Psalm: 118: 2-4, 13-15, 22-24
1 John 5:1-6
John 20: 19-31

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you."

And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nailmarks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe."

Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe." Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."

Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name.

Focus questions:

1. Have your friends ever failed you or you failed them when they needed you? How did you reconcile?
2. Describe a time when you doubted that your faith was real.
3. Who has shown you mercy?

Family and children's question:

Make a visit to Church this week to light a candle for a special intention.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Jesus is Risen! Alleluia! Happy and Blessed Easter to all.

Little Susie concluded her prayer by saying, "Dear God, before I finish, please take care of Daddy, take care of Mommy, take care of my baby brother, Grandma and Grandpa.... And please, God, take care of yourself, or else we're all sunk!"

On Good Friday the disciples of Jesus felt that they are all sunk. But the women who went to the tomb of Jesus on Sunday morning, brought back the news of 'Rising' ... no more being sunk because Jesus is Risen from the Dead.

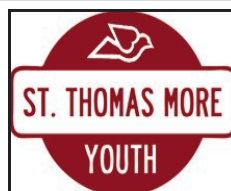
Know that you are doing God's work.

Freedom of Worship's Assault on "Freedom of Religion":

The right to live, work and worship according to one's faith is a freedom foundational to the United States. The Founders were clear, and the Bill of Rights makes it foundational to our Constitution, that the government should not infringe on the free exercise of religion.

In recent years, however, Americans have faced attempts to water down this robust understanding of religious freedom to a mere "freedom to worship."

"Freedom of worship" means religious beliefs need to go in the Closet - or into four walls of a home or house of worship - and that faith should remain a private affair that is relegated to personal activities or weekend worship services.

"Freedom of religion" means religious believers can say and do as their conscience dictates in the public square. It includes freedom of worship but is also the right to evangelize, change their religion, have schools and charitable institutions, and conduct their jobs and businesses according to their conscience and religious beliefs.

"The freedom of religion is much more than just the freedom to worship," said Sen. James Lankford. "Worship confines you to location. Freedom of religion is the right to exercise your religious beliefs - it is the ability of Americans to live out their faith or choose to have no faith at all." "Congress shall make no law respecting the establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof; ..." First Amendment to the Bill of Rights
