Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

April 15, 2018 Third Sunday of Easter Acts 3:13-15 Psalm: 4:2, 4, 7-8, 9 1 John 2:1-5a Luke 24:35-48

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

The two disciples recounted what had taken place on the way, and how Jesus was made known to them in the breaking of bread.

While they were still speaking about this, he stood in their midst and said to them,

"Peace be with you."

But they were startled and terrified and thought that they were seeing a ghost. Then he said to them,

"Why are you troubled? And why do questions arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and my feet, that it is I myself. Touch me and see, because a ghost does not have flesh and bones as you can see I have."

And as he said this, he showed them his hands and his feet. While they were still incredulous for joy and were amazed, he asked them, "

Have you anything here to eat?"

They gave him a piece of baked fish; he took it and ate it in front of them.

He said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the law of Moses and in the prophets and psalms must be fulfilled."

Then he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures. And he said to them,

"Thus it is written that the Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things."

Focus questions:

- 1. Do you ever have difficulty understanding the Scripture? Do you ever ask God to help you understand it?
- 2. How has your belief in the Risen Jesus made a difference in your life?.
- 3. Relate an experience that brought peace to your life during a difficult time.?

Family and children's question:

Talk about the signs of spring you see. How do these signs help you to see God?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

I came across a spring time song imitating the song 'The twelve days of Christmas'.

"On the fifth day of springtime my true love gave to me: five packs of seed, four sacks of fertilizer, three cans of weed killer, two bottles of insect of spray and a pruning knife for the pear tree." We are getting ready for Spring. Spring opens the doors for the life which was dormant in the winter.

What happens outwardly to life-force in Nature during Spring happens inwardly (spiritually) in Easter for the believers. Easter unfolds life to its full swing. For those who believe in Jesus, the door of life opens to its eternal and immense possibilities.

This Sunday following Easter Sunday is called Divine Mercy Sunday. Jesus, who rose from death, did not go vengefully after those who put him to death. He pleaded with God while hanging on the Cross, for the forgiveness of those who crucified Him, now after the Resurrection Jesus reached out to them in Mercy to offer them peace and forgiveness. He invariably greeted everyone with "Peace (Shalom) be with you" whenever He appeared to them. The resurrection means life, not judgement of what we did do or did not do. The Risen Lord invites us to start life with Him.

Mercy is the essence of life. Whoever offers Mercy to others promises and promotes life both for oneself and others. Whoever refuses Mercy to others not only blocks life but also becomes burdensome both to oneself and all. Let us pray to the Risen Lord to make us persons of Mercy like Him, to cherish life in ourselves and others. First Holy Communion of our young men and women will be celebrated at the Masses on Saturday April 22nd and 28th at 5:00 pm, and on Sunday, April 29th at the 12:15 pm Mass. We appreciate everyone's understanding if their usual seat is not available at those Masses.

"ANY AND ALL CHRISTIAN MUSIC IS BANNED!"

Florida: This sign was posted on an organ located in a commons area of a condo building in Port Charlotte, FL. The condo Board passed a new resolution in February that stated, "prayers and other religious services, observations, or meetings of any nature shall not occur ... in or upon any of the common elements." A group of residents had held a Bible study group in the buildings common room for almost a year.

"The (condo) resolution, both in text and in application, is discriminatory and violates the Fair Housing Act because it prohibits ... residents from accessing common condominium areas for any religious activity, while allowing other residents to use those same facilities for similar secular purposes," said First Liberty law firm, after a resident filed a federal complaint.

Freedom of Speech and Religious Expression under attack:

~Michigan: Citizens at a Senior Center were told that if they continued to say Grace before meals, federal funding for the meals would end. "If you continue to pray, you know what will happen." The message was clear - you can either eat or you can pray.

The Great Lakes Justice Center has challenged this policy. ~Pennsylvania: In 2016, when the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) revised regulations regarding food distribution to the homeless to say that no religious activities - such as praying over the meal - could occur, Bethesda Mission was forced to decline accepting USDA surplus food. "... in some way, we serve 100,000 poor and homeless people a month ...," said the Mission. "We don't force our faith on anybody. But we find the whole idea of the government coming in and tell us what to do .. is out of bounds, especially in matters of faith"


