



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

April 29, 2018 Fifth Sunday of Easter Acts 9:26-31 Psalm: 22:26-27, 28, 30, 31-31 1 John 3:18-24 John 15:1-8

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

Jesus said to his disciples:

"I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine grower. He takes away every branch in me that does not bear fruit, and every one that does he prunes so that it bears more fruit. You are already pruned because of the word that I spoke to

Remain in me, as I remain in you.

Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own

unless it remains on the vine.

so neither can you unless you remain in me.

I am the vine, you are the branches.

Whoever remains in me and I in him will bear much fruit,

because without me you can do nothing.

Anyone who does not remain in me

will be thrown out like a branch and wither;

people will gather them and throw them into a fire

and they will be burned.

If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask for whatever you want and it will be done for you.

By this is my Father glorified,

that you bear much fruit and become my disciples."

Focus questions:

- 1. How would your life be different if you were not attached to "the vine"?
- 2. How do you respond when some member of your family no longer wants to be attached to "the vine"?
- 3. What might God be calling you to detach from in order to grow?

Family and children's question:

Find something to do for someone else this week that will make God happy. Talk about that experience at the end of the week.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

"Have you heard of the new remedy on the market for baldness? It's made of alum and persimmon juice. It doesn't grow hair, but it shrinks your head to fit what hair you have. The hair is to beautify and protect the head and not the other way round.

Today's Gospel portrays how Jesus the Shepherd, unlike the hired man, does not take advantage of his sheep but lays down his life for them. The sheep are not for the shepherd but the shepherd is for the sheep. One of the lines from the paschal hymn (found in our missalette) goes like this, "Agnus redemit oves" which means "The Lamb redeems Sheep". The Lamb of God is another image for Jesus as a Shepherd. As St. Paul describes "Our Paschal lamb, Christ has been sacrificed. Therefore let us celebrate the feast." (1 Cor. 5:7).

Our Shepherd has become a sacrificial lamb for us, the sheep. He became one of us, humans. He sacrificed Himself for us in order that we may rise from death and live forever like him. The shepherd, the lamb sacrificed himself for us in order that we, the sheep can live with the Shepherd forever. Whenever we look at the cross let us try to recognize the quality of life that the Shepherd wants us to live. We the sheep can live like our Shepherd. We too can become a Lamb of God to promise and promote life in other sheep.

This year 103 children will sit on the Eucharistic Table of the Lord for their First Communion. This weekend and next the Sacrament of First Holy Communion will be administered to them at the 5:00 pm mass on Saturday and at the 12:15 pm mass on Sunday. Let us pray for them that they may cherish the presence of Jesus in themselves. Let us also pray for their parents that they may have all the spiritual zeal and strength to offer frequent opportunities to approach this guiding presence of Jesus, the Good Shepherd.

On May 17, Bishop Robert Brennan will administer the Sacrament of Confirmation to 135 children of our parish. Now, more than any time in their life, the teenagers need guidance from their heart to choose the right thing and the strength to live it. Our society, in the name of freedom is filled with various ideologies and harmful technological applications that serve more as traps to quench the full force of life in them. Let us pray for them that God's Holy Spirit fill them with His divine gifts to choose good and the strength to say NO to evil.




