

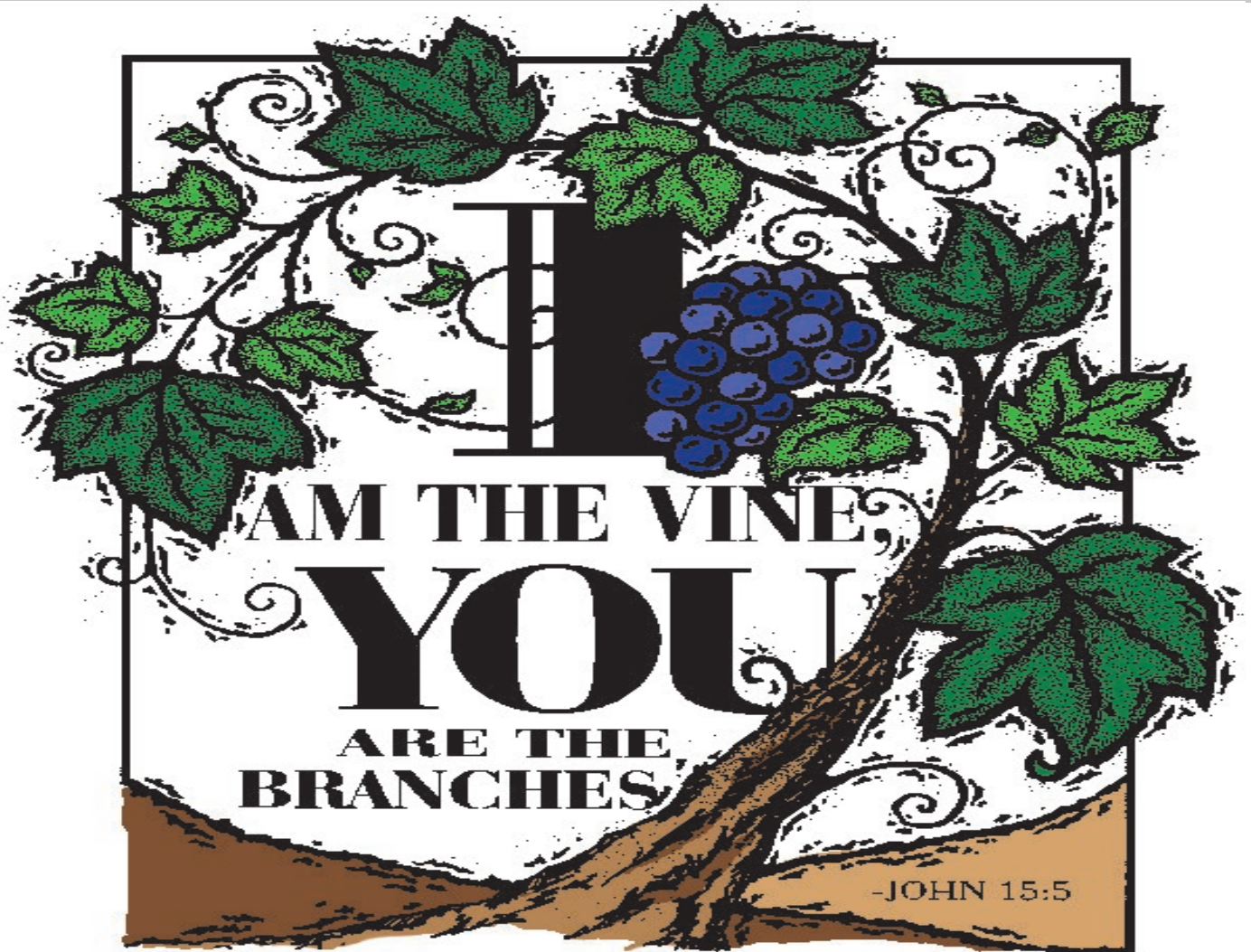

Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

May 6, 2018
Sixth Sunday of Easter
 Acts 10: 25-26, 34-35, 44-48
 Psalm: 98:1, 2-3, 3-4
 1 John 4:7-10
 John 15: 9-17

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

Jesus said to his disciples:

"As the Father loves me, so I also love you. Remain in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and remain in his love.

"I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and your joy might be complete. This is my commandment: love one another as I love you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I no longer call you slaves, because a slave does not know what his master is doing. I have called you friends, because I have told you everything I have heard from my Father. It was not you who chose me, but I who chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit that will remain, so that whatever you ask the Father in my name he may give you. This I command you: love one another."

Focus questions:

1. How deeply do you believe that God loves you unconditionally?
2. Describe an experience of joy that you had this Easter season.
3. Relate a time when the love you shared with others was spread to even more people.

Family and children's question:

Talk about the people you know who generously serve others.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Viewer: “Is this one of your silly abstract paintings?”

Artist: “No, that is a mirror, reflecting your image.”

One who is happily satisfied with one's reflection in a mirror is the boldest person. It takes lot of courage and spiritual strength to accept one's own reality without any excuse or justification. Until and unless one frankly realizes how good as well as bad one is, that person can never grow in his/her full potential.

Today's first reading shows Paul, the persecutor of Christians becoming the proclaimer of Christ to Christians. He becomes a follower of Christ by the grace of the Risen Lord. Once he accepted the grace of the Risen Lord, he realized he was led from his old way to a new realization of how new can be. The grace led him to realize his full potential of Christ's apostle.

Today's Gospel explains how we, the branches can bear fruit by joining ourselves to the Vine, the Risen Jesus. As long as we know that we are branches we will make attempts to keep joined to the Vine. The real growth for the branches depends upon their remaining connected to the Vine. But we have a tendency to treat ourselves as though we are self-sufficient and can be alive ourselves without being joined to the Vine. Jesus says today, “Without me you can do nothing. Anyone who does not remain in me will be thrown out like a branch and wither.” Let us be like St. Paul. Let us be fully alive and bear fruit by remaining in the true Vine, Jesus.

Work in Progress: We are installing surveillance cameras in and around the church. You can see a camera in the narthex, up in the corner of Sacristy and the Ushers room and another at the right corner outside the front entrance of the Church. We plan to have two more, in and outside the side entrance of the Church.

We are also coming closer to the time of getting the Certificate of Occupancy for the renovated church. We have to take care of a few minor things like installing the Handicap signs and filling the potholes at the west entrance of the parking lot.

PARISH OUTREACH



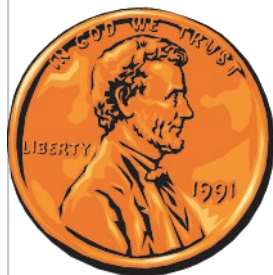

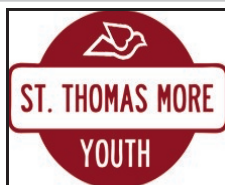
The Fourth Grade Religious Education program collected pennies throughout the year! This year our Fourth Graders raised **\$736.00**.

Harvard Punishes Christian Student Group:

Harvard University has sanctioned and placed on probation the largest Christian student group on campus, Harvard College Faith & Action (HCFA), for the group's expectation that its student leadership follow orthodox Christian ethical teachings on sexuality.

HCFA had asked a Bible study leader to resign after learning she was in a same-sex relationship. "We reject any notion that we discriminate on the basis of sexual orientation in our fellowship," wrote the HCFA co-presidents. "The student in this case was removed because of an irreconcilable theological disagreement ..." In Christian theology, homosexual conduct - not people - is considered sinful. "Our theological view is that - for professing Christians who are in leadership - celibacy is the only option outside the bounds of marriage."

The situation at Harvard is not unique. Clashes between religious clubs and campus diversity policies have occurred at Vanderbilt, Bowdoin, Wayne State, University of Iowa, and California State University systems, to name a few.

Religious clubs have the right to select their own leadership and set standards for leaders within the organization just as other campus groups do.

CitizenGoUSA wrote: "Would Harvard force a Muslim student group to retain a student leader who decided to convert to Christianity? Would Harvard force an LGBT+ group to retain a student leader who expressed views critical of same-sex relationships? Ofcourse not"
