May 13, 2018 Seventh Sunday of Easter Acts 1:15-17, 20A, 20C-26 Psalm: 103: 1-2, 11-12, 19-20 1 John 4:11-16 John 17: 11B-19

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

Lifting up his eyes to heaven, Jesus prayed saying: "Holy Father, keep them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one just as we are one. When I was with them I protected them in your name that you gave me, and I guarded them, and none of them was lost except the son of destruction, in order that the Scripture might be fulfilled. But now I am coming to you. I speak this in the world so that they may share my joy completely. I gave them your word, and the world hated them, because they do not belong to the world any more than I belong to the world. I do not ask that you take them out of the world but that you keep them from the evil one. They do not belong to the world any more than I belong to the world. Consecrate them in the truth. Your word is truth. As you sent me into the world, so I sent them into the world. And I consecrate myself for them, so that they also may be consecrated in truth."

### FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

### "Every once in a while my wife puts on one of those mud packs."

"Does it improve her looks?"

"Only for a few days – then the mud falls off!"

Today's readings speak about the real cosmetic that will keep us beautiful forever. The body by age will betray its decay. But the spirit, that is eternal in us, will turn our wrinkles into our laugh lines. God is love and those who live by love become Godly. There can't be anything more beautiful than to bring the Godly from our inside out in words and deeds.

**Today's Gospel proclaims to us God's command: "Love One Another."** All those who love are adorned with the Godly quality of living always in joy. The lovers will never be enslaved by anyone, nor enslave anyone. Out of Love, God served us life by giving His Son on the Cross. Thus, Love will make us live in freedom of serving life to others and make us receive thankfully life as a gift from others.

The Easter Season which comes to an end this Thursday with the Feast of the Ascension, strongly convinces us of the life-giving-value of Love. Let us pray with the words of St. Peter to the first Century Church, "Do not adorn yourselves outwardly by braiding your hair, and by wearing gold ornaments or fine clothing; rather let your adornment be the inner-self with the lasting beauty of a gentle and quiet spirit, which is precious in God's sight." (1 Peter 3:3-4).

This Thursday, May 10<sup>th</sup> is the 40<sup>th</sup> day of Easter, the Solemn Feast of the Ascension of our Lord. After being raised from the dead, Jesus appeared various times to his disciples and the believers. He made them realize that He is alive with them, the Church, forever. Then he ascended into heave to be seated at the right Hand of God. Ascension is the feast proclaiming the living truth that God's saving presence is with us now and forever. It is a day of obligation. We have a vigil Mass on Wednesday May 9<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 pm. On the feast day of Ascension the masses are at 9:00 am and 7:00pm.

We are on the process of mounting Security and Surveillance Cameras in and outside the front and side entrances to the Church. We have already two cameras inside the church, which help project the liturgical events on the days whenever we open the annex to accommodate a greater number of worshipers. Now in continuation of our Golden Jubilee renovation, we mount two cameras in and outside the front and side entrances to the church. The camera that will be outside the side entrance will also cover the parking lot in wider radius. We live in a world exposed to cameras in all sorts of environments. After few minor incidents happened to us in and around Church the Diocese and our Pastoral Council suggested we mount security and surveillance cameras. We greatly appreciate Mike Hoffman whose hard and generous work helped achieve this security and safety for our Church and parishioners.



A Bill Assaults Religious Freedom & Free Speech (A Cautionary Tale for all States):

A new bill in California claims to protect LGBT people, but actually limits their choices, censors speech, and infringes upon religious freedom," wrote Monica Burke, researcher for Religion and Civil Society.

This assault on free exercise of religion and free speech hurts everyone, especially those LGBT individuals who wish to seek help or information in their efforts to understand or refrain from certain inclinations. This legislation would set a precedent for the government to silence certain viewpoints.

The CA legislature introduced Bill 2943 that amends a consumer law with the purpose to ban "sexual orientation change efforts." This expansive law would impose widespread censorship that could implicate authors, speakers, counselors, colleges and universities, and even religious leaders seeking to address unwanted same-sex attraction or gender identity confusion.

In CA, licensed counselors are already banned from helping minors with unwanted same-sex attractions. This bill goes beyond this ban and legal experts have confirmed that it could ban books, shut down churches, and close psychiatric offices all over the state

No one in the state of CA could teach a course or recommend books that in any way challenge LGBT ideology. Bookstores or online platforms, such as Amazon, that sell such books, could be punished or not allowed to sell in CA. Colleges and universities that maintain codes of conduct requiring students to live consistent with biblical views on sexuality, could also be punished.

Anyone who is offended by a statement, teaching, or practice with regard to sexual orientation and gender identity could file a lawsuit against a minister, counselor, author, store, or educational institution that offended them.
