Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

May 27, 2018

**The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity
Deuteronomy 4:32-34, 39-40**

Psalm: 33: 4-5, 6, 9, 18-19, 20, 22

Romans 8: 14-17

Matthew 28: 16-20

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew:

The eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had ordered them. When they all saw him, they worshiped, but they doubted.

Then Jesus approached and said to them, "All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age."

Focus questions:

1. Who are the people you have shared or continue to share the good news with?
2. Jesus' last line in the Gospel is a promise to always be with his disciples. How do you feel when you hear these words?
3. Describe a time when you "entertained doubts" about God. What helped you?

Family and children's question:

Talk about the importance of being a follower of Jesus.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Marriage is like a violin – after the music stops, the strings are still attached. The violin is always united with its parts, both when it sounds its music and when it is silent. True spirituality, like the violin, remains in the loving relationship with God and others, both in its active moments of music and passive moments of silence or sorrow.

This Sunday is the Solemn Feast of Pentecost. Today we celebrate Mary and the apostles receiving God's gift of the Holy Spirit in visible tongues of fire coming down upon them. We believe in the Trinitarian God: one God in three persons. God the Father is our creator. God the Son, Jesus Christ, reconciles us with the Father as God's children. God the Father and God the Son pour upon us their free gift, the third person of the Trinity, the Holy Spirit, who acts from our hearts to live the relationship we have with God and other human beings.

We have received this free divine gift of the Holy Spirit in the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation. If we are consciously and always aware of the Holy Spirit of God dwelling in our hearts, we will be like the violin, having strength and guidance to live our loving relationship with God and others in all moments--sweet or silent, happy or sad, pleasant or painful.

Pentecost Sunday: The Parish thanks all the volunteer-families of the Children's Mass who tied red balloons to cars. Please bring the balloons to your home and tie them to your mail box. This would be an outward sign of the spiritual truth that you and your household are filled with gifts of the Holy Spirit. The waving balloons proclaim that your inner Spirit is filled with the fruits of the Holy Spirit-- love, service, kindness etc.

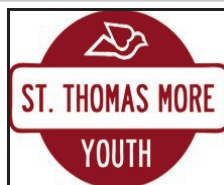

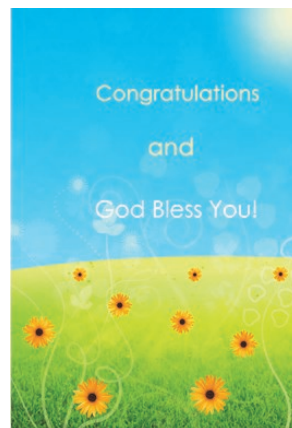

Good News for Military

The Air Force reversed its decision to punish a highly decorated colonel after he declined to sign a "certificate of spouse appreciation" for a retiring master sergeant's same-sex spouse. Even though Col. Bohannon applied for a religious accommodation and asked a more senior officer to sign the certificate, he was grounded, suspended, and guaranteed that he'd never be promoted - all because of his beliefs on marriage.

Air Force Secretary Heather Wilson announced the new ruling in favor of the colonel and reinstated him. She said, "Col. Bohannon had the right to exercise his sincerely held religious beliefs and did not unlawfully discriminate..."

"However, we must remember that at every level of government there are bureaucrats who actively resist ... efforts to preserve and protect religious freedom," said First Liberty general counsel.

Not Good News for Military Chaplains:

Army Chaplain Scott Squires has been reprimanded and faces "career-ending punishment" because an Army investigator wrongly concluded he discriminated when he declined to facilitate a Strong Bonds Marriage Retreat that included same-sex couples. However, Chaplain Squires was actually following Department of Defense regulations.

These DOD regulations require that chaplains must be qualified to serve as military officers **and** be "endorsed" by a recognized religious organization since they not only represent the military, they also represent their faith group. The Southern Baptist Convention endorses Chaplain Squires who faithfully follows the tenets of his faith.

"The investigator concluded that I should be reprimanded for doing something I'm required to do under Army regulations and my endorsement rules," explained Chaplain Squires.

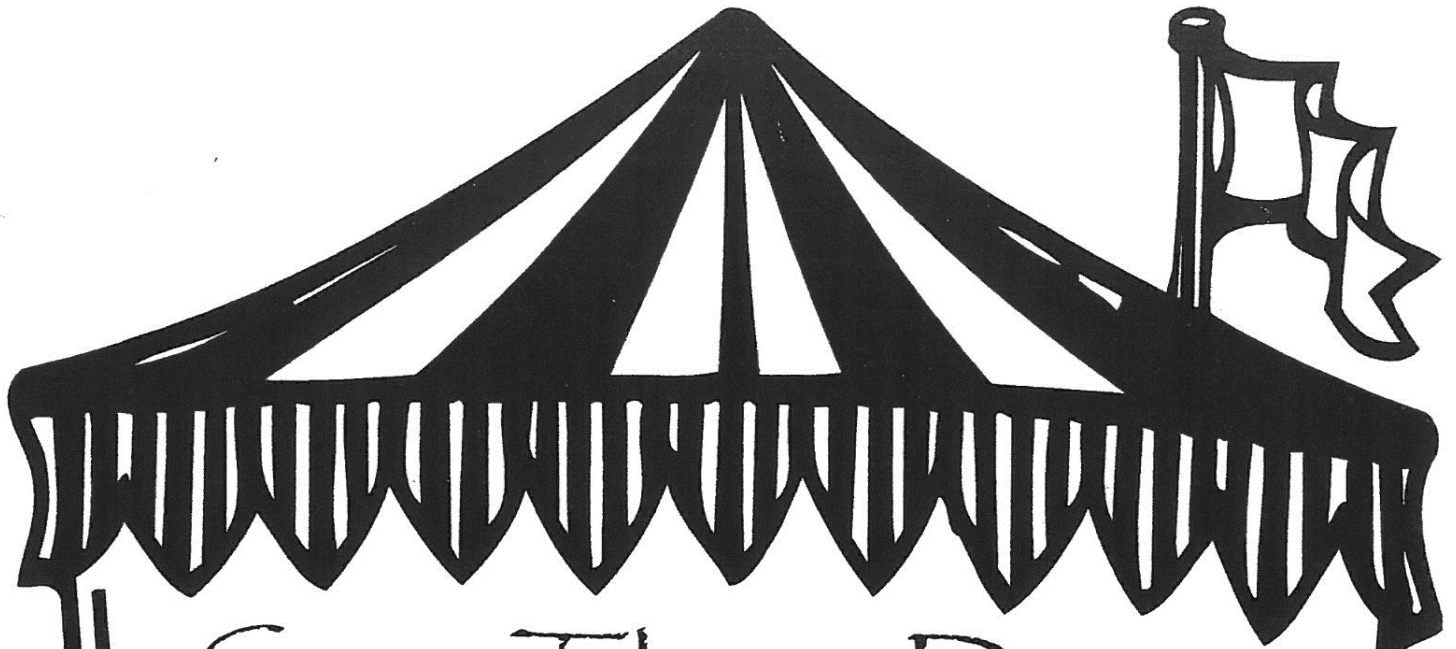
