Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

June 10, 2018 Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Genesis 3:9-15 Psalm: 130: 1-2, 3-4, 5-6, 7-8 2 Corinthians 4:13--5:1 Mark 3:20-35

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark:

Jesus came home with his disciples. Again the crowd gathered, making it impossible for them even to eat. When his relatives heard of this they set out to seize him, for they said, "He is out of his mind." The scribes who had come from Jerusalem said, "He is possessed by Beelzebul," and "By the prince of demons he drives out demons."

Summoning them, he began to speak to them in parables, "How can Satan drive out Satan? If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot stand. And if a house is divided against itself, that house will not be able to stand. And if Satan has risen up against himself and is divided, he cannot stand; that is the end of him. But no one can enter a strong man's house to plunder his property unless he first ties up the strong man. Then he can plunder the house. Amen, I say to you, all sins and all blasphemies that people utter will be forgiven them. But whoever blasphemes against the Holy Spirit will never have forgiveness, but is guilty of an everlasting sin." For they had said, "He has an unclean spirit."

His mother and his brothers arrived. Standing outside they sent word to him and called him. A crowd seated around him told him, "Your mother and your brothers and your sisters are outside asking for you." But he said to them in reply,

"Who are my mother and my brothers?" And looking around at those seated in the circle he said, "Here are my mother and my brothers. For whoever does the will of God is my brother and sister and mother."

Focus questions:

1. Describe a way your own life is divided. How can you make it whole?

2. What do you believe is expected of you as a follower of Jesus??

3. How do you respond to the will of God?.

Family and children's question:

Jesus casts out devils meaning he is stronger than evil. Talk about your favorite movie or TV show where good is stronger than evil.

'Tis the Season for GRADUATIONS! And, YES... Student Speakers May Pray!

Colorado Mesa University has reversed its

requirement that graduation speeches must be devoid of religious references after Alliance Defending

Freedom (ADF) contacted them on behalf of a student who was told she needed to keep comments about Christ out of her planned speech.

University officials had told the graduate to "take out the last section where you state that you find comfort in Jesus' words and cite a Bible verse."

"It is ... well established law (U.S. Supreme Court) that university officials cannot silence speech simply because it expresses a particular viewpoint, including a religious one," wrote an ADF attorney. "When they were confronted with what the law required, they quickly backtracked and allowed the student to speak freely."

According to the U.S. Department of Education Guidelines:

"Students can include religious content, including prayer, in their graduation speeches as long as ... the control over the content of each address is left to the students, and not the school."
