Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

June 17, 2018
Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time
Ezekiel 17:22-24
Psalm: 92:2-3, 13-14, 15-16
2 Corinthians 5:6-10
Mark 4:26-34

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark:

Jesus said to the crowds:

"This is how it is with the kingdom of God; it is as if a man were to scatter seed on the land and would sleep and rise night and day and through it all the seed would sprout and grow, he knows not how. Of its own accord the land yields fruit, first the blade, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the grain is ripe, he wields the sickle at once, for the harvest has come."

He said,

"To what shall we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable can we use for it? It is like a mustard seed that, when it is sown in the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on the earth. But once it is sown, it springs up and becomes the largest of plants and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the sky can dwell in its shade." With many such parables he spoke the word to them as they were able to understand it. Without parables he did not speak to them, but to his own disciples he explained everything in private.

Focus questions:

1. Describe a time in your life when you became more aware of the presence of God.
2. Relate a time when you experienced something that started out small yet grew into something big and wonderful.
3. How do you respond to the trust God has in you to do the right and good thing?

Family and children's question:

Plant some seeds this week and watch them grow into something big and good.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

When you don't like someone, I see it as a problem and say that you are prejudiced and judgmental about others. But when I don't like someone I sympathetically say to myself that I happen to be a good judge of human nature. The same act of disliking is interpreted and understood by me in opposite ways, negatively of others and positively of myself.

Today's Gospel narrates how some interpreted the divine work of Jesus (driving out the demons) as satanic work. How does one's look become positive or negative? As St. Paul explains in today's second reading, "we believe and therefore we speak." Our views, understandings and expressions are shaped by what we believe. If we believe in good things all that we see and do becomes positive. Our belief in evil tunes us to see evil and leaves us to be evil in our words and deeds.

The first reading explains how the first parents ended up driven away from God by believing in what the serpent (Satan) tricked them to believe. Let us pray that God's Holy Spirit guides us in divine wisdom to choose and believe Godly things in order to see, say and do the good and Godly in and around us.

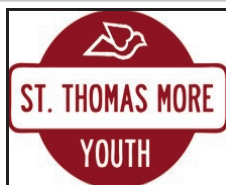

Religious Persecution Worldwide - 2 Types:

In North America and Europe we see a "Polite Persecution" through intimidation and legislation.

In Asia and Africa we see more and more "Violent Persecution."

1. Polite Persecution: in Michigan, Fired for her Faith: A Catholic clinical social worker with 20 years experience providing individual psychological counseling to a diverse group of patients, was fired because she declined marriage counseling to a same-sex couple since her faith teaches marriage is between one man and one woman. Her supervisor said she had to be "a social worker first and a Catholic second."

"This case shows that people of faith are under assault in the workplace," said a Thomas More Law Center attorney. "... discrimination against Christians is a civil rights violation that will subject employers to legal liability."

2. Violent Persecution: Radicalized Hindus have increased violent attacks on the religious minorities of Muslims, Christians, Sikhs, and Buddhists. These range from arson of churches to priests beaten & killed, nuns raped, and the destruction of Christian schools, colleges, and cemeteries.

Ten pastors and co-workers were taking 60 children to a Christian summer camp last May when they were surrounded by police, put in prison, and charged with kidnapping, cruelty, and forceful conversion. Although the parents protested saying they wanted their children in the camp, the pastors remained imprisoned.

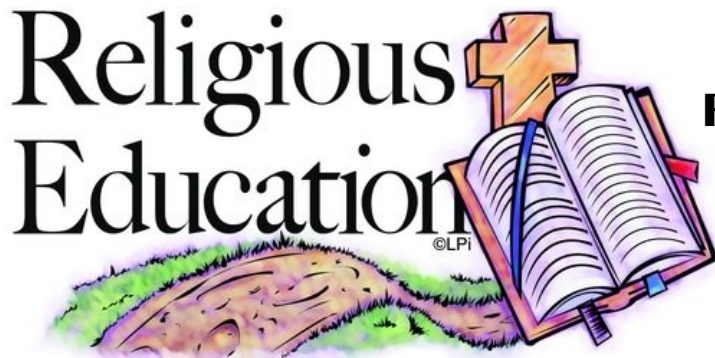
