Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

July 8, 2018
Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time
Ezekiel 2:2-5
Psalm: 123:1-2, 2, 3-4
2 Corinthians 12:7-10
Mark 6:1-6

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark::

Jesus departed from there and came to his native place, accompanied by his disciples.

When the sabbath came he began to teach in the synagogue, and many who heard him were astonished.

They said, "Where did this man get all this? What kind of wisdom has been given him? What mighty deeds are wrought by his hands! Is he not the carpenter, the son of Mary, and the brother of James and Joses and Judas and Simon? And are not his sisters here with us?"

And they took offense at him.

Jesus said to them,

"A prophet is not without honor except in his native place and among his own kin and in his own house."

So he was not able to perform any mighty deed there, apart from curing a few sick people by laying his hands on them

He was amazed at their lack of faith.

Focus questions:

- 1. How accepting of Jesus do you think you might have been if you had met him simply as a next door neighbor, a carpenter or the son of Mary?
- 2. Relate a time when you spoke about God or your faith even though you weren't sure how it would be received.
- 3. Who encouraged you to try something when others were trying to tell you not to try?

Family and children's question:

Talk about the people in your family who you admire. How can you let them know what you think of them?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Lem: I just sat on a pin.

Clem: Did it hurt?

Lem: No, it was a safety pin.

Death is an inescapable event which would certainly hurt us like sitting on a pin. But today's readings open our inner eyes to look at it as sitting on a safety pin.

The first reading reveals to us that God created us to be imperishable. Death can end our living in a human body but not our being with God.

The Gospel narrates how Jesus brings the girl from death to life. For those who believe in God and experience in themselves the everlasting life that God has breathed into them, life never ends. Death only changes the way of living. The body can hold life to a certain number of years but what the body carries within it as God-given-life is not temporary as the body is. It is eternal. Our living body is only the expression of the eternity that the body carries within it. Let us try to hear the same words which Jesus spoke to the little girl, "Talitha koum" (Little girl, I say to you, arise!"). Let us rise from all that depresses us. Let us rise from the undying spirit that we are created with. Let us allow Jesus to touch us in the scripture and sacraments to live the eternal life with which each of us is gifted.

This week our diocese will take up the Peter's Pence Collection, which provides the Holy Father with the funds he needs to carry out his most important charitable works. The proceeds benefit the most disadvantaged: victims of war, oppression, and natural disasters. Through your generosity, we can cast the peace of Christ upon the world

Independence Day - July 4, 1776

The American Founders gathered in Philadelphia in 1776 to draft the Declaration of Independence, which dissolved the political ties that had bound the American people to Great Britain. A new nation was born, **free and independent.**

The 56 Signers required remarkable courage since they knew they were committing treason against the British Crowne and that, if caught, they risked torture and death. Ultimately, 5 were captured and brutally tortured as traitors, 9 others died from wounds, some lost sons to battle or capture, and many had their homes and property pillaged and burned, while still others lost their fortunes in helping to fund the Continental Army.

These remarkable men of education and some means risked their security since they valued liberty more.

"For the support of this declaration, with a firm reliance on the protection of Divine Providence, we mutually pledge to each other, our lives, our fortunes, and our sacred honor."

Who were these 56 brave men?

48 were native-born Americans and 8 were born in Britain. They were lawyers and jurists, merchants, farmers and plantation owners, a teacher, a musician, a printer, 4 had been full-time preachers, and more were sons of clergymen. 24 held seminary degrees or Bible school degrees. Most belonged to the Anglican Church while others belonged to various Protestant denominations and there was one Roman Catholic.

They would each agree with Thomas Jefferson that "God who gave us life gave us liberty."

Our next Parish Holy Hour will be held on Tuesday July 3, 2018, from 7-8 PM in the Church.

What is done at Holy Hour?

Adoration: The Blessed Sacrament is placed in a monstrance and we the faithful have an opportunity to enter into prayer and peaceful meditation with our Lord truly present. Time is alternated between silent prayer and spoken prayer.

<u>Evening Prayer</u> (Vespers): These are the daily prayers said in the evening by the whole Church, from the Liturgy of the Hours. We join our prayers with clergy, religious and lay persons around the world, praying as one.

<u>Chaplet of Divine Mercy</u>: This is a devotional prayer recited on the beads of the Rosary, asking God to continue to shower us with his mercy.

Benediction: At the end of the hour, chants and prayers in praise of our Lord are recited, and we are actually blessed by Christ as the celebrant makes the Sign of the Cross over the assembly with the monstrance.

Why should I attend a Holy Hour? Thoughts for July:

We need it! Pope John Paul II in *Dominicae Cenae* (Feb. 24, 1980) wrote "The Church and the world have a great need of eucharistic worship." Our world is so busy and noisy, and we all feel the need for refreshment and slowing down. Give yourself the gift of this quiet time to spend with Jesus.
