Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

July 15, 2018
Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time
 Amos 7:12-15
Psalm: 85: 9-10, 11-12, 13-14
 Ephesians 1:3-14
Mark 6: 7-13

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark::

Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out two by two and gave them authority over unclean spirits. He instructed them to take nothing for the journey but a walking stick— no food, no sack, no money in their belts.

They were, however, to wear sandals but not a second tunic.

He said to them,

“Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave. Whatever place does not welcome you or listen to you, leave there and shake the dust off your feet in testimony against them.”

So they went off and preached repentance.

The Twelve drove out many demons, and they anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them.

Focus questions:

1. Describe a time when you felt called by God to leave familiar territory.
2. Relate a time when your attitude changed from “I can’t do it” to “Yes, I can do it”. What caused the change?.
3. Jesus sent his disciples out in pairs. Describe a time when you worked with someone else and the task was made easier because you had a partner.

Family and children’s question:

Imagine what it would have been like to have traveled with the disciples. What would you find the hardest to leave behind?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

The boy's mother was furious, "Young man, where did you learn to talk that way?"

The boy hesitated, looked toward his father, and asked, "Well, Dad, should I tell her?"

We are influenced by whatever/whomever we avail ourselves to be influenced. Good influence will nurture the good in us, likewise bad influence will nurture the bad in us.

As the first reading says, even the powerful word of God through the prophet's preaching would go unheard and thus useless if the people don't pay attention to it. If the hearer turns deaf ears to the Word of God, what good is the word of God for that person?

Today's Gospel explains how Jesus, the living presence of God among humans, was ignored by his own people. They see how powerfully and meaningfully Jesus speaks of the wisdom of God, yet they could not see him beyond the human identity of his earthly family. If we are biased by outward appearances we will not be able to open our hearts to experience God's presence around us in people and situations.

Let us pray that God frees us from all biases. May God open our hearts to experience God's presence and message that are available around us. We are what we allow ourselves to be influenced by.

Summer and Church: Summer has begun. Schools are closed. We would like to enjoy the weather, color and activities around us. Winter confined us to our home. Summer brings us out and sets us free, wearing light-clothing and engaging us in outdoor activities. As much as we avail ourselves to make the best use of the summer in fun and play, let us also allot sometime for spiritual activities of praying and worshiping in the Church. Fun and play would be more meaningful and relaxing as long as our inner Spirit becomes their inspiration and motivation.

Let not your personal prayer or Sunday worship suffer in anyway because of the busy summer schedules. Allot some time for prayer every day in the morning as soon as you get up. That would energize and motivate you for the whole day's summer activities. On Sundays go to mass. If you are out of your home-town, try to google how to get a nearby church. Please try this so that you would not be burnt out in your energy by mere physical activities without the support from your inner spirit. Prayer and worship are moments you will find yourself whole and fully energetic by and in the presence of God.

Supreme Court Narrowly Upholds Religious Freedom:

In a 7-2 decision, the U.S. Supreme Court overturned Colorado courts and found that baker Jack Phillips was **not guilty of discrimination** when he declined to design a wedding cake for a same-sex couple because of his religious beliefs. **However, the decision is narrow** since the court merely found that CO only exhibited anti-religious bias due to:
(1) hostility aimed at Phillips' religious beliefs,
(2) the different treatment CO gave a parallel case **allowing bakeries to refuse to make cakes criticizing same-sex marriage.**

Therefore, a definitive decision, resolving the underlying dispute between "non-discrimination" principles and freedom of speech and religion, will have to await another case and another decision.

Justice Anthony Kennedy wrote, "(CO) neither tolerant nor respectful of (Phillips') religious beliefs."

Religious Persecution - International Report:

Nigeria: In 2014, Boko Haram (meaning 'Western Education is Forbidden') abducted 270 mostly Christian girls from a boarding school in Chibok. The leader said, "I abducted your girls; there is a market for selling humans." Only the Christian girls are allowed to be sold into slavery and prostitution.

By 2018, about 60 of these girls had escaped, others were released after payments made, and about 100 are still in captivity. But, once again, Boko Haram has kidnapped over 100 mostly Christian schoolgirls in their campaign to spread panic and terror.

To date, Boko Haram has killed more than 20,000 people and forced 2 million others to flee their homes in predominantly Christian southern Nigeria.
