Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

July 22, 2018 Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Jeremiah 23: 1-6 Psalm: 23: 1-3, 3-4, 5, 6 Ephesians 2: 13-18 Mark 6: 30-34

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark::

The apostles gathered together with Jesus and reported all they had done and taught.

He said to them.

"Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while."

People were coming and going in great numbers, and they had no opportunity even to eat. So they went off in the boat by themselves to a deserted place. People saw them leaving and many came to know about it. They hastened there on foot from all the towns and arrived at the place before them.

When he disembarked and saw the vast crowd, his heart was moved with pity for them, for they were like sheep without a shepherd; and he began to teach them many things.

Focus questions:

- 1. What do you do to carve out quiet time for prayer during the day?
- 2. Describe a time when you felt overwhelmed in life.
- 3. Relate a time when you tried to escape the needs of others to find that their needs for your attention were greater than your need to be away.

Family and children's question:

Everyone needs a quiet place. Where is your quiet place?

Dear Friends,

A woman was interviewing a prospective servant and asked, "Can you serve a company of friends?" The applicant replied, "Yes ma'am, both ways." The woman looked puzzled and asked, "What do you mean, both ways?" The person replied, "The friends, either they will come again or stay away."

In today's Gospel Jesus commissions his disciples to do His work in His name. He forbids them to equip themselves with anything but a walking stick. By this Jesus means that their mission is a journey. In any journey the focus is on travelling towards the destination and not burdening the travelers with possessions which will make the journey hard and slow. Thus Jesus makes the missionary journey of his disciples light by equipping them with just a walking stick.

A journey needs energy and motivation. Here Jesus empowers his disciples with his healing power and the motivation of driving out demons (evil) and curing the sick. As followers of Jesus, let us realize that our life is a missionary journey. Let us not burden ourselves with more than what is necessary. Let us make our journey light so that we may be focused with the power and wisdom of Jesus.



Free Speech Narrowly Upheld by the Supreme Court:

In a 5-4 decision, the Supreme Court **ruled in favor of pro-life pregnancy centers** by holding that a 2015 California law requiring these centers to promote abortion clinics alongside their pro-life services violates the First Amendment.

"Advertising or promoting abortion runs directly counter to the very reason pregnancy centers exist - namely to enable and support women who want to choose life for their children. The government has no business forcing these centers to violate their First Amendment right to freedom of speech and, in doing so, work against their life-affirming mission," said Family Research Council president.

Justice Anthony Kennedy said the First
Amendment bars compelling people to betray their
beliefs. He wrote, "Governments must not be allowed
to force persons to express a message contrary to their
deepest convictions. Freedom of Speech secures
freedom of thought and belief. This law imperils
those liberties."

Many are concerned that the matter of protecting First Amendment, Freedom of Speech, was such a close decision.

International Report - Free Speech Under Attack: Poland: Under a new and controversial "Holocaust" law, it is now a crime for anyone to question the official nationalist narrative that Poles were solely "victims" of historical events and not complicit in the Nazi crimes in the concentration camps in Poland. Peaceful protestors, historians, teachers, journalists, or anyone else expressing opposition to historical revisionism, is targeted by the police. 


