



FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A farmer was seen erecting a new building. When asked what he was building, he replied, “Well, that depends. If I can rent it, then it is a rustic cottage. If I can’t, then it is a cow shed.”

Each of us is building our life from birth to death. The quality of life becomes rich or poor depending upon whom/what we allow to live in ourselves. In the first reading we see that people are ready to choose living as slaves in Egypt in order to have better food of meat and bread than as free people to eat what God gave them in the desert. When the food becomes their priority, freedom becomes secondary and they don’t hesitate to embrace slavery willingly.

In the Gospel Jesus points out the same. When people came in search of Him, Jesus asks why they came to Him. “You are looking for me not because you saw signs but because you ate the loaves and were filled.” Then He invites them to long for the eternally enduring food from Him.

It is easy and tempting to treat God as somebody who would grant all our temporal needs. Today God invites us to pray for that which is eternally enduring. Let us pray to God that Jesus may show us the real needs for which we should pray. Let us open our hearts to understand the real need which will bring peace and joy of living now and forever.

Eucharistic Adoration: Every first Tuesday of the month we gather at the church from 7:00 to 8:00 pm for a quiet hour in the presence of the Eucharist. I strongly recommend each of you to consider this opportunity to be with Jesus. We live in a world where we encounter many divisive thoughts and disturbing news and depressing situations every day. Spending an hour with the Lord will revitalize us in the peace and strength of the Lord. It will give us the right wisdom to approach each situation and ideology with the mind and understanding of the Lord. Please come and pray with us.


And did you know? To get instant relief from the itch of a mosquito bite, try rubbing soap on the bite right away.



What Does "Religious Freedom" Really Mean?

- **Freedom of Religion is a fundamental human right** and the first among rights guaranteed by the U.S. Constitution. It protects the conscience of all people and is the right to think, express and act upon what we deeply believe.

Freedom of Religion as a political principle, strives to forbid government restrictions on peoples' choices or beliefs. It requires that people be free to act upon their beliefs in both private worship and their actions in the public square.

The Bill of Rights is clear that Freedom of Religion is about the freedom to believe, or not believe, a religious doctrine or practice without interference from the government.

Therefore, government must remain neutral in regard to religious beliefs and cannot favor one religion for its beliefs or punish a religion for its beliefs.

What Does "Separation of Church and State" Really Mean?

- **Many Americans are surprised to learn that the words, "Separation of Church and State" do not appear anywhere in the Constitution or Bill of Rights.** This phrase is from a letter **President Thomas Jefferson wrote in 1802** to the Danbury Baptist Association of Connecticut in response to their concerns about their Religious Freedom.

Jefferson used the metaphor "wall of separation between church and state" to explain restrictions that are only on the government and not on the people. At the heart of his assurance of a "wall of separation" is the guarantee that the government will not interfere with the peoples' rights to worship God as well as to practice their beliefs.

Today many choose to reverse the real meaning of Jefferson's words to place restrictions on people instead of on government.


