



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

August 26, 2018 Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time Joshua 24:1-2a, 15-17, 18b Psalm: 34:2-3, 16-17, 18-19, 20-21 Ephesians 5:21-32 John 6: 60-69

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John::

Many of Jesus' disciples who were listening said,

"This saying is hard; who can accept it?"

Since Jesus knew that his disciples were murmuring about this, he said to them,

"Does this shock you? What if you were to see the Son of Man ascending to where he was before? It is the spirit that gives life, while the flesh is of no avail. The words I have spoken to you are Spirit and life. But there are some of you who do not believe."

Jesus knew from the beginning the ones who would not believe and the one who would betray him. And he said, "For this reason I have told you that no one can come to me unless it is granted him by my Father."

As a result of this, many of his disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him. Jesus then said to the Twelve,

"Do you also want to leave?"

Simon Peter answered him,

"Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God."

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Wife: If you had to do it again, would you marry me dear?

Husband: Of course, if I had to do it over again.

The husband's answer can be taken both positively and negatively. Negatively, it is a sarcastic reply to mean that hopefully that would not happen again. The positively literal meaning is that certainly (of course), he would marry her, if only he would have the chance to do it again. It is not only what we say but also the way we say it, and the way it is taken by the hearer that conveys either a positive or negative meaning.

Today's Gospel narrates how the people had understood Jesus literally and negatively. What Jesus says as figuratively offering Himself as food for eternal life was taken literally by people to mean his flesh as food. Jesus explains to them and to us (through this Gospel) that his bodily presence is a Eucharistic (sacramental) presence that can be taken as food. This presence is freely given to us. Whoever takes this presence will live by it. Just as food provides life and strength, so too Jesus's presence in us will provide eternal life and strengthen us. Let us appreciate Jesus for giving us this food-presence every day. May we cultivate a hunger for this food that eternal life may grow in us every day.

Constitution Week: September 17-23

On September 17, 1787, the United States Constitution was adopted and is our most important document. Our country is unique in that our Constitution acknowledges that a government's power comes from the people and not from a king, ruler, or dictator.

The Founding Fathers, and many Americans in the early years of the Republic, regarded the Constitution as a miracle. Americans praised the competence, wisdom, and motivations of those who served in the federal convention of 1787. They declared that the formation and adoption of our new system of government represented a political achievement unprecedented in human history.

U.S. Public Law 108-447 requires that all Public Schools receiving federal funds must teach about the Constitution on September 17 every year. Constitution Week is to be celebrated from Sept. 17-23. The Dept. of Education and most State Education Departments provide many suggestions for lesson plans.

There is **much to teach and to learn** about this document that the Founders believed was "influenced, guided and governed" by the hand of God. They believed the Constitution was destined to bless all mankind - and that it was "incumbent on their successors" to preserve and defend our national charter of liberty.
