Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

October 21, 2018
 Twenty-Ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time
 Isaiah 53:10-11
 Psalm 33:4-5, 18-19, 20, 22
 Hebrews 4:14-16
 Mark 10:35-45

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark:

James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came to Jesus and said to him, "Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you."

He replied, "What do you wish me to do for you?"

They answered him, "Grant that in your glory we may sit one at your right and the other at your left."

Jesus said to them, "You do not know what you are asking. Can you drink the cup that I drink or be baptized with the baptism with which I am baptized?"

They said to him, "We can."

Jesus said to them, "The cup that I drink, you will drink, and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized; but to sit at my right or at my left is not mine to give but is for those for whom it has been prepared."

When the ten heard this, they became indignant at James and John.

Jesus summoned them and said to them, "You know that those who are recognized as rulers over the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great ones make their authority over them felt. But it shall not be so among you. Rather, whoever wishes to be great among you will be your servant; whoever wishes to be first among you will be the slave of all. For the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many."

Focus Questions:

1. How does the Lord call you to die to self?
2. When has your lack of confidence prevented you from giving yourself in loving service?
3. Describe a time when suffering caused you to see things differently?

Family and children's question:

Talk about the things you do to serve others.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A speaker conducted a successful seminar entitled “Rules for Raising Children.” Then he got some kids of his own, and he changed the title to “Suggestions for raising children.” When his kids reached their teen years, he discontinued the seminar.

Raising a human child has nothing to do with what one **has known** from gathering facts and reading books on raising children. It is a process of growing, forming and getting formed along with the children. In growing one does not implement rules but applies one’s own self. We grow in each other. The growth takes place both in the grower and the grown.

In the Gospel today a man expresses how he feels that he does not inherit eternal life even though he has fulfilled all that is required of him by the Law. Jesus points out to him what he should do to ‘inherit eternal life’. He has to let go the concept of inheriting and experience the spirit of selling, i.e., letting go the sense of inheriting or possessing.

Eternal life is not a possession that one can gain by observance of the law. It is not what and how much one can do. Rather eternal life is the spirit of dispossessing and letting go of oneself in order to follow Jesus, i.e., allowing Jesus to grow in us and for us to grow in Jesus. Observation of laws is not the guarantee for eternal life. Laws are ways of applying or attaching oneself to Jesus who is our eternal life. May our personal life and religious education inspire our children not merely to observe but to apply themselves to God’s presence expressed through our words and deeds.

Next Sunday, World Mission Sunday, we are called to be part of the Church’s missionary efforts, supporting mission priests, religious Sisters and Brothers, and lay catechists who provide loving service to those most in need. As Catholics around the world, here at home and in the missions, gather at the Eucharist around the table of the Lord, let us pray for the Church’s worldwide missionary work and offer financial help through the Society for the Propagation of the Faith for vulnerable communities throughout Asia, Africa, Latin America and the Pacific Islands.

Our Financial Campaign has almost reached its goal of One Million dollars. We need close to \$30, 000 to reach the goal. We have sent another letter to those who are still trying to donate. Now you have seen the renovation inside the church. So I request those still considering participating in the campaign to please donate whatever amount you can, small or big, that will set us above the goal. Your generous donation is greatly appreciated.

Parking Lot: Preparatory work to repave the parking lot is going on. We plan to repave it the earliest in Spring of 2019, or if any undue delay takes place, we hope to do it in the Fall of 2019. Thanks for the people’s generous contribution. 70% of the pledged donation is contributed. It was great help from you all which made it easy for the parish to pay the bill without borrowing from our reserve fund. The rest 30% will be sufficient to pay for the parking lot. God bless you and your families for your generous participation in building the physical Church and the Spiritual Kingdom of God in Hauppauge.

Discrimination Against Houses of Worship Continues

A New Jersey court's decision that fixing furnaces or repairing broken plumbing in historic church buildings is "religious," is being appealed to the U.S. Supreme Court. **The Supreme Court had ruled last year that a church cannot be excluded from programs generally available to the public.** Nonetheless, the NJ state court said in April that grants earmarked to repair and preserve historic buildings could not go to religious "activities," and defined those activities as basic repairs.

"Time does not discriminate," said Becket fund legal counsel. "It takes its toll on all historic structures, secular and religious alike. **The county should not be forced to discriminate by favoring secular sites in its preservation efforts.**"

"In Morris County, we want to preserve all of our historic sites, including our magnificent houses of worship, some of which date back to the 1700s and were designed by the leading architects of their time," said director Doug Cabana. "Preserving the character and beauty of our county is a critical element of the county's cultural and economic success."

What do issues of historic preservation, hurricane recovery, and playground safety have in common? They are, or have been, at the center of court cases and arguments around **separation of church and state.**

In 2017, FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency) was sued by 3 Texas churches and 2 Florida synagogues damaged by Hurricanes Harvey and Irma because they "explicitly denied equal access to FEMA disaster relief grants for houses of worship solely because of their religious status," said Becket Fund attorneys.

The administration offered support for the churches seeking relief funds, and by January, **2018, the discriminatory policy was reversed.**

"By finally following the Constitution, FEMA is getting rid of second-class status for churches, which in the words of the Supreme Court, was "odious" to the First Amendment," said the Becket Fund.

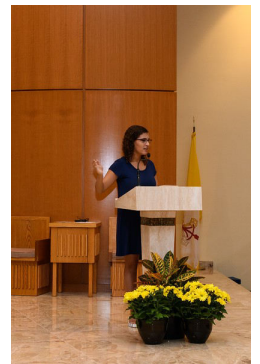

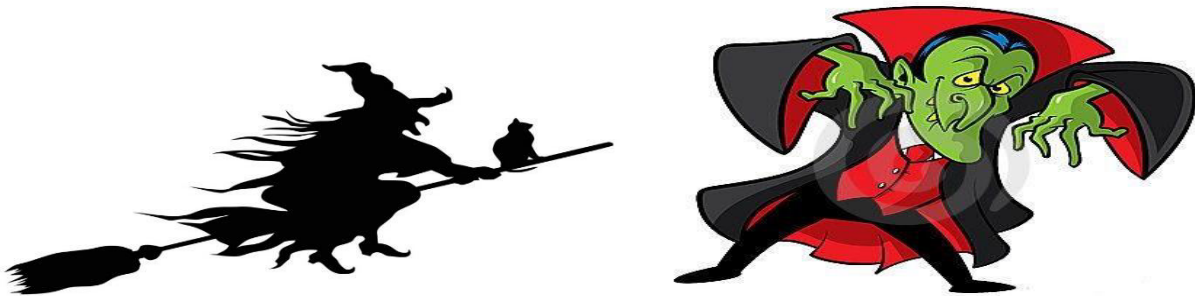
