



# Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

October 28, 2018 Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time Jeremiah 31:7-9 Psalm 126:1-2, 2-3, 4-5, 6 Hebrews 5:1-6 Mark 10:46-52

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark:

As Jesus was leaving Jericho with his disciples and a sizable crowd, Bartimaeus, a blind man, the son of Timaeus, sat by the roadside begging.

On hearing that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to cry out and say,

"Jesus, son of David, have pity on me."

And many rebuked him, telling him to be silent. But he kept calling out all the more,

"Son of David, have pity on me."

Jesus stopped and said, "Call him."

So they called the blind man, saying to him,

"Take courage; get up, Jesus is calling you."

He threw aside his cloak, sprang up, and came to Jesus. Jesus said to him in reply, "What do you want me to do for you?"

The blind man replied to him, "Master, I want to see." Jesus told him, "Go your way; your faith has saved you." Immediately he received his sight and followed him on the way.

### FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A polite man is one who listens with interest to things which he knows about when they are said to him by a person who knows nothing about them. God is the polite person who knows and can do everything and yet listens to all that we pray for and bears with all that we do.

**Today's Gospel narrates how Jesus answers the personal wish** of his two disciples, James and John. First Jesus lays a condition that He would fulfill their wish if they could do all that He requires of them to do. They agreed to do anything in order to get what they wish. Jesus then makes them understand that God's kingdom is not the fruit of human labor but a pure gift. It is not what humans earn but what God gives as a gift. It is not achieved by human effort but received as God's benevolent gift.

Life is much more than what we make of it. It is bigger than what we can bring into it. When we can welcome and allow life to happen as God's gift we will be able to experience life more richly than what we expect. If we totally depend upon our hard effort as the basis of life, even the very act of living would become more burdensome. Let us pray to Jesus to give us a generous heart that we may understand that our life is God's gift. Let us ask the Holy Spirit to inspire us that life as God's gift can be experienced more joyfully and peacefully than as mere fruit of our burdensome labor.

**Prayers from Jesus' Land:** One of the many activities of the Parish Golden Jubilee is a Pilgrimage to the Holy Land, to walk and pray in the places where Jesus was born, grew, lived, died and rose again. As pilgrims, a group of our Parish and I will be in Jesus' Land raising our prayers of thanksgiving and supplication from October 18<sup>th</sup> to 28<sup>th</sup> for all that God has done in and through us. May God lead us and provide us to be the witnesses of His Love and Life.

**This Sunday, World Mission Sunday**, we are called to be part of the Church's missionary efforts, by supporting mission priests, religious Sisters and Brothers, and lay catechists who provide loving service to those most in need. As Catholics around the world, here at home and in the missions gather at the Eucharist around the table of the Lord, let us pray for the Church's worldwide missionary work and offer financial help through the Society for the Propagation of the Faith for vulnerable communities throughout Asia, Africa, Latin America and the Pacific Islands.

**Halloween - November 1<sup>st</sup> All Saints.** The origin of the word *Halloween* is Christian. *Halloween* falls on the evening before the <u>Christian</u> holy day of <u>All Hallows' Day</u> (also known as *All Saints'*, *Hallowmas* or *Hallow tide*) on November 1. October 31<sup>st</sup> Eve of All Hallows in popular use became *Halloween*. When we celebrate our inner power and identity of being saints on November 1st, we rightfully ridicule and make fun of evil on the eve (October 31<sup>st</sup>) of 'All Saints' feast. The Halloween costumes are geared towards making fun of the evil only to highlight the Goodness and the Saintliness we carry within.

Let us celebrate All Saints and Costume Mass on November 1<sup>st</sup>: In the background of what I explained above, teens and adults are invited with Halloween costumes to attend the All Saints mass on Thursday, November 1<sup>st</sup> at 7:00 pm. Thus we can celebrate our potential to be saints by ridiculing all that is non-saintly and evil.

**November 2<sup>nd,</sup> Friday, All Souls Day:** At 7:00 pm is the memorial mass for all those who passed away from us in the past year. Letters of invitation have been sent to the families. Please feel free to join us to pray for those deceased from our families.

### PARISH OUTREACH

We are edging ever closer to the holiday season – starting with the fun day of Halloween! Thankfully, many school districts have activities for the children that day, making it a safer one for them: parents do not have to anxiously peruse the candy for hidden dangers.

However, that does not mean that there aren't dangers inherent in Halloween anyway...neighbors who are less than friendly, or who are nasty to your children, traffic that does not slow down, etc. Candy itself is not a desirable treat, as much as say, pretzels would be, or small prizes. We have to be aware of our surroundings and what we allow our children to do on this day, and how we treat others' children as well.

The children of our clients at Outreach do not have varied options; if they are living in a shelter, they cannot do the traditional trick or treating; if they live elsewhere, their parents cannot afford to buy candy to dispense to others, or even to their own children. They cannot afford costumes, so they may have to make do with homemade outfits that are very simple. Please be conscious of the comments that are made to children, whether they are by other children or parents. Poverty is very painful normally, and made even more so at a time of celebration.

Bring Your Bible to School Day 2018
On October 4th, a few hundred thousand students from all 50 states brought their Bibles to school to share God's hope and celebrate First Amendment Religious Freedom and Freedom of Speech. Focus on the Family originally developed this campaign in 2014 to bring attention to the many challenges to these freedoms that too often take place in public schools. Families could receive a free study guide to assist students from elementary grades to college as they talk to their friends during non-instructional times before & after school, lunch and recreation.

"They voluntarily bring their Bibles to school as a visual celebration of their religious freedom and start conversations with other students," said a Focus on the Family facilitator. "It's about conversation, not confrontation. An event like this doesn't create any new right; it's already there."

### Dr. Ben Carson, HUD, Sued Over White House Bible Study

The Department of Housing & Urban Development (HUD) and Secretary Ben Carson, are being sued by an atheist group for records relating to a White House Bible Study group that is attended by 10 Cabinet members each week - although, as busy people, not everyone is able to attend every week. Meetings last between 60-90 minutes and members are free to contact the teacher, former pro-basketball player, Pastor Ralph Drollinger. "First of all, taxpayer funds are not used to support the ministry ... And secondly, no staff are involved in the Bible study," said Sec. Carson. "One of the principles of our nation's founding is freedom of religion...In fact, it is my faith that helps me serve

Pastor Drollinger developed Capital Ministries, a Bible studies program, that is now in 43 state capitals. In 2010, he brought this ministry to Washington, first to 50 members in the House of Representatives and then to the Senate in 2015.

The world is in urgent need of the message of Our Savior. This class will examine the principles that underlie how we can live Christ's teachings in our time.
