



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

November 4, 2018 Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time Deuteronomy 6:2-6 Psalm 18:2-3,3-4, 47,51 Hebrews 7:23-28 Mark 12:28B-34

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark: One of the scribes came to Jesus and asked him, "Which is the first of all the commandments?" Jesus replied, "The first is this: Hear, O Israel! The Lord our God is Lord alone! You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength. The second is this: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. There is no other commandment greater than these." The scribe said to him, "Well said, teacher. You are right in saying, 'He is One and there is no other than he.' And 'to love him with all your heart, with all your understanding, with all your strength, and to love your neighbor as yourself is worth more than all burnt offerings and sacrifices." And when Jesus saw that he answered with understanding. he said to him. "You are not far from the kingdom of God." And no one dared to ask him any more questions. **Focus Questions**:

1. Describe a time when you found it difficult to love a neighbor.

2. How do you express your love for God?

3. Jesus says that you should love God with all your heart, all your soul, all your mind, and all your strength. Talk about how you love God differently with your heart, soul, mind, strength.

Family and children's question:

Talk about the love God has for you and how you love God in return. What actions do you take to show God that you love him?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Professor: If there are any dumbbells in the room, please stand up. (there was a long pause and then a lone freshman stood up in the rear, so the professor continued) What? Do you consider yourself a dumbbell? Freshman: Well, not exactly, but I hate to see you standing alone. By trying to see if any student would stand, the professor did not realize that he was standing. Seeing is not merely the function of the eyes. Eyes are only viewing instruments. It sees what the heart focuses. If the heart focuses nothing the eye would simply wander everywhere but would see nothing. That is what happens when we stare aimlessly at nothing when our mind or heart is overwhelmed with its own thoughts or emotions.

In the Gospel today Jesus asks the blind man, "What do you want me to do for you?" The blind man receives his sight only at his faith-filled request, "Master, I want to see." Seeing does not happen merely by Jesus' act of opening the blind man's eyes. It happens to him by his wish to see. Unless one wishes to see something, one sees nothing. Likewise if one refuses to see even if his/her eyes are open, nothing will be seen. The eye opens but the heart sees. When the heart opens, things will be more clearly seen – more than what the physical eye could see. Let us pray with the words of St. Paul that God "may enlighten the eyes of the heart..." (Ephesians 1:18-20) so that we may see and comprehend God's wonder in and around us.

Halloween - November 1st All Saints. The origin of the word *Halloween* is Christian. Halloween falls on the evening before the <u>Christian</u> holy day of <u>All Hallows' Day</u> (also known as All Saints', *Hallowmas* or *Hallow tide*) on November 1. October 31st Eve of All Hallows in popular use became *Halloween*. When we celebrate our inner power and identity of being saints on November first, we rightfully ridicule and make fun of evil on the eve (October 31st) of 'All Saints' feast. The Halloween costumes are geared towards making fun of the evil only to highlight the Goodness and the Saintliness we carry within.

Let us celebrate All Saint and Costume Mass on November 1st. In the background of what I explained above, children, teens and adults are invited with Halloween costumes to attend the All Saints Mass on Thursday, November 1st at 7:00 pm. Thus we can celebrate our potential to be saints by ridiculing all that is non-saintly and evil.

November 2nd Friday, All Souls Day: At 7:00 pm is the Memorial Mass for all those who passed away from us in the past year. Letters of invitation have been sent to the families. Please feel free to join us to pray for those deceased from our families.

PARISH OUTREACH

Parish Social Ministry is the action that our faith community takes to live out the gospel we proclaim and to grow in love with God and neighbor. At St. Thomas More, our social ministry has many functions and services.

Our prime function is to provide food support for those in need within our parish boundaries. Outreach supports over 50 families each month with basic food supplies that are donated by our generous parishioners. The needs stem from crisis situations such as loss of a job or a sudden illness to more long-term situations such as the death of a parent or loss of a home. Sometimes it feels like we are always asking for your support but, as you know, hunger does not take a vacation.

In addition to our monthly food support, we also provide assistance to our families during Easter, Thanksgiving, and Christmas. School supplies are made available to families before the start of school each year.

We also provide transportation services for individuals who may need a ride to the doctor or another appointment. Outreach is staffed by wonderful volunteers who work in the office, in our pantry, and as drivers. If you know of someone who might be in need, please refer them to Outreach. All information is confidential.

We are beginning our Thanksgiving food drive and, again, are asking for your support. Canned vegetables, stuffing mix, cranberry sauce, potatoes, gravy, juice, coffee, tea, and desserts are always needed. We provide each family with a turkey as well as gift cards so they can buy the perishable items we cannot provide. As you put your donation together, please remember that many of our families do not have full kitchens so smaller items (smaller cans, smaller turkeys or turkey breasts are better). As always we thank you for your donations and I can assure you they are gratefully received by our clients.

MINISTRY MATTERS AT SAINT THOMAS MORE

The RCIA Team has answered God's call To help guide future Catholics in the Christian Life. The Easter Vigil culminates months of preparation As the candidates receive the Easter Sacraments.

RCIA stands for "Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults." Just as it takes an entire village to raise a child, it takes the gifts of an entire loving, playful community to make a committed Catholic Christian. The RCIA team is comprised of committed individuals who are entrusted to share our faith with those adults who express a desire to become a Catholic Christian, and to help lead them to the Sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation.

Bible Study Banned on Private Property Pennsylvania residents, Scott & Theresa Fetterolf, were ordered by government officials to stop using their 35-acre farm to host Bible studies and other Christian gatherings or pay \$500 per day in fines. Since 2003, the property was used for these gath-

erings, carrying on a decades old practice held by the previous owner.

In October, the city decided that the farm violated a zoning ordinance that states a "place of worship or assembly" must apply for a permit and issued a "Notice of Violation/Cease and Desist Order." However, other properties that host secular counterparts to these activities like parties, political fundraisers, and book clubs are not banned.

"Government should not target religious activities for punishment, particularly when similar secular activities are permitted," said Senior Counsel for the Independent Law Center. "In America, no government can categorically ban people from assembling to worship on one's own property."

The lawsuit states that "There is no compelling interest in prohibiting Bible studies, meetings where religious songs are sung, religious retreats/fellowship, and religious fundraisers, especially when secular counterparts of these activities are permitted."

Pastor & Wife Ordered to Stop Bible Studies in their Apartment

A semi-retired Lutheran pastor and his wife, both in their mid-80s, were ordered by their Virginia apartment complex to stop holding Bible studies or face eviction. In 2017, residents asked Pastor Hauges to lead a Bible study in the complex to which he agreed and applied to reserve the community room for the study. But in 2018, other residents attempted to interfere with the Bible study and the management outlawed religious activities in the community room and any private apartment, labeling this study a "business." First Liberty law firm is now representing the pastor who has agreed to stop leading the Bible studies until the matter is resolved.

"Evicting elderly residents from their home for holding a Bible Study is not only outrageous, it's illegal," said counsel for First Liberty. "It's frightening that a management company would use the threat of eviction to stop residents from

meeting together to discuss any issue, let alone their faith."


