



# Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

November 18, 2018 Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time Daniel 12:1-3 Psalm 16:5, 8, 9-10, 11 Hebrews 10:11-14, 18 Mark 13:24-32

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Mark:

Jesus said to his disciples:

"In those days after that tribulation the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, and the stars will be falling from the sky, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken

"And then they will see 'the Son of Man coming in the clouds' with great power and glory, and then he will send out the angels and gather his elect from the four winds, from the end of the earth to the end of the sky.

"Learn a lesson from the fig tree. When its branch becomes tender and sprouts leaves, you know that summer is near. In the same way, when you see these things happening, know that he is near, at the gates. Amen, I say to you, this generation will not pass away until all these things have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.

"But of that day or hour, no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father."

#### **Focus Questions:**

- 1. Jesus says that no one knows the hour when the Son of Man will come. How do you react to people predicting the end of the world?
- 2. If the world were to end tomorrow and you knew that, what would you do differently?
- 3. Describe a reminder you had of how fragile life is.

#### Family and children's question:

The movie, Coco, is based on the Mexican tradition of honoring dead ancestors. How do you show reverence for family members who have died?

#### FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

**After a political rally,** a wife came home late and sank into a chair. "Everything is going great. We are going to sweep the country."

Her husband responded, "Why not start with the living room?"

Bigger dreams would end up in vapor if they don't begin to realize in smaller deeds. No use to condemn the persistence of darkness and no use of dreaming of big light until one begins to light a small torch.

In the Gospel today Jesus praises the widow's mite. In comparison to what others gave, her contribution is tiny. But she gave all that she had. Her spirit of giving is incomparable with that of the others. What others gave was not as full as that of the widow. They kept back a big part of their possession to themselves. She engaged her total self in what she did, unlike the others who were partially engaged. While the others showed that they are big donors by their big donation, she lived her generosity by giving, though small, all that she had.

God wants us to focus our life not on the quantity of our doing. Rather God wants us to LIVE the quality of our being. It is easy to dream big. But to engage ourselves to realize it, needs a lot of generous engagement of our total self without any reservation. Let us pray for the generous spirit in us to realize our dreams.

### Pilgrims, Thanksgiving, & a Failed Experiment: Part 1

A Quick History: The *Mayflower* set sail from England on Sept. 6, 1620, and arrived at Cape Cod on Nov. 11, 1620. The ship moved on to Plymouth with its 102 Pilgrims and on Nov. 21, 1620, they drafted and signed the *Mayflower Compact*, a legal document, "in the presence of God, and of one another, (to) covenant and combine ourselves together into a civil body politic."

Weakened from the 65 day voyage and unprepared for the harsh winter, by spring, half had died from starvation and disease. Fortunately, with the help of local Native Americans (Indians), the 53 remaining Pilgrims learned to plant and harvested an abundant crop by fall. Thus, the First Thanksgiving was to celebrate a successful harvest and give thanks to God.

The Experiment: The Pilgrims decided that their new community would create a collectivist model of **governance** where all labor was communal, with men raising crops for all families, not just their own, and women engaged in domestic chores for their neighbors. Few did more than the minimal because the incentive to excel was destroyed. Within two vears, the result was shortages and starvation. The Pilgrims' Governor, William Bradford, described the folly of collectivism, "For this community was found to breed much confusion and discontent and retard much employment that would have been to their benefit and comfort. For the young men, that were most able and fit for labour and service, did repine (complain) that they should spend their time and strength to work for other men's wives and children without any recompense (payment).... And for men's wives to be commanded to do service for other men, as dressing their meat, washing their clothes, etc., they deemed it a kind of slavery, neither could many husbands brook (tolerate) it."

Gov. Bradford also spoke about another problem from this created famine - thievery. "much was stolen both by night and day..."

#### PREPARE FOR ADVENT




