



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

December 9, 2018 Third Sunday of Advent Zephaniah 3: 14-18A Psalm Isaiah: 12:2-3, 4, 5-6 Philippians 4: 4-7 Luke 3:10-18

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

The crowds asked John the Baptist, "What should we do?" He said to them in reply,

"Whoever has two cloaks should share with the person who has none. And whoever has food should do likewise." Even tax collectors came to be baptized and they said to him,

"Teacher, what should we do?"

He answered them,

"Stop collecting more than what is prescribed."

Soldiers also asked him,

"And what is it that we should do?"

He told them.

"Do not practice extortion, do not falsely accuse anyone, and be satisfied with your wages."

Now the people were filled with expectation, and all were asking in their hearts whether John might be the Christ. John answered them all, saying,

"I am baptizing you with water, but one mightier than I is coming. I am not worthy to loosen the thongs of his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing fan is in his hand to clear his threshing floor and to gather the wheat into his barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."

Exhorting them in many other ways, he preached good news to the people.

Focus Questions:

- 1. This is Gaudete Sunday, Joyful Sunday. What fills you with joy?
- 2. Describe a time when you had to wait a very long time for something or someone. What gave you patience to wait?
- 3. What do you like about John the Baptist? How does he point the way to Jesus for you?

Family and children's question:

Talk about a tradition your family observes this season. How does it help the youngest members of your family understand what this season is all about.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

An inexperienced speaker arose in confusion after dinner and murmured stumblingly, "M-m-my f-f-friends, when I came here tonight, only God and I knew what I was about to say... and now only God knows."

Life is a journey. We may think that we are travelling alone in life. But God always walks along with us all the time. God and we steer life together. The more we cooperate with God, our co-traveler, the more our life becomes Godly, and thus will come a time when we totally become Godly. All our crooked paths get straightened and all our roller coaster rides become a ride on an even and smooth plain.

On the second week of Advent, John the Baptist invites us to make our crooked paths straight and the uneven roads smooth. It takes more energy and a longer time to reach the destination through uneven and crooked roads. A straight and smooth road makes the journey easy and joyful for both of us, God to come to us and us to reach God. Let us pray that we may have the courage to make ourselves straight in our vision, not confused or distracted. May God make all our words and deeds smooth, not violent and hurtful.

Please pray two 'Hail Marys' every day until Christmas; one for your family and the other for our parish family. I am praying for every family of our Parish especially for those who would join us at the masses of Christmas Eve and Day that this Christmas may in a special way touch us with Christ's joy and peace. Pray two Hail Marys that God may be born in our hearts and home and that God may become the center our children's life.

Next week is the third week of Advent. It is customary for the Church to bless the Infant Jesus figures that children and families bring to Church on the Third Sunday of Advent. If you are not able to attend one of these blessings, simply hold the Infant from your Crèche reverently in your hand and invite those you live with to pray as you read the blessing prayer. "God our Father, you loved us so much. You sent us your only son, Jesus, born of the Virgin Mary, to save us and lead us back to you.

We pray that, with your blessing, these images of Jesus might be a sign of your presence and love in our homes. Good Father, give your blessing to all who gather with us this Christmas, family and friends,

Open our hearts, that we might receive Jesus in joy, do always what he asks of us and see him in those who need our love.

We ask this in the name of Jesus your beloved Son, who came to give peace to the world and He lives with us forever and ever. Amen.

Saturday December 8th is the Tree lighting. We whole heartedly thank all those who helped put up the lights and decorations in and outside the church. Those who helped cook the dinner for the families, those who organized crafts and games for children, for Santa and for Frank Bayer, our photographer. God bless you for having been so generous with your time and talent to make this event joyful and spiritual.

The Twelve Rules of Christmas —

Part I: Compiled by The Rutherford Institute Attorneys

- 1. Public school students' written or spoken personal expressions about Christmas (e.g. "Jesus is the Reason for the Season" t-shirts) may not be censored by school officials.
- 2. Teachers are permitted to wear Christmasrelated clothing or jewelry so long as they are generally permitted to wear clothing or jewelry about other holidays.
- 3. Public schools may teach students about the Christmas holiday, including its religious significance, so long as it is taught objectively for secular purposes such as its historical or cultural importance.
- 4. Teachers may send Christmas cards to the families of their students so long as they do so on their own time, outside of school hours.
- 5. Public schools may include Christmas music, including those with religious themes, in their choral programs if the songs are included for a secular purpose such as their musical quality or cultural value or if the songs are part of an overall performance including other holiday songs.
- 6. Public schools may not require students to sing Christmas songs whose messages conflict with the students' own religious or nonreligious views.

CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING

Please join Mary Ellen Carroll and Ann Russo for the evening of **December 13 at 7:00 pm** for a course that will explore the meaning and impact of Catholic Social Teaching. It is sometimes described as the best kept secret of the Catholic Church since many Catholics do not know about it. Yet the American bishops describe Catholic Social teaching as "an essential part of Catholic faith." They go on to say, "This poses a serious challenge for all Catholics, since it weakens our capacity to be a Church that is true to the demands of the Gospel".

There will be videos, presentation and discussion.

Two of the evenings will take place during the Advent season, a fitting time to explore the message and impact of the Son of God, born in a poor stable, who preached the message of God's love for the least among us and urged his followers to continue his outreach to the poor and those on the margins of society. The world is in urgent need of the message of Our Savior. This class will examine the principles that underlie how we can live Christ's teachings in our time.

Dear Parents, Guardians, Catechists and Trusted Adults: It was with great pleasure and some trepidation that we presented the *Child Lures Prevention Program* to your children. Many thanks first of all to Fr. Antony for giving us the opportunity to include this in our Religious Education program. We would like to thank all the parents and guardians who entrusted us with this task, for bringing your children to the program, encouraging them to participate and helping them to understand what we were attempting to accomplish. The students seemed most receptive to the activities we provided for them, were very responsive to the concepts and questions that were discussed and we thank them for their participation.

Many other adults helped us accomplish our goal of giving our children of St. Thomas More tools to help keep them safe, such as our Social Workers and School Psychologists, Ann Russo, Jack DeSantis, Eileen Petre and Dr. Marti White who were available each evening to listen to any child who wanted to speak privately. Our Religious Education Staff, Linda Ronning,

Joanne Anelli, and of course our Director of Religious Education, Mary Ellen Carrol, were invaluable to us by assisting at each session with registration and materials. This was a group effort and we are so pleased with the result.

This was just a beginning opportunity. We ask our parents and guardians to continue the conversation with your children. Go over the material in their booklets. Use the Parent Guide which you received at the Parent meeting. Pray with your children, that they continue to "*Think First and Stay Safe*."

Summation:

We have been very fortunate over the last few years to maintain a favorable financial position despite challenging economic issues both locally and overall. Once again in FY 2017-18 (Sept thru August) we have maintained a positive balance between Income and Expenses. Also, while income dropped \$43,000, expenses were reduced by nearly \$90,000.

This was accomplished due to a dramatic reduction of Regional School assessments. This reduction of assessments was made possible by utilizing undistributed funds from prior parish contributions. While this was a very helpful and welcome action taken by the parishes it may not occur on a regular basis. We will closely monitor all factors of income and expense to assure maintaining a strong fiscal posture for our Spiritual home for years to come but there always exists a possibility of issues arising that may warrant our Parish to re-evaluate income or expense factors

May God continue to bless our Parish Family with generous and talented people who have given time and treasure to keep the Spirit alive and well at St. Thomas More!
