# Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

January 6, 2019
The Epiphany of the Lord
Isaiah: 60:1-6
Psalm 72:1-2, 7-8, 10-11, 12-13
Ephesians: 3: 2-3a, 5-6
Matthew: 2:1-12

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew:

Each year Jesus' parents went to Jerusalem for the feast of Passover, and when he was twelve years old, they went up according to festival custom. After they had completed its days, as they were returning, the boy Jesus remained behind in Jerusalem, but his parents did not know it. Thinking that he was in the caravan, they journeyed for a day and looked for him among their relatives and acquaintances, but not finding him, they returned to Jerusalem to look for him. After three days they found him in the temple, sitting in the midst of the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions, and all who heard him were astounded at his understanding and his answers. When his parents saw him, they were astonished, and his mother said to him,

"Son, why have you done this to us? Your father and I have been looking for you with great anxiety."

And he said to them,

"Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?"

But they did not understand what he said to them. He went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them; and his mother kept all these things in her heart. And Jesus advanced in wisdom and age and favor before God and man.

- 2. Talk about the people who have travelled with you in your search for God.
- 3. Relate a time when you found wisdom in an unexpected source..

**Knowing First Amendment Rights Makes Schools & Students More Free** 

Newaygo, Michigan In this small Michigan town, the School Board unanimously decided to keep a display of the 3 Wise Men, erected each holiday season for over 40 years, at a public elementary school despite complaints that it violates separation of church and state.

"Please leave our wise men alone," said a parent. "Look away if it offends you."

"This community has said loud and clear (over 3,400 people signed a petition) that they want the display to stay," said Superintendent Peggy Mathis. "Newaygo Public Schools has a legitimate secular purpose for the display. We are both upholding the communities' tradition of celebrating a public holiday and attempting to point towards the importance of wisdom, knowledge, and openmindedness. They've been described as the scientists of their time... To my knowledge, there is no case law that prohibits the depiction of 3 non-Christian middle eastern men on camels that are seeking wisdom."

Honey Grove, Texas "Y'all don't do that again," Middle School Principal, Lee Frost, told a group of 8th grade students who decided to pray for an injured classmate during lunch. They could only pray on the stage behind the curtain, outside the school building, or in the gym while no one was present and they couldn't be seen.

Attorneys for First Liberty informed the School District of the students' rights and school officials corrected their policy.

"The right to pray is a Constitutionally protected activity ... By mandating that the students hide when they pray, Principal Frost sends a message to students that school prayer is illegitimate, disfavored, and should not occur in public ... Even Establishment Clause concerns cannot justify such treatment... Students are free to pray together at school as long as it's not disruptive. Our client is very pleased that she and her friends can continue to pray together for each other, their fellow classmates, and their teachers."

#### What is done at Holy Hour?

<u>Adoration</u>: The Blessed Sacrament is placed in a monstrance and we the faithful have an opportunity to enter into prayer and peaceful meditation with our Lord truly present. Time is alternated between silent prayer and spoken prayer.

<u>Evening Prayer</u> (Vespers): These are the daily prayers said in the evening by the whole Church, from the Liturgy of the Hours. We join our prayers with clergy, religious and lay persons around the world, praying as one.

<u>Chaplet of Divine Mercy</u>: This is a devotional prayer recited on the beads of the Rosary, asking God to continue to shower us with his mercy.

Benediction: At the end of the hour, chants and prayers in praise of our Lord are recited, and we are actually blessed

by Christ as the celebrant makes the Sign of the Cross over the assembly with the monstrance.

#### Why should I attend a Holy Hour? Thoughts for January:

# The IRA Charitable Rollover is back and is now permanent!

What's called a rollover is actually a "qualified charitable distribution" that can be made to our Parish.

## If...

- 1. You are at least 70 1/2 years old on the date you make your gift
- 2. Your IRA is a traditional or Roth
- 3. You don't exceed your personal maximum of \$100,000 per year in qualified charitable distributions

You will not have to report your distribution as income. It will be free of federal and New York State income tax, and it will count toward your required minimum distribution (RMD).

The best way for you to start is with your IRA custodian. Tell them you want to make a "qualified charitable distribution". In most cases you will only have to fill out a simple form.

VERY IMPORTANT!! Your gift <u>must</u> go directly from your IRA to the Parish. If you receive the money first then you'll be taxed on it like any other distribution.

Example: Mrs. Connors, age 76, has \$125,000 in a traditional IRA and would like to contribute \$5,000 to her Parish in 2016. Upon hearing of the Charitable IRA Rollover opportunity, she directs the custodian of her IRA to transfer this amount not later than December 31, 2016 directly to the Parish as a 2016 gift. She will not be subject to income tax on her \$5,000 qualified charitable distribution.
