



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

January 20, 2019 Second Sunday in Ordinary Time Isaiah: 62: 1-5 Psalm 96 1-2, 2-3, 7-8, 9-10 1 Corinthians: 12: 4-11 John: 2:1-11

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding. When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him,

"They have no wine."

And Jesus said to her,

"Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come."

His mother said to the servers,

"Do whatever he tells you."

Now there were six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons. Jesus told the them,

"Fill the jars with water."

So they filled them to the brim.

Then he told them,

"Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter."

So they took it. And when the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine, without knowing where it came from — although the servers who had drawn the water knew —, the headwaiter called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves good wine first, and then when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now."

Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs at Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

When Jesus started his Church, the Pastor (Jesus) was executed. The chairman of the board (Peter) was cursing, swearing and denying his position. The treasurer (Judas) committed suicide after embezzling funds. The other board members (the disciples) ran away. The only ones left were a few from the ladies fellowship. This is how the church began. But it has survived and grown up to today's level, not because of human merits and hardships, but purely because of God's grace and benevolence.

Today we celebrate the Solemn Feast of the Baptism of Our Lord Jesus Christ. When Jesus was baptized by John the Baptist, the Holy Spirit descended upon him like a dove, and God the Father spoke from heaven saying, "This is my beloved Son with whom I am well pleased." Baptism revealed who Jesus is. He is filled with the Holy Spirit and is the Son of God the Father.

We are baptized in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. In our baptism we too are made children of God the Father, siblings to God the Son, and are filled with the Holy Spirit. As children of God we thus become the Church of Christ. We are not church by our own merits. It is God's free gift of grace that makes the church as the true church. As human beings we are insufficient to measure ourselves to the high standard of God's Holy Church. But in our baptism we promise God and community to live our best. Our Baptismal vows are a reflection of how much we will avoid Satan and sin and promise God to believe and practice Christ's way of life with the help of God's grace.

Every time when we walk into the church we bless ourselves with holy water. What does it mean? By that we remind ourselves that we were baptized in water and we are God's children; Christians belonging to Christ and we have the grace of the Holy Spirit empowering us to live the way a Christian should live.

Celebrate! Religious Freedom Day is Here!

"Each year since 1993, the President declares January 16th to be 'Religious Freedom Day,' and calls upon Americans to 'observe this day through appropriate events and activities in homes, schools, and places of worship.'

"This is a great opportunity to teach students a civics lesson about the First Amendment and how it can be applied to schools," writes Gateways to Better Education.

Our Founders leaned heavily on Thomas Jefferson's *Virginia Statute for Religious Freedom*, passed on January 16, 1786, when they established the First Amendment's guarantee of religious freedom. This Virginia legislation stopped the practice of taxing people to pay for the support of the local state approved church and clergy and it protected the civil rights of people to express their religious beliefs without suffering discrimination.

To commemorate the day, schools can recognize Religious Freedom, the foundation of all our freedoms, with some of the following ideas:

- * Read the Presidential Proclamation that every president composes and signs each year on January 16th and can be found at www.whitehouse.gov.
- * Ask students to discuss and/or write about "What religious freedom means to me."
- * Talk about countries where religious freedom is not allowed and that almost 3/4 of the world's population is denied this freedom that Americans enjoy.

Action Steps:

- 1. Contact your local School District and Board of Education and encourage them to recognize and celebrate Religious Freedom Day.
