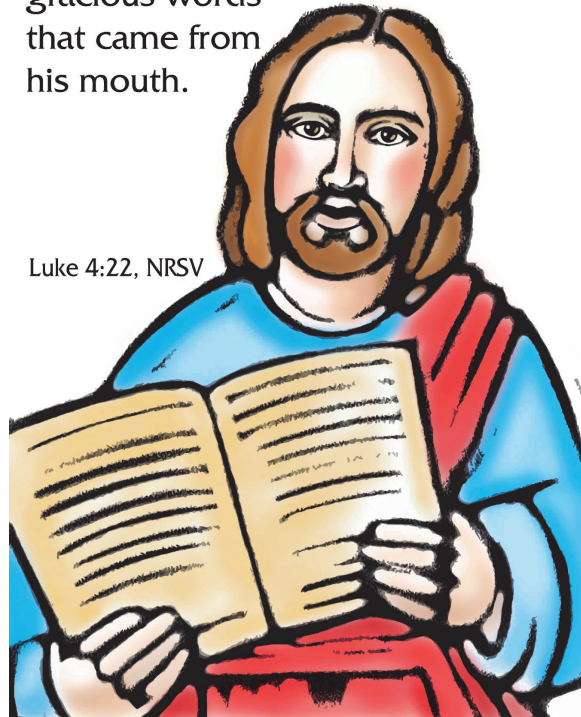

Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

February 10, 2019
Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time
Isaiah 6:1-2a, 3-8
Psalm 138:1-2, 2-3, 4-5, 7-8
1 Corinthians: 15: 1-11
Luke: 5:1-11

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to St. Luke:

While the crowd was pressing in on Jesus and listening to the word of God, he was standing by the Lake of Gennesaret. He saw two boats there alongside the lake; the fishermen had disembarked and were washing their nets. Getting into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, he asked him to put out a short distance from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat. After he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into deep water and lower your nets for a catch." Simon said in reply, "Master, we have worked hard all night and have caught nothing, but at your command I will lower the nets." When they had done this, they caught a great number of fish and their nets were tearing. They signaled to their partners in the other boat to come to help them. They came and filled both boats so that the boats were in danger of sinking. When Simon Peter saw this, he fell at the knees of Jesus and said, "Depart from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man." For astonishment at the catch of fish they had made seized him and all those with him, and likewise James and John, the sons of Zebedee, who were partners of Simon. Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching men." When they brought their boats to the shore, they left everything and followed him.

Focus Questions:

1. What qualities do you think Jesus is looking for in a disciple? Which of those qualities do you have?
2. When has a sense of unworthiness kept you from responding to an invitation?
3. What "great catch" have you seen as a result of saying yes to God's call?

Family and children's question:

Talk about ways that your family can help spread Jesus' word and help others to draw closer to Him.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A small business man kept his accounts payable in a cigar box, his accounts receivable on a spindle, and his cash in the cash register. His son said, "I don't see how you run your business this way. How do you know what your profits are?" The business man replied, "Son, when I got off the boat, I had only the pants I was wearing. Today, your sister is an art teacher, your brother is a doctor and you are an accountant. I have a car, a home, and a good business. Everything is paid for. So you add it all up, subtract the pants and there's your profit."

Life is a bigger picture and not a single moment. Single moments will show life as loss or profit, joyful or sorrowful etc. Only in its bigger picture we begin to see the meaning, direction and force of life. In the first reading today God explains to Prophet Jeremiah how He should understand and accept his every day pain and trouble in the bigger picture of God calling him to be prophet even before his birth.

In the Gospel we see that people could not see in Jesus beyond his particular human family background. But Jesus invites them to see in Him the bigger picture of the fulfilment of God's promises. Like the people of Jesus' time we may be struggling with our everyday troubles and not be able to see the bigger picture that God has for us. The more we strive to understand and accept God's plan for us, the sooner we will be freed from our personal and petty struggles. We will be like Jeremiah feeling the strength of God to realize that fight may occur but nothing will prevail over us because God is with us to deliver us. This is our bigger picture.

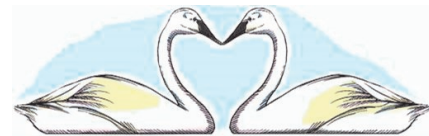

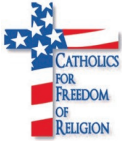

Pinned to each hat was a grateful note from the parish as well as a button stating:

“RELIGIOUS LIBERTY protects the right to CHOOSE LIFE.”

Participants in the March for Life exercised the 5 rights in our 1st Amendment:

1. Freedom of Religion - Speaking and acting in public, driven by faith and conscience
2. Freedom of Speech - Speaking opinions publicly, without fear
3. Freedom of Press - Thoughts, opinions and prayers disseminated openly
4. Right to Peaceably Assemble – Marching, standing and associating together without violence
5. Right to Petition for Redress of Grievances - The entire March for Life is a public admonishment of the Supreme Court for assuming to itself the power to legalize abortion

For 46 years the March for Life has been a growing witness, especially from young Americans, to the sacred gift of life. Our organizers experienced the joy, hope and dedication of students from across the nation as they spoke with us at our March for Life exhibit in Washington.
