Dear Friends,

Great-aunt Lucy was losing her hearing. A specialist suggested an operation to improve her hearing. But she promptly vetoed the idea, saying: "I'm ninety-four years old and I've heard enough." Have you ever felt like Great-aunt Lucy when your mind was cluttered with numerous contrary opinions, "Yes I've heard enough!" Lent is calling you to Divine Peace and to calm down your thoughts and emotions with divine strength.

The first reading describes how Moses was called from his disturbing past to enter into the peaceful and empowering divine presence. It turns Moses into a new person with a new mission in new vigor.

Today's Gospel admonishes us to stop judging others and start repenting in order to see how each one of us can become more fruit-bearing trees. Whenever anything bad happens in nature or in society we spend more time to find out who/what should be blamed. The Gospel invites us to be a part of the solution. People are like the fig tree. We are encouraged to be its gardeners to make the fruitless tree bear fruit by cultivating and fertilizing it. Our mission is not to condemn and cut down the tree, but to cultivate and make it bear fruit.

Let us take the advice of St. Paul from the second reading, "let us not grumble... let us take care not to fall." Let us be fed by Christ and drink from the rock of Christ in our life journey. Let us come to Christ and pray to Him "Yes Lord we have invented enough tools of opinions and emotions to judge and hurt each other. May this holy season of Lent make us rest in you and regain the strength to bring peace in our hearts and around us." Sunday Evening Mass: In order to help young families attend Sunday mass, we will be beginning, on a trial basis, to celebrate Sunday evening mass once a month. It would be on Sunday, March 31st at 5:30 pm. Please spread the news and encourage young families to come and worship with us.

Q&A by Fr. Antony

(A section answering questions often asked)

Is the Bible one book or many books?

The Bible is 'One Book' in the sense that it narrates God's redemptive History from Creation to the end of the



Universe and God's reign in Heaven. It has two parts; each part has many small books. The first part is called 'Old Testament' or "Hebrew

Testament as it is written in Hebrew. The second part is called 'New Testament' or 'Greek Testament' as it is written in Greek. The Old Testament contains God's deeds and words with humans from Creation to the arrival of Jesus. The New Testament speaks about the birth of Jesus, His ministry, Passion, Death and Resurrection, the time of the early Church and the end of human history.

How many books are there in the Bible?



The Catholic and Orthodox Bibles have more books in number than the Evangelical (Protestant) Bibles.
Regarding the New Testament all churches have the same number of books, **27 books** (the four Canonical gospels, Acts of the Apostles, 21 Epistles or letters and the Book of Revelation). But the Churches vary in the number of Old Testament books. The Catholic Bible consists of a total

of 46 books in the Old Testament whereas the Protestant Bible consists of a total of 39 books in the Old Testament. Catholic Bibles remained unchanged following the Reformation and so retained "seven books" that were "rejected principally" by Martin Luther King. The seven extra books found in the Catholic Bible are the books of **Tobit, Judith, Maccabees, 2 Maccabees, Wisdom, Sirach** and **Baruch.** Catholic Bible = 73 books.

Protestant Bible = 66 books.

Teacher Forces Student to Remove Ash Wednesday Cross

"It was really bad," said 4th grader William McLeod. "I felt like I was in trouble."

The Utah student had attended an Ash

Wednesday Mass at his Catholic Church and had an ash cross placed on his forehead to mark the beginning of Lent, a season of prayer and penance that Christians observe before

Easter. William's teacher asked him about the ashes cross and when he explained it, she said it was "inappropriate" and to "take it off" with a disinfectant wipe.

William's grandmother reported that being forced to wash off the ashes in front of his classmates left him crying and embarrassed when he went to the principal's office.

PUBLIC SCHOOLS ARE NOT GOD-FREE ZONES and the right to religious expression in public school is protected by the First Amendment.

Section 8524 of the July 31, 2018 amended Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 requires that, as a condition to receiving federal funds, the local School District must certify annually, in writing, that it has no policy that prevents, or otherwise denies, participation in constitutionally protected prayer and religious expression in public schools.
