Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord

Acts 10: 34A, 37-43 Psalm 118: 1-2, 16-17, 22-23

> Colossians 3: 1-4 John 20: 1-9

On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them,

"They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him."

So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first; he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in. When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead.

- 2. Where do you find signs of resurrected life and hope on the planet?
- 3. How do you bring new life to others?

Dear Friends,

**Sign in a store: "Cash only please**. We know that your check is good, but we don't trust the Bank." Jesus is not a check, waiting to be cashed or bounced. He is a ready cash of God's immeasurable love, served on the cross to each of us without any delay or restriction. This is the loving and power-filled message of Holy Week that we begin today.

**Today, Palm Sunday begins Holy week.** Next Sunday is Easter. Holy Week invites us to relive with Jesus his last days on earth, His Passion, Death and Resurrection. Jesus is the living (present) and eternal sign of God. He shows and proves immeasurable love through his Death on the Cross and Resurrection on the third day. **We will hear the Passion Story from the Last Supper to his Death on the Cross twice** in this Holy Week; the first time on Palm Sunday according to the Gospel of Luke and the Second time on Good Friday according to the Gospel of John. Hearing the Passion of Jesus can inspire us in many different ways and can empower us in all our sufferings. The message of the Passion-Story of Jesus is that Jesus is the living Love of God. The power of the story enables us to taste and see how God so loved the world that we become the sharers of God's abundant life.

**During Holy week we relive His Passion Story with Jesus.** On Wednesday April 17<sup>th</sup> at 7:30 pm is the musical meditation on the Passion story of Jesus. It will prepare us spiritually to live through the events of Holy Week. On Holy Thursday, April 18<sup>th</sup> at 7:30 pm we celebrate Jesus' Last Supper and His betrayal in the Garden of Gethsemane. On Good Friday, April 19<sup>th</sup>, we will journey with Him during the Stations of the Cross (12:15 pm, and 1:30 pm), and His death on the Cross at 3pm and at the Tenebrae at 7:30 pm. On Holy Saturday we will rise with him in His Resurrection (April 20 at 7:30 pm). Easter Sunday we will celebrate Easter, His victory over death and inimical hatred. (Sunday regular masses) **Please go through the Holy Week Schedule. Reconciliation Monday:** April 15<sup>th</sup> is Reconciliation Monday. Confessions will be heard from 3:00 pm to 9:00 pm in our Church and in all the Catholic Churches of our Diocese of Rockville Centre. Individual Confession cleanses and illumines hearts to enter into the mystery of Holy Thursday, Good Friday, Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday. All are encouraged to avail of this Sacrament of mercy and forgiveness. **The Parish thanks Jennifer and Neil Munro** for their generous service of power washing the wall and the statue of St. Thomas More as well as the two small islands in front of the main entrance doors of the Church. Our parish is blessed with people like the Munros who selflessly render their service, time and talent to keep St. Thomas More alive and young in bearing witness to God's love. God bless them and their family.

# Q&A by Fr. Antony

(A section answering questions often asked)

The **Mass**, known more fully as the **Most Holy Sacrifice of the Mass** is the central liturgical ritual in the Catholic Church where the bread and wine are consecrated and become the body and blood of Christ. After Jesus ascended into heave on the 40<sup>th</sup> day of his Resurrection, (we read in the book of Acts of the Apostles (Acts 2: 42, 46-47) that the early Christians devoted themselves to the Apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and prayers. This is the essence of the Mass. In every Mass, we come

together, to hear the Apostles' teaching (from the Scriptures, New Testament and Old Testament that explains Jesus' person and message) then break the bread.

Paul explains to his Church in Corinth

(55 CE) that we relive the moment of Jesus' Last supper in breaking the Bread, and experience Jesus' presence in this liturgical act. (1Corinthians 11: 23-32).

During the time of Reformation, the Council of Trent gave a stipulated liturgical form for the Catholic Mass in 1545-1546. Since then until Vatican Council II (1962-1965) the Mass was celebrated in Latin. Since 1965 we celebrate mass in vernacular languages. Since the time of the Early Church to our times the basic form of the Holy Mass is the same. We gather together in the name of the Lord, read

from Scriptures, Apostolic teachings (Homily), presentation of bread and wine, breaking of the bread and sharing it as body/presence of Christ.

Holy Thursday, we will celebrate the

Last Supper. That is the First Holy Mass Jesus himself celebrated with his

disciples, explaining from Scriptures that He is God's Son, broke the bread and blessed the cup to share with them. He commanded them and us, the believers through the Apostles, to do this in memory of Him. We celebrate and experience Jesus in every Mass.

# "Equality Act" Would Harm Religious Freedom -Part 2

The Equality Act amends the Civil Rights Act of 1964 by inserting "sex, sexual orientation, and gender identity" as protected classes throughout the federal code. The amendment would apply to businesses, schools, medical professionals, hospitals, faith-based adoption agencies, charities, speech and much more.

However, the Equality Act does not include Constitutional religious freedom protections or Religious Freedom Restoration Act

protections. Supporting lifestyle choices over religious liberty, the House bill's sponsor said, "we cannot allow claims of religious freedom to be used to discriminate against an LGBT individual."

Catholic hospitals in California and New Jersey have been sued under state sexual orientation and gender identity laws for declining to perform hysterectomies on otherwise healthy women who wanted to pursue gender transition. A Catholic hospital in Washington state settled out of court when it was sued for declining to perform a double mastectomy on a healthy gender-dysphoric 16-year-old girl. These cases would multiply on a national level under the Equality Act.

In Ohio, a judge removed a biological girl from her parents' custody after they declined to help her transition to male with testosterone supplements. They wanted to pursue counseling instead but were charged with abuse and neglect.

Meanwhile, studies show that 80 to 95 percent of children no longer experience gender dysphoria after puberty.

**Faith-based** adoption and foster care agencies have been shut down in PA, NY, IL, CA, MA, and D.C. for their belief that children do best with both a mother and a father.

Charities that believe the reality of biological sex are also under attack. In Alaska, a biological male twice tried to gain access to the city's shelter for homeless, abused, and trafficked women. He sued the center for alleged "gender-identity discrimination."

In practice, the Equality Act would further inequality. A federal sexual orientation and gender identity law would empower the government to interfere in how Americans think, speak and act at home, at school and at work.


