

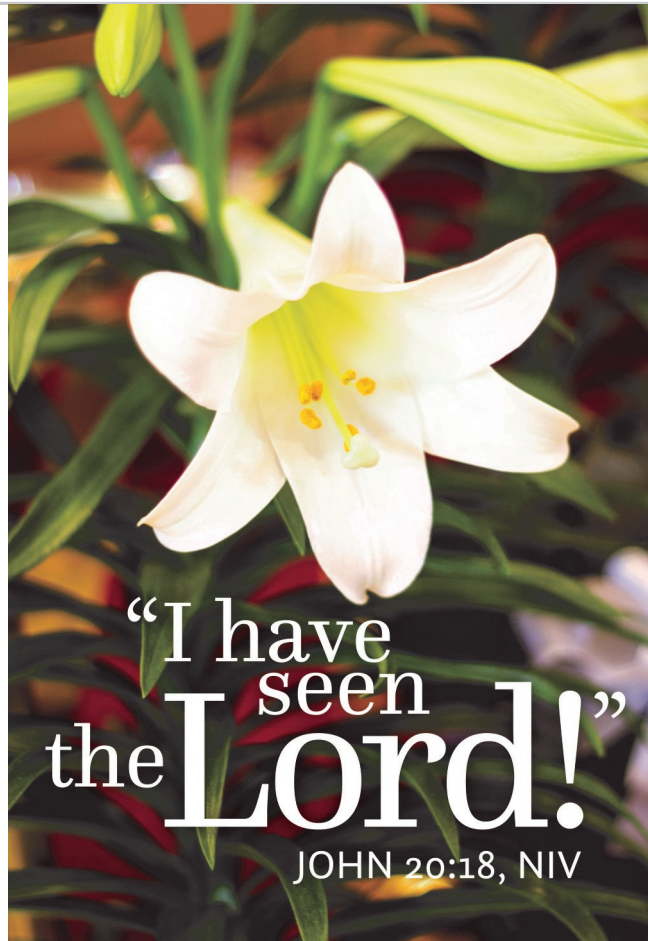

Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

May 5, 2019

Third Sunday of Easter

Acts 5:27-32, 40B-41

Psalm 30:2, 4, 5-6, 11-12, 13

Revelation 5:11-14

John 21: 1-19

At that time, Jesus revealed himself again to his disciples at the Sea of Tiberias. He revealed himself in this way. Together were Simon Peter, Thomas called Didymus, Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, Zebedee's sons, and two others of his disciples. Simon Peter said to them, "I am going fishing." They said to him, "We also will come with you." So they went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing. When it was already dawn, Jesus was standing on the shore; but the disciples did not realize that it was Jesus. Jesus said to them, "Children, have you caught anything to eat?" They answered him, "No." So he said to them, "Cast the net over the right side of the boat and you will find something." So they cast it, and were not able to pull it in because of the number of fish. So the disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord." When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he tucked in his garment, for he was lightly clad, and jumped into the sea. The other disciples came in the boat, for they were not far from shore, only about a hundred yards, dragging the net with the fish. When they climbed out on shore, they saw a charcoal fire with fish on it and bread. Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish you just caught." So Simon Peter went over and dragged the net ashore full of one hundred fifty-three large fish. Even though there were so many, the net was not torn. Jesus said to them, "Come, have breakfast." And none of the disciples dared to ask him, "Who are you?" because they realized it was the Lord. Jesus came over and took the bread and gave it to them, and in like manner the fish. This was now the third time Jesus was revealed to his disciples after being raised from the dead. When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?" Simon Peter answered him, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my lambs." He then said to Simon Peter a second time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Simon Peter answered him, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Tend my sheep." Jesus said to him the third time, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Peter was distressed that Jesus had said to him a third time, "Do you love me?" and he said to him, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my sheep. Amen, amen, I say to you, when you were younger, you used to dress yourself and go where you wanted; but when you grow old, you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will dress you and lead you where you do not want to go." He said this signifying by what kind of death he would glorify God. And when he had said this, he said to him, "Follow me."

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

In a small town, a man dialed 016 for directory information. A woman's voice at the other end said, "I'm sorry, you have to dial 015 for that.

When he dialed 015, it seemed to him, that he was hearing the same voice at the other end. So he said, "Aren't you the person I spoke to you a while ago?"

"I am," said the voice. "I am doing both jobs today." She may be doing two different works, but she is not two different persons. As a doer, she is the same - one person.

On the Second Sunday of Easter the story of "Doubting" Thomas invites us to realize that doubt always divides our single personality into two different persons, one as a doubter and the other as a believer. Doubt cannot exist where unity abides.

Doubting Thomas set his own conditions in order to clear his doubt. He was ready to believe in Jesus only when he would touch His wounds. Doubt would always expect the Truth to its own demands. When Jesus re-appeared a week later, Thomas did not clear his doubt by probing his wounds. Jesus' presence lifted him up to believe in Him. His experience of Jesus freed him from doubt to belief. Furthermore, it took him a step deeper. It made him surrender himself acknowledging Jesus as "My Lord and my God"

Truth is not an object to be proved in terms and conditions of the believer. Truth can only be believed and experienced by embracing it. Unless the believer becomes one with the Truth, there is no way of proving it to him/her self or to others. Truth is not what we understand, or accept or prove. Truth is what we become. Truth happens when we believe and allow it to happen in us. Thomas believed in Jesus and Jesus became his life, his Lord and God.

This Sunday following Easter Sunday is called Divine Mercy Sunday. Jesus, who rose from the dead, did not go vengefully after those who put him to death. As he pleaded with God while hanging on the Cross for the forgiveness of those who crucified Him, now after the Resurrection Jesus reached out to them in Mercy to offer them peace and forgiveness. He invariably greeted everyone with "Peace (Shalom) be with you" whenever and to whomever He appeared. The resurrection means life, not judgement of what we did or didn't do. The Risen Lord invites us to start life with Him. Let us celebrate Divine Mercy this Sunday.

First Holy Communion of our young men and women will be celebrated on the following weekend masses – on Sunday, April 28th at 12:15 pm, Saturday, May 4th at 5:00 pm and on Sunday, May 5th at 12:15 pm. We appreciate everyone's understanding if their usual seat is not available at those Masses.

Please mark your calendar for the volunteer appreciation party on Friday, May 3rd at 7:00 pm. It is a dinner and dance evening for all the volunteers. The dinner is free, but please ensure your place by paying a \$20 check which will be returned to you when you show up for the dinner. A cordial welcome to all volunteers for the appreciation party.

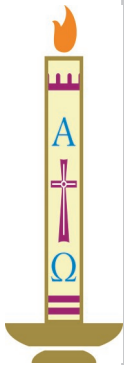

What is Divine Mercy Sunday?

Divine Mercy Sunday (also known as the **Feast of the Divine Mercy**) is celebrated on the Sunday after Easter, the Octave (Eighth) Day of Easter.

The feast day is observed by Roman Catholic as well as by some Anglicans.



as by some Anglicans. Faustina Kowalska, a Polish nun (canonized as a saint on 30 April 2000) reported in her diary visions and visitations from Jesus and conversations with Him. Jesus asked her to paint the vision

of His Merciful Divinity being poured from His sacred heart and specifically asked for a feast of Divine Mercy to be established on the first Sunday after Easter so mankind would take refuge in Him: The feast of Divine Mercy, as recorded in the diary of Saint Faustina, receives from Jesus Himself the biggest promises of grace related to the Devotion of Divine Mercy. In specific, Jesus said that a person who goes to sacramental confession and receives Holy Communion on that day, shall obtain the total forgiveness of all sins and punishment. That means each



person would go immediately after death to heaven without suffering in purgatory (or hell). Additionally, the Roman Catholic Church grants a plenary indulgence. (Plenary indulgence remits all temporal "punishment" required to cleanse the soul from attachment to anything but God.)

The devotion was actively promoted by Pope Saint John Paul II and the Sunday after Easter was officially designated as the Sunday of Divine Mercy.

European Churches: Vandalized, Defecated On & Torched "Every Day"

The April 15 Notre Dame Cathedral fire in Paris is only the latest in a series of heavily damaged churches throughout France and Europe. The incident brings attention to an alarming increase of devastation at other French churches. Although, in less than 24 hours, it was reported that this fire was an accident and not caused by arson, "Every day, at least 2 churches are profaned," said a French lawmaker reporting on 1,063 churches or symbols (crucifixes, icons, statues) and Eucharist, that were desecrated in 2018 alone. In 2019, these attacks have risen 25%. Paris' second largest church, St. Sulpice, burst into flames on March 17 and police report this had "not been an accident."

Similar reports are coming from Germany. "In this country, there is a creeping war against everything that symbolizes Christianity: attacks on mountain-summit crosses, on sacred statues by the wayside, on churches ... and recently also on cemeteries." wrote PI-News.

The Catholic & Christian hierarchy has kept mostly silent about the episodes while authorities and media obfuscate (make unclear) the identity of the vandals. "There is an eloquent silence in both France and Germany about the scandal of the desecrations and the origin of the perpetrators...Not a word or the slightest hint that could in any way lead to the suspicion of migrants," wrote PI-News. Yet, sadly, in Germany, with the arrival of another million migrants in 2016, attacks increased substantially. A January 2017 study in France revealed that as the number of migrants increases, "Islamist extremist attacks on Christians" rose 38%.

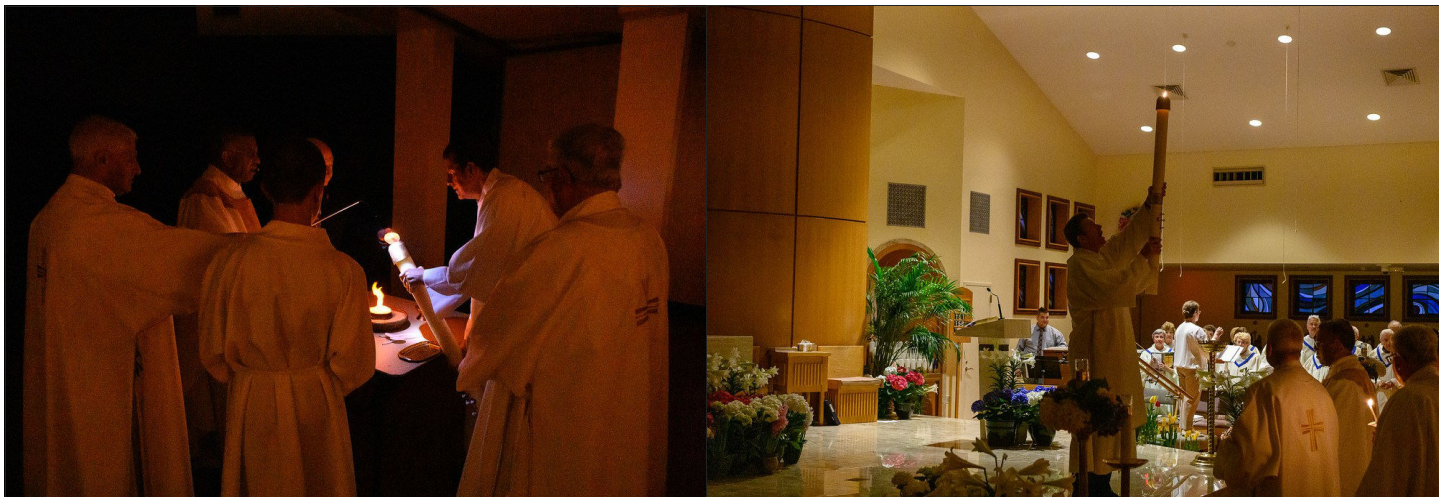
