



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

May 26, 2019 Sixth Sunday of Easter Acts 15:1-2, 22-29 Psalm 67: 2-3, 5, 6, 8 Revelation 21:10-14, 22-23 John 14: 23-29

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

Jesus said to his disciples:

"Whoever loves me will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our dwelling with him. Whoever does not love me does not keep my words; yet the word you hear is not mine but that of the Father who sent me.

"I have told you this while I am with you. The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you. Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid.

You heard me tell you, 'I am going away and I will come back to you.' If you loved me, you would rejoice that I am going to the Father; for the Father is greater than I. And now I have told you this before it happens, so that when it happens you may believe."

Focus Questions:

- 1. When have you consciously called upon the Holy Spirit to help you?
- 2. Describe a time when you felt the peace of Christ.
- 3. What do you do to spread Christ's peace?

Family and children's question:

Talk about a time when you were reminded of Jesus' teaching and that helped you in a situation you were in.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A man looked up from his hospital bed and said to his dearest friend, "You've always been with me when I have had trouble. When I lost my stock in a poor investment, you were there. When I had the car accident, you were with me. I got fired, and you were there. I've come to the conclusion that you're bad luck." The way you see is the way you perceive.

Today's readings tune our way of perceiving the truth. In the first reading Paul and Barnabas understand the dejection of their mission by Jews as God's way of opening their mission to preach the Good News to Gentiles. In the Gospel Jesus proclaims that the time when Judas left the Last Supper to betray Him, as the beginning of His time of glorification. He explains how the time of His passion is the time of showing His love and the time of preaching the commandment of love to His disciples.

Here, Jesus is not teaching us to look for positive things amidst negative. His teaching is not like that of looking at the glass as half full and not half empty.

With God it is the NEW ORDER, not merely trying to see the positive amidst the evil/negatives. As the Second Reading proclaims, "God's dwelling is with the human race. ...God Himself will always be with them as their God. He will wipe every tear from their eyes, and there shall be no more death or mourning, wailing or pain. For the old order has passed away." There is only one reality... life and life alone...Resurrection... no more death.... No more of half empty and half full. But it is God and fullness of life everywhere and all the time. Our prayer is nothing but to be conscious of this God-Reality in every human being.

Congratulations to Deacon Bob: This Sunday, May 19th we celebrate Deacon Bob who has served our parish for last 25 years as Deacon. It is his Silver Jubilee celebration. May God bless him with good health and missionary Spirit. May God bless his family for having helped him to be available as a Deacon to serve the Parish-Family.

May, the Month of Mary: Last Sunday at the 9:15 mass children learnt how to pray the Rosary and prayed a decade of Rosary with the congregation. The whole month of May we pray the Rosary before everyday mass. On May 19th at 10:45 am mass we will crown Mary as the Queen of All Saints (Regina Sanctorum Omnium). May is the month devoted to Mary, the Mother of God and Our Mother. Please pray the Rosary every day.

Q & A by Fr. Antony

What do you add to the wine during mass? Holy water? Oil? And it seems that the priest only adds a drop. What is the reason to add anything to the wine?

The act of co-mingling the water (just plain water, not

holy water or oil) and wine for the Eucharistic sacrifice of the Holy Mass has been a practice since the time of the early Church.

St. Cyprian of Carthage (A.D. 250) writes in his epistle about the

significance of mixing the water and wine.

The water is Christ's humanity and the wine His divinity. The mingling of the water and wine in the chalice symbolizes the Incarnation of Christ. As St. Paul describes to his Church in Philippi "though Jesus was in the form of God…he emptied himself,…



coming in human likeness; and found human in appearance... becoming obedient to death, even death on a cross" (Letter to Philippians 2: 6-8). In Jesus God's nature (symbolized by wine) and

human nature (symbolized by water) is perfectly mingled into a single person with two natures. St. Cyprian expands this symbol of mingling (water with wine) to God's mingling with people in Jesus. "We see that the people are signified by the water, but Christ's blood by the wine. Therefore, when water is mixed with the wine in the chalice, the people are made one with Christ."

Thus every time we offer the chalice containing wine and water we profess that God is perfectly mingled

with us in Jesus. Whoever drinks from this chalice is called to believe and realize the possible divine reality in them. Because of Jesus'



incarnation we can experience/live the divine reality (wine) in our human nature (water). The mingling of water and wine confirms our faith that every human person is worthy of God's dwelling in them. Let us remind ourselves in this background the words of Jesus "Whatever you do to the least of my people you did it to me." The mingling is so perfect that whatever we do to humans we do to Jesus.

Again - A Farmer & Baker Push Back Religious Hostility

Legally known as "religious animus," religious hostility is once again trying to prevent small businesses from earning a living when the business owners practice their deeply held religious beliefs.

* Michigan fruit farmer, Steve Tennes, had been banned from selling his produce at the local farmers' market in 2016 after someone asked, on Facebook, about the farm family's beliefs on marriage. Steve responded that because of their Catholic beliefs, they don't host same-sex marriages at the farm, located 22 miles away from the farmers market. The Facebook description was,

"Our family farm seeks to glorify God by facilitating 'family fun on the farm' and feeding families."

In spite of a city council member calling his religious beliefs, "ridiculous, horrible, hateful," and the mayor denouncing Tennes for putting his "Catholic view on marriage" into practice, a judge granted a temporary order that allowed Tennes to return to the farmers market in 2017. Now, in 2019, Tennes' attorney from Alliance Defending Freedom (ADF) is requesting that the city permanently lift its ban prohibiting him from selling his produce. She said, "All Americans should be free to live and speak according to their deeply held religious beliefs without fear of government punishment."

* Colorado baker, Jack Phillips, was back in court in March after a second effort by the CO Civil Rights

Commission to penalize him over his refusal to use his artistic talent to create cakes for certain LGBT events. Last year, the U.S. Supreme Court ruled 7-2 in his favor when he declined to bake a wedding cake for a same-sex marriage. The present case involved a complaint after he declined to make a specialized cake for a transgender transition. On March 5, the CO commission dropped its case against Philips provided he withdraw his lawsuit against the state for "harassment."

"He shouldn't be driven out of business just because some people disagree with his religious beliefs and his desire to live consistently with them," said an ADF attorney.

"Today is a win for freedom," said Mr. Phillips. "When I set out to build my dream of opening my own cake shop, combining my love for art and baking in a family business, I never imagined this chapter ... I have and will always serve everyone who comes into my shop; I simply can't celebrate events or express messages that conflict with my religious beliefs."
