



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

June 2, 2019 Seventh Sunday of Easter Acts 7:55-60 Psalm 97: 1-2, 6-7, 9 Revelation 22:12-14, 16-17. 20 John 17: 20-26

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John:

Lifting up his eyes to heaven, Jesus prayed saying: "Holy Father, I pray not only for them, but also for those who will believe in me through their word, so that they may all be one, as you, Father, are in me and I in you, that they also may be in us, that the world may believe that you sent me.

And I have given them the glory you gave me, so that they may be one, as we are one, I in them and you in me, that they may be brought to perfection as one, that the world may know that you sent me, and that you loved them even as you loved me.

Father, they are your gift to me. I wish that where I am they also may be with me, that they may see my glory that you gave me, because you loved me before the foundation of the world.

Righteous Father, the world also does not know you, but I know you, and they know that you sent me. I made known to them your name and I will make it known, that the love with which you loved me may be in them and I in them."

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Son: "Dad, what is a religious traitor?"

Father: "A person who leaves our church and joins another."

Son: "And what is a person who leaves another church and joins ours."

Father: "A convert, son, a convert."

A convert or a traitor is a matter of allegiance one shows to a particular group or not. God is not bound by any allegiance. God is in and beyond every group and all denominations with Godly abundance.

Today's readings invite us to see this God reality amidst all of us. First reading narrates how the early church recognized that the spirit of the Risen Jesus exists and works both in groups of Jewish and Non-Jewish (Gentile) Christian Churches. The second reading portrays how the Heaven, Godly abode is the New Jerusalem without a Temple. Humanly speaking, the Holy City Jerusalem, without a Temple is unthinkable. But divinely speaking, the temple is wherever the spirit and presence of the Risen Jesus is present. Heaven does not need a Temple because it is the presence of God everywhere in all places forever.

The Gospel explains this truth in an emphatic way that God's presence is available in Jesus to whoever loves and keeps His word. God's presence is not a privilege of a particular group of people, or abiding in a particular building or place. Whenever we pray or worship God, God begins His experience with us in a particular symbol and place. But he always leads us to His abundance which no particular group, culture or liturgy can hold or express fully. In worship we don't bind God to our limitations but allow ourselves to expand to His limitless abundance. Let us pray to God to break all the barriers each of us has built in the name of religion, culture, ideologies etc.

Congrats to 139 of our Parish teens who were confirmed by Bishop Andraej. May God continue to guide them that they may always choose the best by the grace of the Holy Spirit. May the Holy Spirit strengthen them to say 'NO' to evil and to bloom in their life with prosperity and joy.

Q & A by Fr. Antony

Why do we use Bread and Wine in the Holy Mass? Are the Communion Hosts (wafers) blessed when they are sent to the church?

The use of bread in the Holy Mass originates from the Passover Meal of the Old Testament. Passover meal is a celebrative meal to remember how God liberated the Hebrews from their slavery under Pharaoh. Jews celebrated it every year in memory of their freedom. Jesus celebrated it with



his disciples as his Last Supper in which he showed that He is the act of God, saving the people from slavery to sin by his loving sacrifice on the cross and Resurrection.

Wine, unleavened bread and the lamb are

important food items of the Passover meal. Jesus took bread and wine during his Passover (Last Supper) with his disciples and said "This is my body that is for you. Do this



in remembrance of me."
Likewise He gave the cup to his disciples saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me." By giving himself in the form of bread and wine he offered

himself as the Lamb of God, (Passover Lamb of God). Since the time of the Early Church, the believers gathered and celebrated breaking the bread as Christian Passover, remembering that Jesus is God's final and full divine saving Act. (Acts 2:42, 46; 20:7; 1Corinthians 11:16, 23-24). Our celebration of Holy Mass is the developed liturgy of the Early Church's celebration of Jesus' Passover Meal (Last Supper). As Jesus used bread we too use it. As Jesus asked us to do it in memory of Him, we celebrate it to experience the presence of Jesus among us as God's Saving act.

The hostia or sacramental bread, also called Host or Communion Wafers may be made out of only four ingredients: fine (white) wheat flour, pure water, yeast, and salt. It is plain bread. Our belief is that this plain bread becomes the consecrated Host bearing the presence of

Jesus' body during the mass, especially at the moment of uttering Jesus' words upon them and receiving it in faith as the body of Christ.

Honoring the Fallen

Memorial Day "is really a very solemn holiday to remember the supreme sacrifice that service members in our nation have made for us so that we can have freedom," said Maj. Gen. James Mukoyama. For him, the most important liberty is religious freedom. "If you read any books about prisoners of war and the Holocaust, the people who had strong religious foundations were able to better handle their situation."

Regrettably, a Gallup Poll in 2000 revealed that only 28% of Americans knew the true meaning of Memorial Day (the day to remember those who died while serving in our nation's armed forces), and 40% confused it with Veterans Day (the day to celebrate the service of all U.S. military veterans).

Memorial Day began on May 30, 1868, as

Decoration Day, with a ceremony at Arlington National Cemetery to honor fallen Civil War soldiers. Following World War I, Decoration Day became a day to honor all soldiers, sailors, and Marines who died in service to our nation. After World War II, the holiday was called Memorial Day.

More than **1.3 million men and women have died in service** to the nation from the Revolutionary War to World War II to the wars in Afghanistan and Iraq.

Congress passed the National Moment of Remembrance Act in 2000 that asks Americans, wherever they are at 3 p.m. local time on Memorial Day, to pause for one minute in a symbolic act of unity to "remember and honor the men and women of the United States who died in the pursuit of freedom and peace." All Amtrak trains sound their whistles for the entire minute.
