



FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A little boy was working hard on a drawing. His mom asked him what he was doing. "Drawing the picture of God" was his answer. His mom said, "You can't do that, honey. Nobody knows what God looks like." But the little boy was undeterred and continued to draw saying, "They will know in few minutes when I have finished drawing." None of us has seen God but every one of us bears the image of God and can show something of God.

In the First reading Stephen shines forth the forgiving aspect of God by forgiving those who stoned him to death, as Jesus did on the Cross. The second reading figuratively describes how we are made worthy of

re-entering the Garden of the Tree of Life (Garden of Eden) from where Adam and Ever were driven out. We are invited to realize how cursed we are with all the evil we see around, but how worthy we can be to bring heaven on earth.

In the Gospel, Jesus reminds all of us of our Godly status, "I in them and you in me, that they may be brought to perfection as one,and that you loved them even as you loved me. Father they are your gift to me." Through Jesus we have become God's beloved and God's gift to each other. Our life can reflect this wonderful spiritual truth. Each of us individually is God's gift. All of us together can shine forth as God's perfection. As Jesus promised "where two or three are gathered in my name, I am there among them" (Matthew 18:20) our togetherness becomes Jesus' presence.

Last Thursday we celebrated the Ascension of the Lord. Jesus went away from us to heaven only to make Himself present to others through each of us. Together let us shine forth as God's wonderful presence.

Q&A by Fr. Antony

How is the Catholic celebration of the Last Supper of the Lord (Holy Mass) different from the celebration of other Christians?

The Holy Eucharist is the most important of the seven sacraments because, in this and in no other sacrament, we receive the very body and blood, soul and divinity of Jesus

Christ. Catholics believe in the doctrine of transubstantiation. Transubstantiation means more than the Real Presence. According to transubstantiation,

the bread and wine are actually transformed into the actual



body, blood, soul, and divinity of Christ, with only the appearances of bread and wine remaining. This is why, at the Last Supper, Jesus held what appeared to be bread and wine, yet said: "This *is* my body.... This *is* my blood" (Mark 14:22-24, cf. Luke 22:14-20). The celebration of Holy Communion is a thread that links

all Christians. While the components of receiving the Eucharist are similar, each church and denomination has its own variations on the sacrament.

The term "transubstantiation" is not used in the Lutheran Church to describe the change of the bread and wine into



Christ. Lutherans do not believe that the presence of Christ continues in the bread and wine after the time of the Eucharistic celebration. Unlike Catholics they don't maintain the practice of reserving consecrated Hosts in

the tabernacle, in the belief that Christ is still present. Thus Catholic Churches alone will have the Tabernacle preserving the continuing presence of Jesus and the Tabernacle light is kept burning always day and night throughout the year indicating that Jesus is present. Also we carry the presence of Jesus in the Holy Communion to the sick from the Tabernacle to their homes.

Derived from the teachings of John Calvin, Presbyterian and Reformed

denominations teach that Christ is not literally present in the bread and wine. They believe that Christ is spiritually present and



is received with the power of the Holy Spirit for the faithful just at the celebration.

Baptists and similar denominations largely view the Lord's Supper as a remembrance of Christ's suffering. Various other denominations deny any form of physical or spiritual presence of Christ in the bread and wine.

Military Sees Conflicts Over First Amendment Freedoms

An increasing number of military members are discovering their own rights to free speech and religious expression are being curtailed within the very institution whose primary purpose is to protect those same rights for the rest of us.

* A Bible was recently returned to a Missing Man table at a Veterans Hospital in New Hampshire. It had been removed following a complaint from the anti-religion Military Religious Freedom Foundation (MRFF) founded by atheist attorney Mikey Weinstein, who claimed displaying a Bible was unconstitutional. The Bible had belonged to a U.S. Air force TSgt. who was a captive in a German prisoner of war camp during World War II. On

German prisoner of war camp during World War II. On behalf of the POW/MIA Network, First Liberty Institute assured the hospital that "The VA is absolutely within the law in its decision to allow the display of a donated Bible." "The Bible was used as a symbol of freedom, hope, home, love & togetherness by all POWs, no matter what religion or no religion all," said a spokesman for the Veterans Hospital.

* Airmen at the Grand Forks Air Force Base in North Dakota were under attack by MRFF at Christmas for volunteering to help the Salvation Army hand out baskets of food and gifts to families in need.

"(Volunteer) participation is not only permissible, but is consistent with the highest standards of the Air Force mission," wrote First Liberty Institute. "The Constitution does not prohibit active duty service members, reservists or Department of Defense employees from voluntarily participating in community service events with the Salvation Army."

* MRFF is calling for an investigation of the commander of Edwards Air Force Base in CA for his private website, *Prayer at Lunchtime for the United States*, that is designed to "encourage Bible-believing Americans to take time to specifically pray for our nation at lunchtime every day."

"This general, on his own time, as an expression of his faith, with a non-military website from a non-military computer can state his beliefs," said the executive director of Chaplain Alliance for Religious Liberty. The general isn't forcing his religion on anyone since "you have to go to the website, no one is forced to go and you can turn it off at any moment." *"Only our individual faith in freedom can keep us free." Pres. Dwight D. Eisenhower* (airforcetimes.com, 8/14/18; christiannews.net, 3/26/19; toddstarnes.com, 12/18/18; thefederalist.com,7/5/18)

What is done at Holy Hour?

<u>Evening Prayer</u> (Vespers): These are the daily prayers said in the evening by the whole Church, from the Liturgy of the Hours. We join our prayers with clergy, religious and lay persons around the world, praying as one.

<u>Chaplet of Divine Mercy</u>: This is a devotional prayer recited on the beads of the Rosary, asking God to continue to shower us with his mercy.

<u>Benediction</u>: At the end of the hour, chants and prayers in praise of our Lord are recited, and we are actually blessed by Christ as the celebrant makes the Sign of the Cross over the assembly with the monstrance.
