Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

July 7, 2019
Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time
Isaiah 66:10-14C
Psalm 66: 1-3, 4-6, 6-7, 16, 20
Galatians 6:14-18
Luke 10:1-12, 17-20

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:
 At that time the Lord appointed seventy-two others whom he sent ahead of him in pairs to every town and place he intended to visit. He said to them, "The harvest is abundant but the laborers are few; so ask the master of the harvest to send out laborers for his harvest. Go on your way; behold, I am sending you like lambs among wolves. Carry no money bag, no sack, no sandals; and greet no one along the way. Into whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this household.' If a peaceful person lives there, your peace will rest on him; but if not, it will return to you. Stay in the same house and eat and drink what is offered to you, for the laborer deserves his payment. Do not move about from one house to another. Whatever town you enter and they welcome you, eat what is set before you, cure the sick in it and say to them, 'The kingdom of God is at hand for you.' Whatever town you enter and they do not receive you, go out into the streets and say, 'The dust of your town that clings to our feet, even that we shake off against you.' Yet know this: the kingdom of God is at hand. I tell you, it will be more tolerable for Sodom on that day than for that town."
 The seventy-two returned rejoicing, and said, "Lord, even the demons are subject to us because of your name."
 Jesus said, "I have observed Satan fall like lightning from the sky. Behold, I have given you the power to 'tread upon serpents' and scorpions and upon the full force of the enemy and nothing will harm you. Nevertheless, do not rejoice because the spirits are subject to you, but rejoice because your names are written in heaven."

Focus Questions:

1. Describe a person of power who handled their power responsibly.
2. How do you feel called to spread the Gospel?
3. Describe a time when you felt like a lamb among wolves?

Family and children's question:

Talk about a time when you visited someone's home and it felt very peaceful.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A man visited a psychiatrist. He explained, "I've been doing wrong, Doctor, and my conscience is bothering me." The psychiatrist asked, "So you want something that will strengthen your will?" The man replied, "Oh, no, I'd rather get something that would weaken my conscience."

As the second reading explains, it must be from the inspiration of the Spirit dwelling in one's heart. Let us pray that we be inspired by the Spirit in all our choices of life. Let us pray that we live our inner original pure inspiration.

Have a Good summer... Have wonderful trips: The schools are closed. The weather is warm. Everywhere we find lots of opportunities to enjoy the good weather and free time in various ways. Let us not forget God amidst our summer gala-time. Giving some time to worship at the weekends will shape your free time with enough spiritual strength to enjoy it more in the right way, and to deal with the summer 'heat' in a cool way.

We all have access to WiFi everywhere. So wherever we are we can find out a nearby catholic church and the times of worship while you plan your summer events.

Religious Freedom Week 2019: *Strength in Hope*

Join us from **June 22**, the Feast of religious freedom martyrs, Saints Thomas More & John Fisher - to **June 29**, the Solemnity of martyrs, Saints Peter & Paul, as Americans are encouraged to **Pray, Reflect, & Take Action** on religious liberty, both here in this country and abroad.

The theme, *Strength in Hope*, is taken from Romans 8:18: Among the trials of this life, find strength in hope, convinced that, **"the sufferings of the present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory to come that will be revealed to us."**

Archbishop William Lori wrote, "Religious freedom is not a 'carve-out' granted by the state. It's an inalienable right.

"In the West, we are complacent about the threats to religious freedom. Many people don't even perceive them; they happen in courtrooms, boardrooms, legislatures and government agencies. In other parts of the world it's bloody, violent, overt, but in both cases, it's denial of the rights of conscience.

"In the Middle East and elsewhere in the world, we see what societies without religious freedom look like. We see that once religious freedom disappears, human dignity suffers and communities disintegrate."

What is done at Holy Hour?

Adoration: The Blessed Sacrament is placed in a monstrance and we the faithful have an opportunity to enter into prayer and peaceful meditation with our Lord truly present. Time is alternated between silent prayer and spoken prayer.

Evening Prayer (Vespers): These are the daily prayers said in the evening by the whole Church, from the Liturgy of the Hours. We join our prayers with clergy, religious and lay persons around the world, praying as one. Chaplet of Divine Mercy: This is a devotional prayer recited on the beads of the Rosary, asking God to continue to shower us with his mercy.

Benediction: At the end of the hour, chants and prayers in praise of our Lord are recited, and we are actually blessed by Christ as the celebrant makes the Sign of the Cross over the assembly with the monstrance.

Why should I attend a Holy Hour? Thoughts for June:

With transforming mercy, Jesus makes our heart one with his.
