



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

July 21, 2019 Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Genesis 18:1-10A Psalm 15:2-3, 3-4, 5 Colossians 1:24-28 Luke 10:38-42

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

Jesus entered a village where a woman whose name was Martha welcomed him. She had a sister named Mary who sat beside the Lord at his feet listening to him speak. Martha, burdened with much serving, came to him and said,

"Lord, do you not care that my sister has left me by myself to do the serving? Tell her to help me."

The Lord said to her in reply,

"Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. There is need of only one thing. Mary has chosen the better part and it will not be taken from her."

Focus Ouestions:

- 1. If Jesus were to come to your home, what would you do, would you act like Mary or like Martha?
- 2. Describe a time when work, entertaining others or household chores distracted you from listening to Jesus.
- 3. How do you extend hospitality to others as a member of the Church?

Family and children's question:

Where is your home away from home? Who makes you feel welcome there?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A surgeon was discussing a case with medical students: "The muscle in the patient's right leg has contracted until it is shorter than the left. Therefore he limps. What would you do in such a circumstance?" A student raised his hand and said, "I'd limp too." The student's answer describes what would happen to him but not how he could help the patient in such a circumstance.

Today's Gospel is Jesus' famous story of the Good Samaritan. The story is the answer to the question "who is my neighbor?" The simple answer is - "the one who is near to you is your neighbor." The first two, the priest and the Levi passed by the wounded man. They did not help the wounded person because they answered the question, "what would happen to me if I were to help the wounded person?" But the Samaritan helped him because he answered the question, "What would happen to the wounded person if I did not help him?" **Jesus helped the lawyer find out the answer to his question**, "who is my neighbor?" by making him focus not on himself but on the need of the other. If we focus just on our own needs we will have no neighbors. We would treat everything and every person for our selfish needs. Each of us will be living in our own selfish fortress, safeguarding and securing our individual selves. But when the focus is turned towards the needs of others, especially those deserving our help, then the whole world will be flourishing with life, peace and prosperity. Life is in peril when we close ourselves. Life blossoms in reaching out to others.

Religious Freedom Victories at Supreme Court

* The Supreme Court ruled 7-2.

that a 40-foot World War I memorial cross, erected over 90 years ago, can stay on public land in Bladensburg, Maryland. The cross "has become a prominent community landmark, and its removal or radical alteration at this date would be seen by many not as a neutral act but as the manifestation of a hostility toward religion that has no place in our Establishment Clause traditions," wrote Justice Samuel Alito in the majority decision. "The Religion Clause of the Constitution aims to foster a society in which people of all beliefs can live together harmoniously, and the presence of the Bladensburg Cross on the land where it has stood for so many years is fully consistent with that aim."

"A government that roams the land, tearing down monuments with religious symbolism and scrubbing away any reference to the divine, will strike many as aggressively hostile to religion."

* The Supreme Court lifted an order that punished a Christian couple in Oregon, ordering them to pay a \$135,000 fine for declining to create a wedding cake for a same-sex couple. The high Court told a lower court in OR to reconsider the dispute in light of the Supreme Court's decision last year involving Christian baker, Jack Phillips, in Colorado. The justices had found for Phillips because a CO state panel had displayed hostility toward his religious beliefs.

A Religious Freedom Loss at the Supreme Court in 2018 concerned a similar controversy in Washington state where a florist declined a request for floral arrangements at the wedding of a longtime same-sex patron. The high court returned the matter to a Washington state court with orders to reconsider the case in light of its CO decision. The Washington Supreme Court once again ruled against the florist on June 6, 2019. She will now file a second appeal to the U.S. Supreme Court.
