



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

Someone in the crowd said to Jesus,

"Teacher, tell my brother to share the inheritance with me." He replied to him,

"Friend, who appointed me as your judge and arbitrator?" Then he said to the crowd,

"Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions."

Then he told them a parable.

"There was a rich man whose land produced a bountiful harvest. He asked himself, 'What shall I do, for I do not have space to store my harvest?' And he said, 'This is what I shall do: I shall tear down my barns and build larger ones. There I shall store all my grain and other goods and I shall say to myself, "Now as for you, you have so many good things stored up for many years, rest, eat, drink, be merry!" But God said to him,

'You fool, this night your life will be demanded of you; and the things you have prepared, to whom will they belong?' Thus will it be for all who store up treasure for themselves but are not rich in what matters to God."

- 1. Share a time when you felt God calling you to simplify your life.
- 2. Our culture values having lots of things. What is your feeling about all you have accumulated over the years?
- 3. Describe a person you admire who lives with less because of a desire to be more like Jesus.

Family and children's question:

Take a look around your home. Decide what you can donate to others because it is more than you need.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

The art of negotiation is learned at an early age. You'd be amazed how many teens get a car by asking for a motorcycle. Humans always negotiate for a lesser evil. God negotiates for the greater good.

In the first reading Abraham negotiates with God in order to save Sodom and Gomorrah from impending destruction. God changes his mind six times to meet the demands/suggestions of Abraham from saving 50 to just 10 innocent people. God accepts human conditions in order to save people. God does not go by the majority. God's negotiation is not profit-oriented in the sense that God does not act for God's own profit. It is always for the salvation of the people. God's negotiation is beyond all human numbers and calculations. It is the expression of God's mercy and forgiveness. Its aim is to make humans realize that goodness is more lively and joyful than evil; that God's mercy is bigger than human sins.

The Gospel reading begins with the prayer of Jesus, "Our Father" and continues with the story of forgiveness. Like the prayer, "forgive us our sins, as we forgive everyone ..." the story also invites us to imitate God in forgiving others. Forgiving is not merely our generous act towards others but it is our way of living and our power of believing. If we believe that good is more powerful than evil we will try to behave as God, promoting greater good in forgiving. If we trust mercy is more life-promising than sin we will live not negotiating for better profit in life but positively engaging ourselves for the greater good of humanity.

Summer rest and planning: Summer activities are in full swing. As much as we spend time in fun let us also take some time in the relaxed summer days in planning to engage our children in some spiritual activities during the school year... like doing some service as altar servers or choir members or in youth ministry... Education and sport will nurture their body and intellect. Church activities will feed their spirit to unite the mind and body in order to make the child into one un-split and integrated person.

My summer visit to India: I will be in India with my mom and my brothers' families for the month of August. See you all in September.

Welcome to Rev. Dr. Alexander Mariadass: While I am away Fr. Alexander Mariadass, (Fr. Alex) will be here helping us in the parish. He is a priest for 13 years from the diocese of Coimbatore, India. Defending Religious Freedom

The head of NASA, America's space program, gave a speech in April at Capital Ministries, a Christian

organization that since 1997 has sponsored Bible studies for State and Federal officials.

Bridenstine talked about NASA history: Buzz Aldrin taking communion on the moon and the Apollo 8 astronauts' Bible reading in orbit. He said, "We're not trying to Christianize the U.S. government. We believe in an institutional separation, but we also believe in influence." They want the same freedom to bring their personal views to bear on public policy that secularists have.

However, his remarks brought criticism and ire from some secular public officials who claimed, "... legal experts outside of NASA have expressed concern over Bridenstine's speech. They believe it ran afoul of the establishment clause of the First Amendment."

Perhaps these secular officials should consider their own beliefs & influence and review numerous Supreme Court decisions that recognize atheism as equivalent to a "religion for the purposes of the First Amendment." Likewise, in 2014, a federal judge in Oregon ruled that secular humanism is a religion "for Establishment Clause purposes."

New Commission Tackles Freedom

The State Department unveiled a new **Commission on Unalienable Rights**, aimed at providing the Secretary with "an informed review of the role of human rights in American foreign policy."

Sec. Pompeo wants to make sure Americans are all reading off the same page when it comes to our fundamental freedoms. He said words like "rights" can be used for "good and evil" and some have "hijacked" human rights rhetoric to be used for "dubious or malignant purposes."

"The distinctive mark of Western civilization is the belief in the inherent worth of human beings, with the attendant respect for God-authored rights and liberties." What are those rights and liberties? This new commission aims to explain.


