



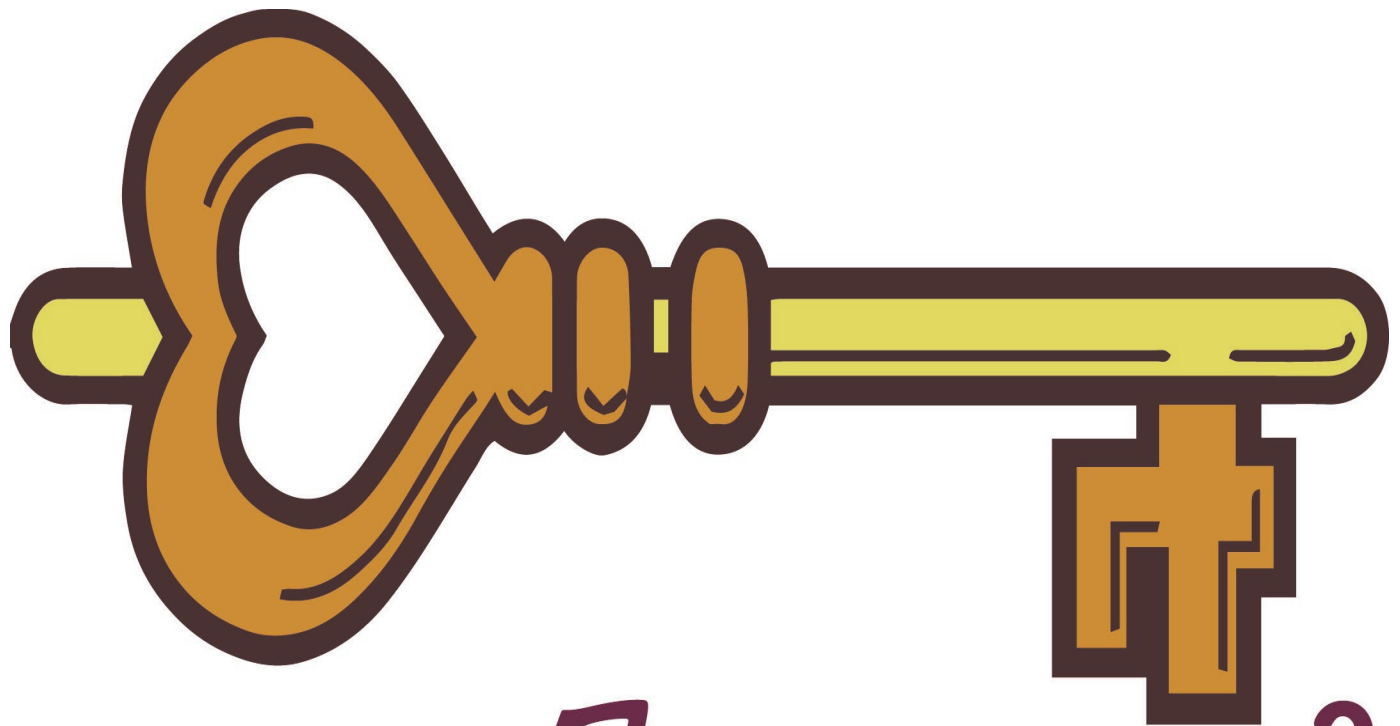

Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

August 11, 2019

Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Wisdom 18:6-9

Psalm 33:1, 12, 18-19, 20-22

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

Jesus said to his disciples:

“Gird your loins and light your lamps and be like servants who await their master’s return from a wedding, ready to open immediately when he comes and knocks.

Blessed are those servants whom the master finds vigilant on his arrival. Amen, I say to you, he will gird himself, have the servants recline at table, and proceed to wait on them. And should he come in the second or third watch and find them prepared in this way, blessed are those servants.

Be sure of this: if the master of the house had known the hour when the thief was coming, he would not have let his house be broken into. You also must be prepared, for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come.”

3. How faithful and prudent a steward are you of the gifts God has given to you?

Family and children’s question:

Jesus tells his disciples not to be afraid. What are you most afraid of?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Two farmers each won a million dollars in the state lottery. The first farmer said, "I am going to use this money to retire, move to Florida, and live the good life." When the second farmer was asked what he planned to do, he replied, "I don't know, I think I'll just keep on farming until it's all used up." According to the first farmer money can buy a better life. According to the second, money can help improve life. There is an old proverb, "Money is a wonderful servant but a terrible master."

Money can buy many possessions but not life and relationships. Money can be spent for gifts but cannot win the heart. Money can afford expensive medicines but not health. Money can build beautiful houses but not loving homes. Money can fill places outwardly but cannot fulfill a person inwardly. At the end, as the first reading says, with money, all will seem mere vanity, a life without substance.

Today's Gospel-story invites us not to lose the immeasurable gift of life at the cost of measurable quantity of money. The story explains the foolishness of sacrificing the present day-to-day life in order to earn possessions for a happy tomorrow. Jesus says the possessions for tomorrow are not a guarantee for the happiness of tomorrow. Living the present happily will equip us with the spirit and strength to live a happy tomorrow. The message is that we have to engage ourselves today totally and fully. As Jesus has instructed in the Sermon on the Mount, "Therefore do not be anxious about tomorrow, for tomorrow will be anxious for itself. Let the day's own trouble be sufficient for the day." (Matthew 6:34) Today's happy life will bring a bright tomorrow. Let us live our present.

Increasing Global Hostility & Restrictions on Religion Part 1

A recent Pew Research report said 52 governments, including Russia & China, impose high levels of restrictions on religion, up from 40 governments in 2007. **This includes violence, harassment, and pressure to convert.**

The U.S. State Department hosted a 3-day meeting, attended by hundreds of government officials and religious leaders from over 100 countries from all regions of the world, in response to this crisis. They referenced the most recent atrocities that are ongoing and that 83% of the world continues to live in places where religious freedom is under threat or altogether absent. **The most persecuted group by numbers are 250 million Christians worldwide.**

Anglican Bishop Philip Mounstephen, acknowledging this shocking figure, said, "I don't for one minute want to ignore the way that members of other faith groups are persecuted...But ...the Christian faith today is the one global faith, and this is a global phenomenon that we're facing." He blamed political correctness, saying, "I think there's a failure to recognize that the Christian faith is predominantly a global faith... and that **we've turned a blind eye when we really shouldn't have, and we've failed to live up to our moral responsibilities in this whole area.**"

"Almost every faith that's a majority somewhere is a minority somewhere else and often gets persecuted," said Sam Brownback, U.S. Ambassador for International Religious Freedom. "This (meeting) is not an exercise in trying to achieve a universal theology. We want everyone to come together around the concept that religious freedom at all times is everyone's right."

The speakers described the suffering of faith communities worldwide, while they also embraced the universal, welcoming solidarity and support from other faith communities & countries.
