### Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

September 8, 2019 **Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time** Wisdom: 9:13-18 B Psalm 90: 3-4, 5-6, 12-13, 14 and 17 Philemon 9:10, 12-17 Luke 14: 25-33

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

Great crowds were traveling with Jesus, and he turned and addressed them.

"If anyone comes to me without hating his father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, and even his own life, he cannot be my disciple. Whoever does not carry his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple. Which of you wishing to construct a tower does not first sit down and calculate the cost to see if there is enough for its completion? Otherwise, after laying the foundation and finding himself unable to finish the work the onlookers should laugh at him and say, 'This one began to build but did not have the resources to finish.' Or what king marching into battle would not first sit down and decide whether with ten thousand troops he can successfully oppose another king advancing upon him with twenty thousand troops? But if not, while he is still far away, he will send a delegation to ask for peace terms. In the same way, anyone of you who does not renounce all his Possessions cannot be my disciple."

#### **Focus Questions**:

- 1. What does it mean to you to be a disciple of Jesus?
- 2. Who do you look up to as a disciple of Jesus? How does that person inspire you?
- 3. Describe a time when you were in a situation where the letter of the law was more important than the spirit of the law. How did you react?

Who are the healers in your life? This week say a prayer for them each night.

#### FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Two men were beginning a game of golf. The first man stepped to the tee, and his first drive gave him a hole-in-one. The second man stepped up to the tee and said, "Okay, now I'll take my practice swing and then we'll start the game." None of us wants to be a loser. Also there exists a sad idea among us that one's victory lies in defeating the other. When one has not got the victory, then starts the blame game...blaming the situation, accusation, justification, reinterpretation of the loss etc.

Today's reading explains that failure or success is not the proper way of looking at life. The First Reading calls us to value ourselves as a giver of gifts, that we are God's great gift to others. Life blooms its best, not in competing with others, but in humble and generous spirit of sharing and serving life-gifts with others.

In the Gospel Jesus explains the same truth in the context of a wedding banquet. Life is a great banquet served by God. It is so abundant that all will have more than enough food. It is God's free food to each of us that one need not vie with others. Each one's life has its own uniqueness and abundance that one need not struggle for superiority over someone else's life.

Jesus invites us to live our life from its own uniqueness and abundance. Each of us is so unique that we need not compete with others to prove our self-dignity. Lining one's own uniqueness leads not to competition but to appreciation and inclusion of the talents of the other. Each of us has an abundance of goodness to offer that we need not disprove the other in order to prove our worth. We are so abundantly created with inner resources that we can never exhaust our goodness to others. Let us pray that we have enough humility to appreciate both ours and other's uniqueness, and sufficient generosity to acknowledge the goodness in ourselves and others.

Thus our generosity will serve both others and our parish by the rebate. I personally ask you to help meet the goal. Lawsuits Often Needed to Restore

Freedom of

Religion & Speech to Students

California: The Huntington Beach S.D. agreed to pay attorney costs and a policy change that will permit "students to engage in religious expression without fear of reprisal." A case was brought on behalf of two students in an elementary school who were denied their First Amendment rights. The principal had barred the students from handing out "Bring Your Bible to School Day" information flyers during the school day, including lunch and recess, due to their religious content.

"Bring Your Bible to School Day" has become a national event, in October, in order to counteract the misperceptions created by a 1963 Supreme Court ruling that teacher-led prayer be removed from American public schools. Many people falsely assumed religion had been banned. Too often school officials unfairly infringe on student rights to free speech and confiscate religious themed books read during free time, forbid student prayer during non-instruction time, or ban speech, writing, and artwork with a religious content.

<u>Colorado:</u> The Univ. of Colorado-Colorado Springs, refused to reverse its policy that a Christian group could not require officers and leaders to adhere to Christian principles - until it was sued. The school has now changed its discriminatory policies and must also pay \$20,500 in damages, court costs, and attorney fees as part of the settlement.

"After they were sued, all of a sudden a higher level of accountability was involved and they decided to change their policies and allow our group to operate freely on campus," said an Alliance Defending Freedom attorney.

Florida: Univ. of Florida agreed to stop discriminating against student group Young Americans For Freedom (YAF). The group sued the University alleging the schools' process of disbursing student fees to fund organizations on campus discriminated against their political views. UF's Student Government had denied YAF's request to become a fully budgeted student organization, thus preventing funding requests for guest speaker fees.

The YAF chapter agreed to settle its lawsuit against the university in exchange for it eliminating the policies that prohibited the YAF from receiving speaker fees for their likeminded speakers.


