



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

September 15, 2019 Twenty-Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time Exodus 32: 7-11, 13-14 Psalm 51: 3-4, 12-13, 17, 19 1 Timothy 1: 12-17 Luke 15: 1-10

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

Tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to listen to Jesus, but the Pharisees and scribes began to complain, saying.

"This man welcomes sinners and eats with them." So to them he addressed this parable.

"What man among you having a hundred sheep and losing one of them would not leave the ninety-nine in the desert and go after the lost one until he finds it? And when he does find it, he sets it on his shoulders with great joy and, upon his arrival home, he calls together his friends and neighbors and says to them,

'Rejoice with me because I have found my lost sheep.'I tell you, in just the same way there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous people who have no need of repentance.

"Or what woman having ten coins and losing one would not light a lamp and sweep the house, searching carefully until she finds it? And when she does find it, she calls together her friends and neighbors and says to them,

'Rejoice with me because I have found the coin that I lost.' In just the same way, I tell you, there will be rejoicing among the angels of God over one sinner who repents."

Focus Questions:

- 1. Describe a time when someone treated you with kindness and mercy.
- 2. Which of the parables in today's Gospel is your favorite? Why?
- 3. Recall a time when you felt lost and someone rescued you.

Family and children's question:

Talk about a time when someone forgave you.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

"Money can't buy you friends, but your enemies treat you better." This saying explains two things. 1) We cannot put a price tag on relationships because it is immeasurable and anything measurable like money cannot buy it. 2) In the eyes of enemies we are nothing more than a measurable quantity like money or possessions which they can manipulate as they like.

The first reading explains that life is not a program devised by human intelligence but a divine mystery waiting to be unfolded by divine wisdom. Human wisdom will build life within the limits of power and plan of human senses and intelligence. Divine wisdom opens life to a limitless horizon, having God as the navigator. In the second reading Paul's letter to Philemon, a slave master, Paul recommends to him to accept back his run-away slave, not as a slave but as a brother in love. That is what divine wisdom does. It breaks the closed human system into the limitless horizon of brotherly love.

In the Gospel Jesus releases in us, His disciples, a new power. By this new power we can choose to build our life on the firmest rocky foundation that is indestructible. This power is so intimately an empowering spirit in each disciple that they would be ready to renounce (hate) even the closest relationships like mother, father, wife, children etc., so the disciple may cherish the inner power and grow in it. Here the intention of Jesus is not to make us hate the family but His words are a hyperbole, an exaggeration for the effect that our inner power is greater than any other outer influence. We, as Jesus's disciples have a greater inner power that nothing in the world can overpower unless we choose to be succumbed by it. Let us follow Jesus to realize our inner power. Please, remember that this Sunday, September 8th is St. Thomas More Beach Mass and Picnic at Otto Schubert Beach, Nissequogue, starting with Mass at Noon. Picnic follows the mass with burgers, hot dogs, chips, beverages.

Ready for School and planning the school year: Summer activities are almost over. Kids are getting ready for school. I request parents to please help the children in planning out the school year to engage in some spiritual activities ... like doing some service as altar servers, lectors, choir members or in the youth ministry... Education and sport will nurture their body and intellect. Church activities will feed their spirit which is the basis of both mind and body.

What Can Parents & Grandparents Do to Protect a Child's Religious Freedom?

(1) Attend a monthly School Board meeting to "Educate the Educators"

- * Provide copies of the U.S. Department of Education's Guidance on Constitutionally Protected Prayer in Public Schools. Every student may: pray before & after school during free times such as recess & lunch; read the Bible & other religious books during free reading time; write, speak and draw expressions of their faith in classwork & homework where appropriate to the assignment; wear clothing & jewelry with religious messages; speak about God and their faith at school events and graduation; form religious based clubs that use school resources the same as other clubs.
- * Remind School Board members that as a condition to receive education funds, Section 9524 requires that the School District certify in writing to the State educational agency, that it has no policy that prevents, or otherwise denies participation in, constitutionally protected prayer or expression in their schools.
- Tell your child about the Dept. of Education Guidelines that guarantee his/her First Amendment Freedom of Religion and Freedom of Speech. CFFR has prepared a pamphlet, It's OK for Students to Pray, explaining these student rights. See www.cffor.org for information and free pamphlets and DVD. Also see www.ed.gov for other information.
- Confirm that Constitution Week Sept. 17-23, 2019 - is being celebrated at your child's school. This celebration was signed into law in 1956. It requires that schools and universities that receive Federal funds are educating students and faculty about the Constitution, signed 1787, that provides the framework for the United States of America. The aims of this celebration are:
- * Emphasize citizens' responsibilities for protecting and defending the Constitution.
- * Inform people that the Constitution is the basis for America's great heritage and the foundation for our way of
- * Encourage the study of the historical events which led to the framing of the Constitution in September, 1787. (cffor.org; ed.gov; dar.org; apples4theteacher.com)


