Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

September 22, 2019 Twenty-Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time Amos 8: 4-7 Psalm 113: 1-2, 4-6, 7-8 1 Timothy 2: 1-8 Luke 16: 1-13

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke: Jesus said to his disciples, "A rich man had a steward who was reported to him for squandering his property. He summoned him and said, 'What is this I hear about you? Prepare a full account of your stewardship, because you can no longer be my steward.' The steward said to himself, 'What shall I do, now that my master is taking the position of steward away from me? I am not strong enough to dig and I am ashamed to beg. I know what I shall do so that, when I am removed from the stewardship, they may welcome me into their homes.'

He called in his master's debtors one by one. To the first he said, 'How much do you owe my master?' He replied, 'One hundred measures of olive oil.' He said to him, 'Here is your promissory note. Sit down and quickly write one for fifty.' Then to another the steward said, 'And you, how much do you owe?' He replied, 'One hundred kors of wheat.' The steward said to him, 'Here is your promissory note; write one for eighty.' And the master commended that dishonest steward for acting prudently. "For the children of this world are more prudent in dealing with their own generation than are the children of light. I tell you, make friends for yourselves with dishonest wealth, so that when it fails, you will be welcomed into eternal dwellings. The person who is trustworthy in very small matters is also trustworthy in great ones; and the person who is dishonest in very small matters is also dishonest in great ones. If, therefore, you are not trustworthy with dishonest wealth, who will trust you with true wealth? If you are not trustworthy with what belongs to another, who will give you what is yours? No servant can serve two masters. He will either hate one and love the other, or be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and mammon."

1. What "clever and resourceful" gifts do you bring to the building of God's kingdom?

2. How do technology, cell phones, TV, social media interfere with your relationship with God?3. How single minded is your focus on God?

Family and children's question:

How can you put God first in your life?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

In a nursing home the small resident population gathered around their midday meal. The director asked each person in turn to express one thing for which they are thankful. Thanks were expressed for home, family, children, friends, etc. One little old lady in her turn said, "I thank the Lord for two perfectly good teeth, one in my upper jaw and one in my lower jaw that match so that I can chew my food." Life can be cherished even with small chances. Little blessings can bring a lot of happiness.

The first reading narrates, on the one hand how God has decided to destroy His own people but, on the other hand, it also narrates how God's mercy makes God change His own decision from destroying to saving His people. God's mercy wants us to live even when according to His right judgement we have no chance to live .

The Gospel story reiterates the truth in the story of the "Prodigal Son." The younger son has no reason or right to claim his son ship back. He returns to the father believing in his mercy to be accepted as only one of his hired workers. But the mercy and love of his father gives back his life to start over as his son. The end of the story defends the father's position by inviting the older son to join the party for younger son's start of a new life.

Let us believe in God's mercy and begin a new life. We may be not holy to fit God's standard but we are worthy of God's mercy to become holy.



"Building a Culture of Religious Freedom" From Abp. Charles Chaput's address on July 9, 2019

"Religious believers can live quite peacefully with the separation of Church and state, so long as it's real freedom and not the half-starved copy of the real thing called 'freedom of worship.' We can never accept a separation of our religious faith and moral convictions from our public ministries or political engagement. It's impossible. And trying to do so is evil ..."

Therefore, "religious faith sincerely believed and humbly lived serves human dignity" for both the believing and non-believing (and) "...it's vital in building a humane society."

"We can begin building a culture of religious

freedom by changing the way we think. Majority opinion doesn't determine what is good and true. The deep moral problems we now face in our country didn't happen overnight. They've been fed by a false understanding of freedom for decades, and they have roots in the exile of God from public consciousness.

"We also need to change the way we act. ... The right to pursue happiness does not include a right to excuse or ignore evil in ourselves or anyone else. When we divorce our politics from a grounding in virtue and truth, we transform our country from a living moral organism into a kind of golem of legal machinery without a soul."

"If we want a culture of religious freedom, we need to begin living that culture here, today, and now ...Nations change when people change... You create the future with the choices you make. So, serve the poor. Help the weak. Protect the unborn. Speak the truth about creation (Gen. 5:2). Fight for your right to love and serve God, and for others to do the same.

"If you do that, you'll inspire others to do the same. And you'll discover in your own life what it means to be fully human."




