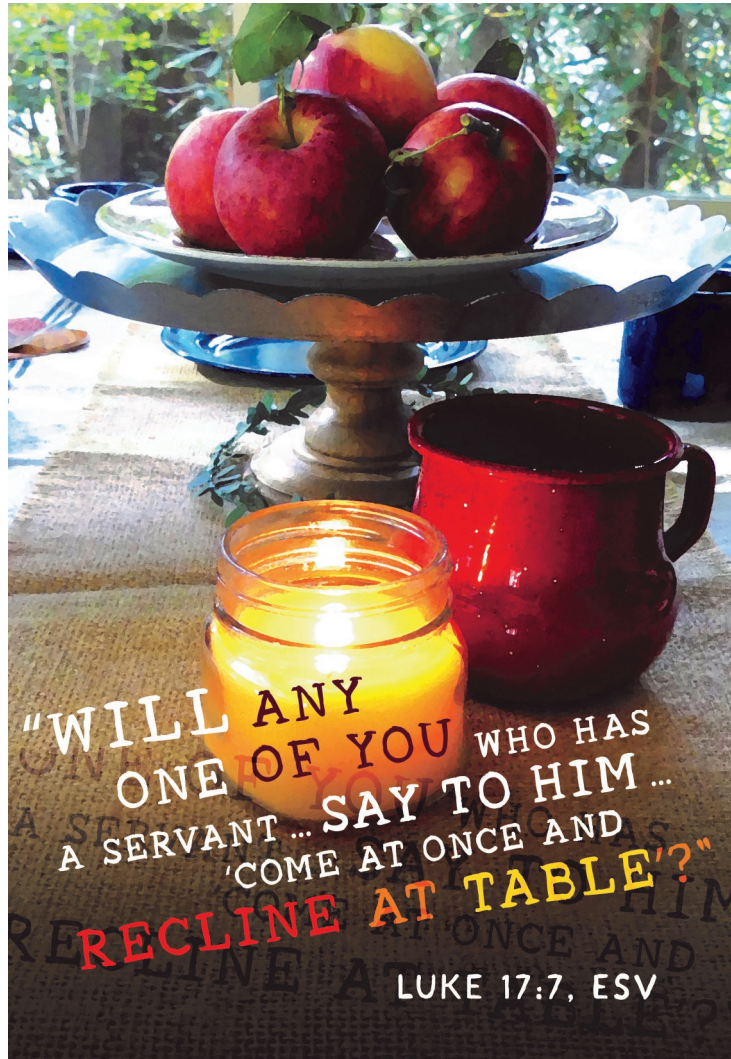

Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

October 13, 2019

Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

2 Kings 5: 14-17

Psalm 98:1, 2-3, 3-4

2 Timothy 2: 8-13

Luke: 17: 11-19

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

As Jesus continued his journey to Jerusalem, he traveled through Samaria and Galilee.

As he was entering a village, ten lepers met him.

They stood at a distance from him and raised their voices, saying,

"Jesus, Master! Have pity on us!"

And when he saw them, he said,

"Go show yourselves to the priests."

As they were going they were cleansed. And one of them, realizing he had been healed, returned, glorifying God in a loud voice; and he fell at the feet of Jesus and thanked him. He was a Samaritan.

Jesus said in reply,

"Ten were cleansed, were they not? Where are the other nine? Has none but this foreigner returned to give thanks to God?"

Then he said to him, "Stand up and go; your faith has saved you."

Focus Questions:

1. Describe a time when you did something for another and it wasn't acknowledged.
2. What are you grateful for?
3. How do you express your appreciation to God?

Family and children's question:

Write down the names of the people who help you. This week let them know how much you appreciate them.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

“My wife is a very neat housekeeper” a proud husband was bragging to his friend. “If I drop my socks on the floor, she picks them up. If I throw my clothes around, she hangs them up. I got up at three o’clock the other morning and went in the kitchen to get a glass of orange juice. I came back and found the bed made.” It is easier to be involved mechanically rather than consciously in one’s life. It is less stressful to live by habits than it is to live the day from the heart with care and love.

Jesus invites us in today’s Gospel to live with the strength of faith which means to live from the heart and not from habit and convenient philosophy. Jesus promises that the power of faith is so wondrous that “If you have faith the size of a mustard seed, you would say to the mulberry tree, ‘Be uprooted and planted in the sea,’ and it would obey you.” Jesus continues to explain through a story how life is not a field where we work like a slave expecting the master of life to pay our reward.

Life is a more a mystery to live by than a convenient philosophy to be executed in hard and burdensome works. If we believe that we are born to live then the faith in life invites us to believe in the mystery of life force in and around us. But if we understand that life is an unsolved force to be mastered then we will sweat and toil like slaves expecting life to pay us our reward. Faith in life releases all the positive life-energy in us to blossom life in and around us. Let us ask God to strengthen our faith.

October, the month of Our Lady of the Rosary: “The family that prays together stays together” is an adage. The Rosary is a family prayer that all the generations of a family pray together. October is the month dedicated to Our Lady of the Rosary. If your work or other concerns of daily life do not give enough time to pray the full Rosary, please try to come together as a family to pray a decade of the Rosary. A decade of the Rosary is praying an “Our Father”, 10 “Hail Marys” and conclude with “Glory Be”. Also when you wait on line, are stuck in traffic, or waiting in the doctor’s office... you can raise your heart to God praying the Rosary. In our Church we pray the Rosary every day before Mass.

Respect Life Sunday: Sunday, October 6 is Respect Life Sunday. As we celebrate Respect Life Sunday, we are reminded that the assaults on human dignity come in many forms. The Respect Life Office is charged with deepening our already strong commitment to pro-life activities and parish education. **Advocating for International
 Religious Freedom at United Nations**

On Sept. 23, President Trump told the United Nations that stopping religious persecution around the world is one of his "highest priorities."

The event marked the first time a U.S. president has called a U.N. summit on religious freedom. Speaking before a crowd of world leaders, U.S. business owners and survivors of religious persecution, the president committed another \$25 million to protect religious freedom, religious sites and relics from persecution and destruction. He said 80% of the world's population lives in places where freedom of religion is banned, restricted or threatened. Christians continue to be the most persecuted religious group in the world, even nearing levels of genocide.

"The United States is founded on the principle that our rights do not come from government; they come from God. This immortal truth is proclaimed in our Declaration of Independence and enshrined in the First Amendment to our Constitution's Bill of Rights. Our Founders understood that no right is more fundamental to a peaceful, prosperous, and virtuous society than to follow one's religious convictions."

"Regrettably, the religious freedom enjoyed by American citizens is rare in the world... As we speak, Jews, Christians, Muslims, Buddhists, Hindus, Sikhs, Yazidis, and many other people of faith are being jailed, sanctioned, tortured, and even murdered, often at the hands of their own government, simply for expressing their deeply held religious beliefs."

"Today, with one clear voice, the United States of America calls upon nations of the world to end religious persecution. To stop the crimes against people of faith, release prisoners of conscience, repeal laws restricting freedom of religion and belief, protect the vulnerable, the defenseless, and the oppressed..."

"As President, protecting religious freedom is one of my highest priorities and always has been."
