Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

October 27, 2019

Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Sirach 35: 12-14, 16-18

Psalm 34: 2-3, 17-18, 19, 23

2 Timothy 4" 6-8, 16-18

Luke: 18: 9-14

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

Jesus addressed this parable to those who were convinced of their own righteousness and despised everyone else.

"Two people went up to the temple area to pray; one was a Pharisee and the other was a tax collector. The Pharisee took up his position and spoke this prayer to himself, 'O God, I thank you that I am not like the rest of humanity - greedy, dishonest, adulterous -- or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week, and I pay tithes on my whole income.'

But the tax collector stood off at a distance and would not even raise his eyes to heaven but beat his breast and prayed, 'O God, be merciful to me a sinner.'

I tell you, the latter went home justified, not the former; for whoever exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted."

Focus Questions:

1. Describe a time when you depended solely on yourself.
2. Do you identify with the Pharisee at times by judging those you see at church?
3. Describe a time when you learned to be humble.

Family and children's question:

Talk about the importance of not judging other people because only God knows what is inside their hearts.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Mother: Did you push your little sister down the stairs?

Bobby: I only pushed her down one step. She fell the rest of the way.

Falling was only a simple act. But mom heard two different interpretations of it - one from the brother, the pusher and the other from the victim, his sister, the one who fell. We live in a world of multiple interpretations or understandings of reality. We are also familiar with variant reporting or presentation of anything that happens. In the heavy din of many confusing voices, it becomes more and more difficult to hear the soft and gentle voice of the truth.

Today's Gospel Story invites us to focus on the inner voice of conscience as the widow did. All the odds were against the poor widow. The judge neither feared God nor respected humans, and was unwilling to serve justice. She is not only a woman but a widow which means a voiceless second class citizen. She had no way of getting justice except to believe that JUSTICE is on her side. Her conviction/belief that she had justice on her side was her only strength.

She was not distracted and nothing could divert her from her conviction. She did not allow any outside noise to silence or discourage her inner voice of justice. That is what made her not to lose her spirit of perseverance, to ceaselessly plead for justice. Without perseverance, any amount of perspiration would bring us nowhere or bear no fruit. Perseverance is born out of faithfully adhering to the inner voice of one's own conscience. Let us pray that God help us focus to hear the inner voice of the conscience without fail, in all times and in all situations.

Halloween - November 1st All Saints. The origin of the word *Halloween* is Christian. *Halloween* falls on the evening before the [Christian](#) holy day of [All Hallows' Day](#) (also known as *All Saints'*, *Hallowmas* or *Hallow tide*) on November 1. October 31st, Eve of All Hallows in popular use became *Halloween*. When we celebrate our inner power and identity of being saints on November 1st, we rightfully ridicule and make fun of all that scares us, on the eve (October 31st) of 'All Saints' feast. The Halloween costumes are geared towards making fun of the evil and the scary stuff, and to highlight the Goodness and the Saintliness we carry within.

Let us celebrate All Saints and Costume Mass on November 1st: In the background of what I explained above, teens and adults are invited with Halloween costumes to attend the All Saints mass on Friday, November 1st at 7:00 pm. Thus we can celebrate our potential to be saints by ridiculing all that is non-saintly, scary and evil.

Saturday November 2nd, All Souls Day: At 9:00 am is the memorial mass for all those who passed away from us in the past year. Letters of invitation have been sent to the families of the deceased who were buried from our church. Please feel free to join us to pray for those deceased from our families.

During the month of November we pray for the dead. Starting Saturday, November 2nd until Monday, November 6th, we pray the Novena masses, for all the deceased, whose names are mentioned in the All Souls Envelopes. If you wish to include any names, the envelopes are found in the Narthex.

**Worldwide Religious Freedom
 Abuses - Part 2**

The persecution of Christians around the world has increased in 2019 with concern for believers in China, India, and Nigeria. Watchdog group, Release International, reports 215 million believers face violence and discrimination for their faith.

China continued: One underground church leader wrote in 2018: "Things are getting tighter here ... Brothers and sisters are facing difficulties and suffering for their faith. My sister (& family) were put in jail for gathering with about 30 people ... They were beaten and shocked by the electric sticks ..."

India: Hate crimes and targeted violence rose 57% during the first two months of January. The Religious Liberty Commission pointed to violent radical mobs that have stormed prayer meetings, ransacked churches, and beaten believers. Recently, Indian authorities jailed church leaders and their families after hardline Hindus disrupted a worship service, beat individuals, and live-streamed the events on Facebook.

Radical Hindu nationalists use social boycotts to pressure Christians into converting to Hinduism. Christian families are cut off from electricity, water, the ability to cultivate agricultural fields, and even the ability to socialize with Hindu villagers.

Nigeria: Militants such as Boko Haram continue devastating attacks against Christians in the north and central Nigeria. In a six month period, 6,000 people were killed and 50,000 were driven from their homes. Release International said there is a "deliberate plan to destroy and take over the predominately Christian communities in the region." The Christian Association of Nigeria said what is happening is "pure genocide and must be stopped immediately."
