Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

November 3, 2019 Thirty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time Wisdom 11: 22-12:2 Psalm 145:1-2, 8-9, 10-11, 13, 14 2 Thessalonians 1:11-2:2 Luke: 19: 1-10

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

At that time, Jesus came to Jericho and intended to pass through the town. Now a man there named Zacchaeus, who was a chief tax collector and also a wealthy man, was seeking to see who Jesus was; but he could not see him because of the crowd, for he was short in stature. So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree in order to see Jesus, who was about to pass that way.

When he reached the place, Jesus looked up and said, "Zacchaeus, come down quickly, for today I must stay at your house."

And he came down quickly and received him with joy. When they all saw this, they began to grumble, saying, "He has gone to stay at the house of a sinner."
But Zacchaeus stood there and said to the Lord, "Behold, half of my possessions, Lord, I shall give to the poor, and if I have exterted anything from anyone I shall

poor, and if I have extorted anything from anyone I shall repay it four times over."

And Jesus said to him,

"Today salvation has come to this house because this man too is a descendant of Abraham. For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save what was lost."

Focus Questions:

- 1. What are you doing to seek out Jesus n your life?
- 2. Describe a time when you went out of your way to see someone who would make a difference in your life.
- 3. Relate a story of someone whose life was changed once they made a commitment to follow Jesus. How did their story affect you?

Family and children's question:

Zacchaeus was too short to see Jesus so he climbed a tree. Talk about things your family can do to see Jesus in your daily lives.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

In order to hide his failing eyesight from his girlfriend, Jim stuck a pin in a tree. The next day, while walking in the forest with her, he pointed to the tree, some hundred yards distant, and said, "Isn't that a pin sticking in that tree?" and as he ran to retrieve it, he tripped over a cow. Being true to oneself is the best way of impressing the other. Any other pretension will only expose one's weakness without fail.

In the Gospel today we see the Pharisee trying to impress God. His boast was that he leads a holier life than the sinners and thus is a justified person before God. Jesus, on the other hand points out that the tax collector, considered to be a sinner, actually stood justified before God, because he allowed God to justify him in God's Mercy.

Holiness is not what we can or cannot do for God, but what God is allowed to do in us. Holiness is one's own openness to allow God to act in oneself. As Mother Teresa explains, "We must become holy not because we want to feel holy, but because Christ must be able to live His life in us." We cannot do enough of anything for God. God does not need anything to be done for Him. Rather we need God to work in us in order to live the best in us and thus to create the best of the world around us. Let us allow God to work in us as the tax collector did.

Halloween - November 1st All Saints. The origin of the word *Halloween* is Christian. *Halloween* falls on the evening before the Christian holy day of All Hallows' Day (also known as *All Saints'*, *Hallowmas* or *Hallow tide*) on November 1. October 31st, Eve of All Hallows in popular use became *Halloween*. When we celebrate our inner power and identity of being saints on November first, we rightfully ridicule and make fun of all that scares us, on the eve (October 31st) of 'All Saints' feast. The Halloween costumes are geared towards making fun of the evil and scary stuff, only to highlight the Goodness and the Saintliness we carry within.

Let us celebrate All Saint and Costume Mass on November 1st: In the background of what I explained above, teens and adults are invited with Halloween costumes to attend the All Saints mass on Friday, November 1st at 7:00 pm. Thus we can celebrate our potential to be saints by ridiculing all that is non-saintly, scary and evil.

November 2nd Saturday, All Souls Day: At 9:00 am is the memorial mass for all those who passed away and were buried from our church during the past year. Letters of invitation have been sent to the families. Please feel free to join us to pray for those deceased from our families.

During the month of November we pray for the dead. Starting from Saturday. November 2nd until Monday November 6th, we pray the Novena masses for all the deceased, whose names are mentioned in the All Souls Envelopes. If you wish to include any names of people who are deceased, the envelopes are found in the Narthex.

The National Collection for the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA (AMS) is scheduled for the weekend of November 2-3, 2019. This collection is taken up once every three years. Unlike a territorial diocese, the AMS has no parishes and must depend on the support of the Catholic faithful throughout the United States for its pastoral care and services to 1.8 million Catholics serving in our U.S. Armed Forces and federal installations worldwide. The nation's largest archdiocese, AMS spans the globe and its priests go wherever American servicemen and women are stationed, bringing them the sacraments, spiritual support and the Good News of eternal salvation through Jesus Christ. Little Sisters of the Poor Sued - Once Again

The Little Sisters of the Poor filed a petition with the Supreme Court on Oct. 1 asking the court to once again protect them from the Health & Human Services (HHS) mandate, under the Affordable Care Act, as they face lawsuits from California, Pennsylvania, and several other states. The mandate requires that cost-free coverage for contraception, abortion inducing drugs and sterilization be included in employer health plans.

The Sisters are a religious order of nuns in the U.S. since 1868, dedicated to caring for the elderly poor.

Catholic teaching holds abortion and contraception to be gravely immoral. Thus, it violates conscience and religious freedom rights for Catholic nuns or any group with closely held religious beliefs, to comply with this mandate.

In 2016, the Supreme Court tossed the Little Sisters case and several similar cases back to their respective courts of appeal for reconsideration.

In 2017, the President issued an Executive Order supporting a new rule that would allow the Little Sisters and similar groups to claim a religious exemption against the mandate. He told the Little Sisters their "long ordeal will soon be over."

"Today we are grateful for the president's order and look forward to the agencies giving us an exemption so that we can continue caring for the elderly poor and dying ... without the fear of government punishment," said Mother Loraine.

A new HHS rule protecting religious freedom rights was subsequently issued.

Yet, California immediately sued the federal government to take away that religious freedom exemption. Although CA admits that it has many of its own programs to provide contraceptives, etc. to women, 13 other states joined them and are forcing the Little Sisters of the Poor back to court.

"It has been six long years since we began our legal battle against government mandates that threaten our ministry," said Mother Loraine.
