Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

November 10, 2019

Thirty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

2 MC 7:1-2, 9-14

Psalm 17:1, 5-6, 8, 15

2 Thessalonians 2:16-3:5

Luke: 20:27-38

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

Some Sadducees, those who deny that there is a resurrection, came forward and put this question to Jesus, saying, "Teacher, Moses wrote for us, *If someone's brother dies leaving a wife but no child, his brother must take the wife and raise up descendants for his brother.*

Now there were seven brothers; the first married a woman but died childless. Then the second and the third married her, and likewise all the seven died childless. Finally the woman also died. Now at the resurrection whose wife will that woman be? For all seven had been married to her." Jesus said to them, "The children of this age marry and remarry; but those who are deemed worthy to attain to the coming age and to the resurrection of the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. They can no longer die, for they are like angels; and they are the children of God because they are the ones who will rise. That the dead will rise even Moses made known in the passage about the bush, when he called out 'Lord, ' the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob; and he is not God of the dead, but of the living, for to him all are alive."

Focus Questions:

1. Relate a time when someone asked you a trick question. How did you respond?
2. Describe a time when you questioned if there was life after death. How did you deal with it?
3. Relate a time when someone with no or weak faith questioned your belief in the afterlife.

Family and children's question:

Talk about family members who have died. Remember them in your prayers this week.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

At a reception, a young man was asked by a woman to guess her age. “You must have some idea,” she said, as he hesitated.

“I have several ideas,” he admitted, with a smile. “The trouble is that I hesitate whether to make it ten years younger on account of your looks or ten years older on account of your wisdom.” It is always very difficult and dangerous to define any human being because the truth of/about a person is bigger than what that person shows of himself/herself or is perceived of himself/herself by others.

Today's Gospel is the story of how Zacchaeus was seen by Jesus and judged by others. Jesus valued Zacchaeus for what he can become, while others judged him for what he has become. Others nailed him to what he did and imprisoned him in his past. Jesus frees him to what he would be able to do.

Jesus saw in him what others failed to see. By self-inviting himself for a dinner at Zacchaeus' house, Jesus released in him the power of what he can become. The so-called sinner now boldly promises “Behold, half of my possessions, Lord, I shall give to the poor, and if I have extorted anything from anyone I shall repay it four times over.” Jesus too approves the release of new spiritual power in him by saying, “Today salvation has come to this house.” Let us not judge. Let us try to see people as Jesus sees. Every sinner has a saintly future, as every saint has a sinful past.

November is the month we pray for those who lived with us and left us to be with God. Death is the reality of the biological body. As the Word of God explains, our body bears the Image of God (Genesis 1:28) and is the Temple of the Holy Spirit (Paul's Letter to Corinthians 3: 16-17). Body has its own limitation and can hold life only for limited time. But that is realized in the Body, the Spirit of God lives forever. Our beloved finished their earthly bodily life. Now they are called by God to live eternally in God's presence. Please pray that they have eternal rest and enjoy God face to face living eternally.

Last Sunday the eighth graders volunteered in the heavy rain helping the annual clothing drive. The parish appreciates all their hard work with spirit of smile and generosity. **In the evening the sixth graders** highlighted the Youth mass at 5:30 pm taking part in various ministries of being ushers, readers, greeters. They also demonstrated to the community through pictures and arts how God cares for the creation and how much we should be part of God's creative work. Bravo sixth graders. Thank you all. Let us encourage our teenagers in their faith life.

Dishonest Language – Example #1
“Do No Harm” Act would Greatly
Harm Religious Freedom for
Doctors & More

Archbishop Chaput has decried dishonest language. The mislabeled “Do No Harm” Act, does the exact opposite of its name since it eliminates religious freedom protections for employers and medical professionals. The “Do No Harm” Act gives more privileges to those claiming to be offended than to those exercising their religious freedom First Amendment rights. The “Do No Harm” Act includes the broad phrase dignity to essentially end any religious exemptions.

Since this Act is Designed to amend the Religious Freedom Restoration Act (RFRA) of 1993, it removes exemptions for religious doctors, nurses, or any medical professional giving access to, information about, referrals for, provision of, or coverage for, any health care item or Service.

This means that doctors could be forced to perform gender-reassignment surgeries or prescribe hormone-blocking prescriptions. It would remove religious exemptions for those who do not want to provide referrals for abortion. The Act has the potential to target and eliminate exemptions for protected religious speech since a person might claim that hearing speech about a religious belief causes him/her dignity harm. The “Do No Harm” Act could erase all religious exemptions in America.

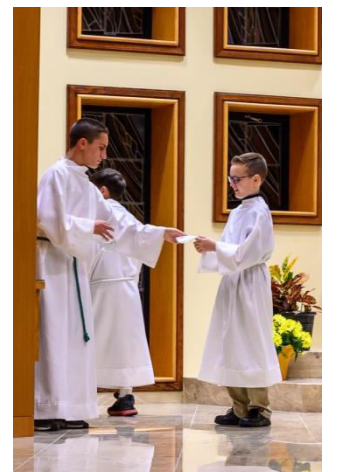

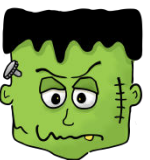
