Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

November 17, 2019 Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time MAL 3:19-20A Psalm 98: 5-6, 7-8, 9 2 Thessalonians 3:7-12 Luke: 21:5-19

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

While some people were speaking about how the temple was adorned with costly stones and votive offerings, Jesus said, "All that you see here--the days will come when there will not be left a stone upon another stone that will not be thrown down." Then they asked him, "Teacher, when will this happen? And what sign will there be when all these things are about to happen?" He answered, "See that you not be deceived, for many will come in my name, saying, 'I am he,' and 'The time has come.' Do not follow them! When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified; for such things must happen first, but it will not immediately be the end." Then he said to them, "Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be powerful earthquakes, famines, and plagues from place to place; and awesome sights and mighty signs will come from the sky. "Before all this happens, however, they will seize and persecute you, they will hand you over to the synagogues and to prisons, and they will have you led before kings and governors because of my name. It will lead to your giving testimony. Remember, you are not to prepare your defense beforehand, for I myself shall give you a wisdom in speaking that all your adversaries will be powerless to resist or refute. You will even be handed over by parents. brothers, relatives, and friends, and they will put some of you to death. You will be hated by all because of my name, but not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance you will secure your lives."

Focus Questions:

- 1. How can you become more present to the kingdom of God right now?
- 2. What keeps you awake at night? Where do you put your trust and faith in the future?
- 3. What would you do differently if you knew "the end" was near?

Family and children's question:

Who do you turn to when you get discouraged?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Teacher: Children, we can learn from the ants. Ants work very hard every day. The ant works all the time. And what happens in the end?

Student: Somebody steps on him.

Nothing in life will be seen in its proper value if life is seen through the window of death. Death is an unavoidable event of life, but can never be the interpretive agent of the values and blessings of life.

In Today's Gospel Jesus explains that the life is eternal and death cannot limit life. The Sadducees believed that death is the end of human life and there is no life after death. Jesus indicates to them how God, whom they believe, is addressed as God of their fore-fathers, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob etc., which means that "God is God not of the dead but of the living, for God all are alive." God does not see life as a simple time-span lived in human body from its birth to death. God values life in human body as a time and occasion to experience and express the divine reality.

Jesus incarnated as a human person, as Jesus of Nazareth, expressing and sharing with us the same reality that the destiny of our human existence is not death but Resurrection, eternal life. In Jesus' life, death and Resurrection we can believe and hope for what will happen to us at the end of our earthly life. As He rose, those who believe in Him will also rise for everlasting life in HIM. Let us pray that our Lord increases our faith in eternal life. Let us pray that God in Jesus Christ grant our beloved Deceased eternal life.

Dishonest Language – Example #2

Deceptively Named "Equality Act" Would Harm Religious Liberty and Free Speech

(Deceit: The act of causing someone to accept as true or valid what is false or invalid.)

Misinformation on the intent and implications of the socalled "Equality" Act, conceived to prohibit discrimination on the basis of sex, gender identity, and sexual orientation, was passed by the U.S. House in May. This H.R. 5 bill would make it possible for nationwide religious discrimination against people of faith as well as free speech, by redefining the word "sex" in the Civil Rights Act of 1964 to include "sexual orientation" and "gender identity" as protected classes throughout the federal code.

This bill purports to equate newly defined "sex rights" with the current rights found in the Civil Rights Act. However, "sex" is a biological fact determined at birth and "sexual orientation" and "gender identity" are Biological "sex" is objective and fact feelings. based. "Orientation" and "gender identity" are subjective and fluid. Since a feeling is subjective and not intrinsic to an individual such as a person's skin color or nationality, broadening the term "sex" to include "feelings" is inaccurate and deceptive.

If this bill is passed into law, the implications for religious freedom and free speech are far reaching. The "Equality Act" bans the use of the Religious Freedom Restoration Act (RFRA) as a legal defense from the government violating a person's religious liberty. In addition, it would require men, women, etc., to be treated exactly the same from bathrooms, women's sports, shelters, rape crisis centers, to sexuality education programs that promote a particular ideology.

Former Equal Employment Opportunity Commissioner, Chai Feldman, said, "I'm having a hard time coming up with any case in which religious liberty should win...Sexual liberty should win in most cases. There can be a conflict between religious liberty and sexual liberty, but in almost all cases the sexual liberty should win..."


