# Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

November 24, 2019
Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe
2 Samuel 5:1-3
Psalm 122: 1-2, 3-4, 4-5
Colossians 1: 12-20
Luke: 23: 35-43

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke:

The rulers sneered at Jesus and said, "He saved others, let him save himself if he is the chosen one, the Christ of God." Even the soldiers jeered at him. As they approached to offer him wine they called out, "If you are King of the Jews, save yourself." Above him there was an inscription that read, "This is the King of the Jews." Now one of the criminals hanging there reviled Jesus, saving, "Are you not the Christ? Save yourself and us." The other, however, rebuking him, said in reply, "Have you no fear of God, for you are subject to the same condemnation? And indeed, we have been condemned justly, for the sentence we received corresponds to our crimes, but this man has done nothing criminal." Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." He replied to him, "Amen, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise "

- 1. If you were with Jesus as he hung on the Cross, what would you say to him?
- 2. How do you keep your core values intact in the face of adversity?
- 3. Who has inspired you by how they approached their own death?

#### Family and children's question:

Who are the people that are excluded in your community? How do you respond to those who feel excluded?

#### FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A reporter was interviewing an African safari guide. He asked, "Is it true that jungle animals won't harm you if you carry a torch?"

The guide replied, "That depends on how fast you carry it."

Torch can be a temporary means to scare the animals, but not a guarantee to save one's life from them. Likewise we can accumulate all kinds of insurances for a comfortable and secured life. But nothing can make us escape death.

**Today's Gospel depicts the impending and unavoidable dangers** that have to happen in nature, between nations and among people. None can escape from them. As humans we are weak and prone to grow from bad to worse. We can end up causing more wars and destructions to ourselves. How to escape from these self-inflicted dangers?

Jesus reminds us at the end of the reading "not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance you will secure your lives." Amidst all the destroying negative situations and peoples around us, Jesus promises a secured life for those who persevere. Persevere in what? Persevere in Jesus' presence and promises. Because Jesus is Emmanuel (meaning 'God with us'). He never deserts us in any situation. Jesus admonishes us not to be distracted or despaired by these discouraging situations, but to remain faithful bearing testimony to their faith in Jesus' living presence. In all our trials and temptation let us renew our strength in Jesus and pray "lead us not into temptation (losing our faith in His presence) but deliver us from evil."

#### Escaping Religious Persecution -Still a Longed-for Dream Around the World

Americans will soon celebrate Thanksgiving Day and remember the Pilgrims, who fled religious persecution seeking a place to live and thrive in freedom. They came to this "New World" aboard the Mayflower and survived the harsh conditions in 1620-21 with the grace of God and help from the Wampanoag Indians. At last they were free from persecution.

Sadly, the God-given right to freedom of conscience is denied to over 3/4 of the world population with many experiencing extreme forms of persecution from harassment to torture and death.

For example, on Nov. 1, Chinese priests and parishioners barricaded themselves in a Catholic Church in northern China in an attempt to prevent the government from tearing it down. A Vatican agreement with China was intended to secure some religious freedom for Catholics but only state approved churches are now allowed...with their government spies and more control instead. In many of these government-controlled churches, the cross is taken down and pictures of Prime Minister Xi Jinping are put up instead.

Chinese persecution of religious minorities has also been the focus of international concern with millions of Uighur Muslims and others imprisoned and subjected to organ harvesting for the country's organ trade.

"For the most part, we are aware of the persecution and martyrdom of (people of faith) around the world, but we tend to be naive about the threat to religious freedom right here in America," wrote Rev. Msgr. James McNamara. There are those who want to deny conscience rights and freedom to practice closely held religious beliefs to some small business owners, health care workers, adoption agencies, military chaplains & officers, teachers & students, and many more. These citizens are marginalized, discriminated against, sued, and denied their First Amendment religious freedom protections.

"May this country (America) and each of you be renewed in gratitude for the many blessings and freedoms that you enjoy. And may you defend these rights, especially your religious freedom, for it has been given to you by God himself."

Those whose last names begin with letters **A through M will attend the 3:30** Mass. Those whose last names begin with letters **N through Z will attend the 5:30** Mass.


There will be one **mandatory rehearsal and costume pick-up.** It will be **Saturday, December 21st** and will last about one hour.
