Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

December 22, 2019 Fourth Sunday of Advent Isaiah 7: 10-14 Psalm 24: 1-2, 3-4, 5-6 Romans 1:1-7 Matthew 1: 18-24

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew

This is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about. When his mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found with child through the Holy Spirit. Joseph her husband, since he was a righteous man, yet unwilling to expose her to shame, decided to divorce her quietly. Such was his intention when, behold, the angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home. For it is through the Holy Spirit that this child has been conceived in her. She will bear a son and vou are to name him Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." All this took place to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophet: Behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel, which means "God is with us." When Joseph awoke, he did as the angel of the Lord had commanded him and took his wife into his home.

Focus Questions:

- 1. Relate a story of a good father who raised his children with love and wisdom. How has this father inspired you?
- 2. Joseph's empathy saved Mary's life. When has someone else's empathy changed your circumstance.
- 3. Describe a time when all you could do was trust that everything would be alright.

Family and children's question:

What can your family do to help families that are struggling this time of year?

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

After witnessing the first presentation of his play that had been a complete failure, the English Playwright Oscar Wilde was asked by someone, "How did your play go tonight, Oscar?"

"Oh," said Wilde, "the play was a great success. The audience was a failure."

Failure or success depends on which end of the event one looks at. Every problem can be handled as a crushing painful moment or a challenging opportunity to arrive at a better solution.

In the Gospel today John the Baptizer, who is in prison, on hearing what Jesus does, sends his disciples in order to make sure if Jesus is the right person to believe. Jesus invites them to see and understand what he does as the sign of their belief in the right person. Jesus may do wonderful things but the faith in him depends upon how one looks at them or takes them to their heart. The signs may inspire faith in Jesus or they can be misused like the scribes did, to discredit Jesus, saying that Jesus is possessed by Beelzebul and by the prince of demons he drives out demons. (Mark 3:22).

Advent is the time which can inspire us to experience Jesus. One can live the Advent time in silence, prayer and sharing so that Christmas may be the celebration of Jesus' birth in our hearts and home. Or one can also spend this Advent time in busy shopping, meaningless decorating with lights and trees, valueless fun with eating and drinking and thus miss the godly experience of this season. Advent invites us to use all the festive signs of colors, music, shopping, decorations and dinners as an occasion and opportunity to realize that God is an everyday living reality in all things we do and say.

Two 'Hail Mary' Novena to Christmas day. Nine days for Christmas Eve. Please start a simple Novena of praying two "Hail Marys" - one for your family and the other for our parish family. We pray "Hail Mary" imitating the Blessed Virgin Mary. As it happened to her let us allow Jesus to be born through her in our hearts and homes. Join with me and the congregation at the daily 9:00 am Mass, in praying for every family of our Parish, especially for those who will join with us at the masses on Christmas Eve and Day. May this Christmas touch, in a special way all our families with Christ's Joy and Peace.

Today, the Third week of Advent we bless Jesus figurines of Crèches at all masses. If you have forgotten to bring it, You can bless it at home. Please hold the Infant from your Crèche reverently in your hand; invite those that live with you and pray as shown below.

"God our Father, you loved us so much. You sent us your only son, Jesus, born of the Virgin Mary, to save us and lead us back to you. We pray that this image of Jesus might be a sign of your presence and love in our homes. Good Father, give your blessing to family and friends who would gather with us this Christmas. Open our hearts, that we might receive Jesus in joy, Do always what he asks of us and see him in those who need our love. We ask this in the name of Jesus your beloved Son, who lives with us forever and ever. Amen.

The December Dilemma: Celebrating Religious Holidays in Public Schools & the Public Square

Every December, public schools, towns and businesses, face the difficult task of acknowledging the various religious and secular holiday traditions celebrated during this time of year without crossing the line of promoting a particular belief. The First Amendment guarantees freedom of religion to all Americans - including young school children - by prohibiting the government from endorsing any particular religious point of view while still respecting and protecting all religious beliefs.

Holiday Myths & Facts

Myth: Public schools cannot display religious Christmas and Hanukkah symbols.

Fact: A public school is free to display a Nativity scene, Menorah, and other forms of religious and secular seasonal expression with the purpose of depicting the origins of the holiday.

Myth: Public school students aren't allowed to sing or play Christmas carols.

Fact: Students can sing and perform religious carols along with secular ones. The purpose is to teach about our society's cultural and religious heritage and allow students to perform a full range of music, poetry and drama.

Myth: Students cannot talk about their faith and the religious origins of their holiday in class assignments.

Fact: Schools cannot refuse to allow, punish, or give a lower grade to a student who includes a religious viewpoint in a class assignment. Far from "establishing religion," that would be displaying an anti-religious bias which is unconstitutional and infringing on the free speech of students.

Myth: Christmas trees, Nativity scenes, and Hanukkah Menorahs cannot be displayed on public land.

Fact: The Supreme Court has held that these have become both a secular and religious symbol and their display by a public entity does not violate the Establishment Clause. (adl.org; adflegal.org, 12/11/15; rutherfordinstitute.org; alliancedefendingfreedom.org)
