Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

January 26, 2020 Third Sunday in Ordinary Time Isaiah 8:23-9;3 Psalm 27:1, 4, 13-14 1 Corinthians 1:10-13, 17 Matthew 4:12-23

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Matthew::

When Jesus heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew to Galilee. He left Nazareth and went to live in Capernaum by the sea, in the region of Zebulun and Naphtali, that what had been said through Isaiah the prophet might be fulfilled: Land of Zebulun and land of Naphtali, the way to the sea, beyond the Jordan, Galilee of the Gentiles, the people who sit in darkness have seen a great light, on those dwelling in a land overshadowed by death light has arisen. From that time on, Jesus began to preach and say, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand."

As he was walking by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon who is called Peter, and his brother Andrew, casting a net into the sea; they were fishermen. He said to them,

"Come after me, and I will make you fishers of men." At once they left their nets and followed him. He walked along from there and saw two other brothers, James, the son of Zebedee, and his brother John. They were in a boat, with their father Zebedee, mending their nets. He called them, and immediately they left their boat and their father and followed him.

He went around all of Galilee, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom, and curing every disease and illness among the

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Girl: The man I marry must be brave as a lion, but not forward; handsome as Apollo, but not conceited; wise as Solomon, but meek as a lamb; a man who is kind to women, but loves only me.

Boy: How lucky that we met.

Often we try to value people by comparing them with whatever we hold as best. Comparison is a poor way of understanding or appreciating a person. Comparison is not the way of portraying the original value of a person for who she/he is, because each person is unique and original.

Today's readings call us to look at our original and unique God-given self which is incomparable and "unbargain-able". In the first reading God says that "God will make us a light to the nations that God's salvation may reach to the ends of the earth." Our worth is not simply what we can do humanly but what God can do through us in the world. We become God's shining light.

Today's Gospel explains how God fills us with the Holy Spirit in our baptism to do God's work in the world. Each of us as God's work is unique and incomparable. We are not a copy of any human being, not a program of anybody or any organization. We are not here to defend or defeat anybody. Our lifestyle is not any particular ideological implementation at the cost of losing our personal participation in life. We are and each of us is a unique expression of God's light and original act of God's salvation. Let us pray for God's wisdom and strength to live our uniqueness and originality as God's shining light.

Religion National Religious Freedom Day -January 16 A day to learn, celebrate and thank God...

Each year since 1993, the President declares January 16th to be "Religious Freedom Day," and calls upon Americans to "observe this day through appropriate events and activities in homes, schools, and places of worship."(1)

January 16 is the anniversary of the passage, in 1786, of the Virginia Statute for Religious Freedom, written by Thomas Jefferson, and is the model for the First Amendment of the Bill of Rights. It is a statement about freedom of conscience that protects the rights of people to express their religious beliefs without suffering discrimination. Also, the government is banned from interference in religion and individual beliefs as well as taxing people to pay for the support of the local church.

This principle of a "wall of separation between church and state," was written by Pres. Jefferson in 1802 to further clarify and support individual freedom of conscience and the open practice of faith without government interference, as intended in the First Amendment.

"On Religious Freedom Day, we celebrate our Nation's long-standing commitment to freedom of conscience and the freedom to profess one's own faith. The right to religious freedom is innate to the dignity of every human person and is fundamental to the pursuit of truth." (2) President Trump Proclamation, 2019


