



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

February 2, 2020
The Presentation of the Lord
Malachi 3:1-4
Psalm 24:7, 8, 9, 10
Hebrews 2:14-18
Luke 2: 22-40

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to Luke: When the days were completed for their purification according to the law of Moses, Mary and Joseph took Jesus up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord, just as it is written in the law of the Lord,

Every male that opens the womb shall be consecrated to the Lord, and to offer the sacrifice of a pair of turtledoves or two young pigeons, in accordance with the dictate in the law of the Lord. Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon. This man was righteous and devout, awaiting the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he should not see death before he had seen the Christ of the Lord. He came in the Spirit into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus to perform the custom of the law in regard to him, he took him into his arms and blessed God, saying:

"Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in the sight of all the peoples: a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel."

The child's father and mother were amazed at what was said about him; and Simeon blessed them and said to Mary his mother, "Behold, this child is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be contradicted --and you yourself a sword will pierce-- so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed."

There was also a prophetess, Anna, the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was advanced in years, having lived seven years with her husband after her marriage, and then as a widow until she was eighty-four. She never left the temple, but worshiped night and day with fasting and prayer. And coming forward at that very time, she gave thanks to God and spoke about the child to all who were awaiting the redemption of Jerusalem.

When they had fulfilled all the prescriptions of the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favor of God was upon him.

- 2. Describe a time when you felt it hard to wait.
- 3. Relate a time when you had to be patient.

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends.

A man was trying to fix his stalled car when a cow came along. "Your trouble is probably in the carburetor," said the cow. Startled, the man ran down the road until he met the farmer and told him the story.

"Was it a large red cow with a brown spot over the right eye?" asked the farmer.

"Yes, Yes," replied the man.

"Oh! I would not listen to Bessie, "said the farmer, "She does not know anything about cars." Like the farmer we may fail to wonder at a person's strength at the cost of focusing on his/her weakness.

In the Gospel today Jesus is launching his public ministry of inviting His people to participate in and live the Kingdom of God which is becoming a reality in Him. Then He calls the uneducated fishermen, Peter, Andrew, James and John to join Him in this great mission. Jesus always looks at what people can do even though He knew that they may fail in their weakness. God believes in our goodness more than in our wickedness.

God invests in our talent more willingly than in our weakness. Because as much as God knows "our frame and remembers that we are dust" (Psalm 103:14) God is also aware "How wonderfully are we made." (Psalm 139:14). He calls us as He called the first disciples to employ our goodness. This is the way Jesus is going to establish God's kingdom. Jesus wants us to work with Him as his disciples. Jesus has great confidence in our goodness to cooperate with him, in bringing out the Kingdom of God among us.

The Church is a spiritual home in a physical building. Here we realize our relationship for each other in Christ. I thank you all for your spiritual and financial support towards this spiritual community to survive. Even if you miss a week due to inclement weather like last Sunday or for any other reason, you supplement your support the following week. President Trump Safeguards the Right to Religious Freedom in Public Schools

"We don't worship government - we worship God."



On Jan.16, National Religious Freedom Day, President. Trump said, "This afternoon, we're proudly announcing historic steps to protect the First Amendment right to pray in public schools...It is a sacred principle of our Republic that government must never stand between the people and God. Yet, in public schools around the country, authorities are stopping students and teachers from praying, sharing their faith, or following their religious beliefs....

Tragically, there is a growing ...impulse...that seeks to punish, restrict, and even prohibit religious expression." (1)

For seven years, Catholics for Freedom of Religion has been reporting instances of students denied their right to religious expression in their schools.

The Trump administration has updated the guidelines, first issued under President Clinton, and is sending them to every school that receives federal funds. The Guidance on Constitutionally Protected Prayer and Religious Expression in Public

"These actions by the president should prompt discussions among parents, clergy and educators that will end the too common suppression of students' appropriate expressions of their faith." said Barbara Samuells, President of Catholics for Freedom of Religion.

To monitor compliance with the guidelines, every public school will continue to certify to their state that they have no policy that conflicts with students' religious freedom rights. As before, a public school's federal funding could be suspended if the school is not in compliance." (2)

He will be assisted by his fellow Marianists, who will seek feedback and ideas from the full spectrum of those with a stake in a revitalized Catholic elementary education, including our parishioners. 
