



Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

March 15, 2020 Third Sunday of Lent Exodus 17:3-7 Psalm 95:1-2, 6-7, 8-9 Romans 5:1-2, 5-8 John 4:5-15, 19b-26, 39a, 40-42

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John::

Jesus came to a town of Samaria called Sychar, near the plot of land that Jacob had given to his son Joseph. Jacob's well was there. Jesus, tired from his journey, sat down there at the well. It was about noon.

A woman of Samaria came to draw water. Jesus said to her, "Give me a drink." His disciples had gone into the town to buy food. The Samaritan woman said to him, "How can you, a Jew, ask me, a Samaritan woman, for a drink?" —For Jews use nothing in common with Samaritans.— Jesus answered and said to her, "If you knew the gift of God and who is saying to you, 'Give me a drink, you would have asked him and he would have given you living water." The woman said to him, "Sir, you do not even have a bucket and the cistern is deep; where then can you get this living water? Are you greater than our father Jacob, who gave us this cistern and drank from it himself with his children and his flocks?" Jesus answered and said to her, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again; but whoever drinks the water I shall give will never thirst; the water I shall give will become in him a spring of water welling up to eternal life." The woman said to him, "Sir, give me this water, so that I may not be thirsty or have to keep coming here to draw water. "I can see that you are a prophet. Our ancestors worshiped on this mountain; but you people say that the place to worship is in Jerusalem." Jesus said to her, "Believe me, woman, the hour is coming when you will worship the Father neither on this mountain nor in Jerusalem. You people worship what you do not understand; we worship what we understand, because salvation is from the Jews. But the hour is coming, and is now here, when true worshipers will worship the Father in Spirit and truth; and indeed the Father seeks such people to worship him. God is Spirit, and those who worship him must worship in Spirit and truth." The woman said to him, "I know that the Messiah is coming, the one called the Christ; when he comes, he will tell us everything." Jesus said to her, "I am he, the one who is speaking with you." Many of the Samaritans of that town began to believe in him. When the Samaritans came to him, they invited him to stay with them; and he stayed there two days. Many more began to believe in him because of his word, and they said to the woman, "We no longer believe because of your word; for we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this is truly the savior of the world."

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

A woman requested to open a joint account at the bank. When asked if the account would be with her husband, she replied, "Oh no, couldn't I have one with someone who has a lot of money?" Today's readings explain that God wants to have a joint account with us.

In the first reading God invites Abraham to come out of his father's house and join God who will make him a great nation, will bless him and all the communities of the earth through him. God initiates an account of blessings with all through Abraham.

The second reading invites us to share a holy life not according to our works but according to God's own design. We may not deserve it but God desires to join us to Him. **The Gospel demonstrates in Jesus' transfiguration** how we are called to share the same glory. God invites us to listen to His son Jesus. This means that by listening to Jesus we will be empowered not only to see but to experience and participate in God's glorious life as manifested in Jesus. Lent is the time to realize how our choice of joining to God will make our lives Godly in power and character. Let us allow ourselves to be transfigured according to God's design.

During Lent we pray the Stations of the Cross every Friday at 7:00 pm in the church for a particular intention. This Friday, March 13th at 7:0-0 pm we pray the Stations for those who are impacted by events-- loss of beloved ones by sudden death, accidents, house fires and other challenges. All are welcome.

This year's Lenten Project is to help those hit hard by the recent Hurricane Maria and an earthquake in Puerto Rico. As almsgiving is one of the three spiritual exercises of Lent (prayer, fasting and almsgiving) let us try to reach out to people suffering from lack of basic needs. Please donate generously in the "house" kept in the Narthex.

Please mark your Calendar-- March 23rd, 24th and 25th is the Parish Mission by Fr. Bob Joerger on 'Love casts out Fear'.

Friday, April 3rd at 6:00 pm is the Soup Supper. If you wish to attend please bring a meatless soup to share with others. Soup supper will be followed by Stations of the Cross.

The Health of American Democracy Requires the Centrality of Religion

In a recent interview with Cardinal Timothy Dolan, Attorney General William Barr said, "The reason the (Founding Fathers) felt they could grant so much freedom in the Constitution and only provide for limited government was because religion would be the force that guided people so they could largely govern themselves. Alexis de Tocqueville observed that the centrality of religion was (the cause) of the health of American democracy." (1)

Barr defended a person's natural right to obey one's conscience above one's government. He is concerned that the rule of law, fair play, and due process are threatened by "militant secularists" trying to "impose their values" on others " (2)

Maine & Maryland Barring Religious Schools from Tuition Support Programs - Accused of Anti-religious Hostility

More than 100 small towns in Maine don't have their own high school, so families choose a high school and the town pays the bill up to the rate allowed by the state. Three families are now suing the state for religious discrimination since, while the state will pay tuition for a private school, it refuses to pay tuition for a religious affiliated school.

"When a state decides to empower parents to choose the school that is best for their child, to then say, but we are going to exclude religious schools...just strikes at the very core of our religious freedom...," said an attorney for Institute for Justice. (3)

Maryland revoked the Baltimore-area Bethel Christian Academy from participation in a voucher program benefitting low-income students and demanded the school repay more than \$100,000 for their previous participation.

"The government may not discriminate against religious schools simply because it dislikes their religious beliefs. Bethel offers an academically rigorous and caring Christian education in a diverse environment...Maryland's families deserve better and that's why we're grateful Bethel's lawsuit can move forward," said an Alliance Defending Freedom attorney. CARE AND CONCERN DURING THE SEASON OF FLU AND CORONAVIRUS



SHOULD YOU COME TO MASS? The Obligation to attend Mass on Sunday and other Holy Days of Obligation is the ordinary expectation for Roman Catholics (Canon 1247). However, extraordinary circumstances such as sickness or severe weather excuse the faithful from this obligation. If you suspect you have the flu or are suffering from a serious cold or other contagious illness, please stay at home and do not risk spreading infection to others.

HOLDING HANDS DURING THE LORD'S PRAYER: Well-intentioned folks introduced this practice into parishes in the 1980s. Although holding hands can be a beautiful expression of people united in prayer, the gesture is not envisioned as a proper action in any Church documents governing the Sacred Liturgy, and therefore, neither called for nor required. It is most fitting to pray the "Our Father" with hands folded in prayer.

THE SIGN OF PEACE: Please do not take offence should someone choose not to shake hands with you during the Sign of Peace. An appropriate gesture for those who are concerned about spreading the flu virus might be to clasp your hands together and with a smile say "Peace be with you".

RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION: Roman Catholics believe that both the Body and the Blood of Christ are contained fully in the Holy Eucharist under the form of either the Consecrated Host or the Precious Blood; that is, whether one receives only the Host or only the Precious Blood, one receives Jesus fully. While the Church encourages reception of both forms at Mass as a fuller expression of the Last Supper, this may not always be possible. If you are feeling sick or suspect that you might have been exposed to something contagious, please refrain from receiving Holy Communion from the cup, and receive only the Sacred Host. It is never appropriate to dip your host into the cup, as this is irreverent and can contaminate the cup.

HEEDING MEDICAL ADVICE: If you've been told by your medical advisor that you are particularly susceptible to infection or to complications due to flu in particular, please refrain from practices that might make you sick, including shaking hands, receiving Holy Communion on the tongue, drinking the Precious Blood from the Chalice, etc.
