



FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

One can easily wake up the person who is actually in deep sleep; but not the one who pretends to sleep. Likewise, it is easier to converse with the one who listens than with the one who pretends to listen.

Today's Gospel is the narration of Jesus opening the eyes of the man born blind. It shows how it was easy for Jesus to open the eyes of the blind who yearns to see, while at the same time how Jesus could not make the others grasp His divine light because they know for sure who Jesus is. Their willful pride/pretense is that Jesus is no more than what they know of Him already. Jesus has nothing more to reveal as truth than what they have known already. They were so hard hearted that nothing could penetrate into them nor could they open their heart to anything new.

Revelation from God in one's daily life is not accumulating new facts but seeing one's life in a new light. It is a capacity to open one's heart to grasp and grow about one's own worth before God. For those who live life as daily revelation there is always something new to grow and something creative to experience.

Lent is the time when we pray with the words of St. Paul, "that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, may give you (us) a spirit of wisdom and revelation resulting in knowledge of him. May the eyes of (your/our) hearts be enlightened, that you (we) may know what is the hope that belongs to his call, what are the riches of glory in his inheritance among the holy ones." (Ephesians 1:18)

Home Church of St. Thomas More - Worshippers in Spirit and Truth: None of us thought that the invisible virus could affect our style of life and way of thinking in such a visible way. Social life has become a social distancing to such an extent that we maintain a healthy distance of at least six feet away from each other; our hand shake has become a means of spreading the virus than the virtue of friendliness. Fear is everywhere; the sense of being safe and careful to contain the virus is in the mind of everyone. No school, no church, no social gathering or celebrations...quasi quarantine everywhere.

As much as we are in quarantine style of life, this is the time that we have to express our support, care and our spiritual union. As much as we take care of our body from being infected, this is the time we extend generously our Spirit of good will for others and faith in God. Fix a particular time of your daily life (like the time of family meal or a time before bed) and raise your heart along with your family members to God in faith and pray for all those who are suffering and all those who are serving them.

For Jesus says to us, "if two of you agree on earth about anything for which they are to pray, it shall be granted to them by my heavenly Father. For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them." (Matthew 18:19-20) Let us be worshippers closely united in Spirit and Truth, caring and praying for each other.

A Slow-Motion and Horrific Religious War Is Under Way, Worldwide

U.S. Ambassador for Religious Freedom, Sam Brownback, has warned that religious persecution is spreading worldwide with alarming anti-Christian violence in Nigeria and a growing religious surveillance state in China.

"There's a lot of people getting killed in Nigeria," said Brownback . "80% of the world's population live in countries that have religious persecution. "..." It's the most deadly time in the history of Christendom for you to be a Christian. There's more Christian persecution than any time in the history of mankind." (1)

The incidents are grim and harrowing. Nigerian villagers talk about the machetes falling on arms, fingers, heads, and pregnant bellies. They've been lit on fire, sold into sex slavery, shot and raped - all because they're Christians.

"Boko Haram has killed more Christians in Nigeria than ISIS killed in Iraq and Syria combined," said former Congressman Frank Wolf. "(They're) committing genocide. Genocide." (2)

Ambassador Brownback said there have been "some pretty good meetings recently" with the Nigerian government but is calling for more dialogue between Muslims and Christians to "really try to get them working together instead of killing each other." ⁽³⁾

China has developed a "social credit" system over the last 10 years that has been used to track and punish religious minorities. If a person has a low social credit score, said Brownback, they could be prohibited from obtaining an education or living in a certain area. "And it won't be just for you. It will be your friends with you. If anyone pings your cell phone, that will be tracked and they'll get the same low social credit score you get. And these are the systems being modeled and worked on and done now today in China," he said. China is "best in the world" at religious persecution and surveillance of religious groups and has been engaged in a "war with faith." PARISH LENTEN PROJECT

This year's Lenten Project is dedicated to supporting the people of southern Puerto Rico who have been impacted by the earthquakes earlier this year. Please check the display in the Narthex to see documentation of the devastation that has taken place. The Puerto Rico Electric Power Authority was still dealing with a fragile grid from Hurricane Maria's devastation in 2017 when the earthquake hit and knocked out power to 75 percent of the island. The Immaculate Conception Church in Guayanilla, dating back to the 1840's, sustained major damage. Churches, convents, rectories, schools and homes were destroyed in 16 villages leaving people to live in tents, public squares, and their cars.

Donations may be placed in the Lenten house in the Narthex and will be sent to Pastor Angel Pagan who will personally deliver it to the Bishop of the Diocese of Ponce.

As always, we thank you for your support and generosity during this Lenten season and throughout the year.
