

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

Little Billy, caught in mischief, was asked by his mother, "How do you expect to get into heaven?" He thought for a moment and then said, "Well, I'll just run in and out and keep slamming the door until they say, 'For heaven's sake, either come in or stay out. ' 'Then I'll go in."

Heaven is not a reward for what we did or failed to do. Rather heaven is for those who believe in it and realize that it is the gift of God to each of us.

In the Gospel today Jesus comes to the home of Lazarus, where his family and friends are mourning his death. Through what he says to them, Jesus helps us to focus on our spiritual power which is stronger than death. Martha tells Jesus that the death of her brother could have been avoided if Jesus had been there a little earlier. Martha said to Jesus, "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died. [But] even now I know that whatever you ask of God, God will give you." Jesus said, "Your brother will rise." That is to say: that in the midst of death Jesus wants Martha to remember and realize that there is Resurrection, Life cannot be stopped by death.

Jesus does not stop there. He invites all the believers to experience this eternity of life by saying, <u>"I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die." Lent is a call to live the eternity in everyday life.</u>

At this time of the Corona Virus, through this Gospel, Jesus reminds us that we have such a great spiritual power within us, that we can overcome any threatening situations, even the invincible death. At this time of fear and anxiety, social-distancing and restrained quarantining, St. Paul's words invite us to live in hope and strength of the God who will never let us down. I have learned in whatever situation I find myself to be self-sufficient. I know indeed how to live in humble circumstances; I know also how to live with abundance. In every circumstance and in all things I have learned the secret of being well fed and of going hungry, of living in abundance and of being in need. I have the strength for everything through him who empowers me" It is not the time to be in despair but to believe in God's power which is in each of us and around us. It is the time to depend on God for healing grace and at the same time to live our spiritual strength to spread the spirit of

Five Popes Reflect on the Philosophy of Socialism and **Communism:**

American Heritage Dictionary: "Socialism is any of various theories or systems of social organization in which the means of producing and distributing goods is owned collectively or by a centralized government that often plans and controls the economy."

Catholic Social Teaching (catholic.org): "Only persons are made in the image of God... The dignity of man, the concept of personhood, cannot be built upon agnostic or atheistic foundations."

Pope John Paul II (1978-2005) "Socialism considers the individual person simply as an element, a molecule within the social organism, so that the good of the individual is completely subordinated to the functioning of the socioeconomic mechanism."

Pope Benedict XVI (2005-2013) "We do not need a State which regulates and controls everything, but a State which ... generously acknowledges and supports initiatives arising from (those)...closest to those in need (government power ought to reside at the local or regional level and least centralized competent authority.)

Pope Paul VI (1963-1978) "Too often Christians attracted by socialism tend to idealize it in terms which are very general: a will for justice, solidarity and equality. They refuse to recognize the limitations of the historical socialist movements, ..."

Pope John XXIII (1958-1963) "Pope Pius XI emphasized the fundamental opposition between Communism and Christianity, and made it clear that no Catholic could subscribe even to moderate Socialism. The reason is that Socialism is founded on a doctrine of human society which ... takes no account of any objective other than that of material well-being ... it places too severe a restraint on human liberty ... "

Pope Leo XIII (1878-1903) "To remedy these wrongs (in society) the socialists, working on the poor man's envy of the rich, are striving to do away with private property, and contend that individual possessions should become the common property of all, to be administered by the State or by municipal bodies. They hold that by thus transferring property from private individuals to the community, the present mischievous state of things will be set to rights, inasmuch as each citizen will then get his fair share of whatever there is to enjoy. But (if) their contentions ... were carried into effect, the working man himself would be among the first to suffer." (tfp.org;

PARISH LENTEN PROJECT

This year's Lenten Project is dedicated to supporting the people of southern Puerto Rico who have been impacted by the earthquakes earlier this year. Please check the display in the Narthex to see documentation of the devastation that has taken place. The Puerto Rico Electric Power Authority was still dealing with a fragile grid from Hurricane Maria's devastation in 2017 when the earthquake hit and knocked out power to 75 percent of the island. The Immaculate Conception Church in Guayanilla, dating back to the 1840's, sustained major damage. Churches, convents, rectories, schools and homes were destroyed in 16 villages leaving people to live in tents, public squares, and their cars. Donations may be placed in the Lenten house in the Narthex and will be sent to Pastor Angel Pagan who will personally deliver it to the Bishop of the Diocese of Ponce.

As always, we thank you for your support and generosity during this Lenten season and throughout the year.
