Growing through the Sunday Scriptures

April 19, 2020 **Second Sunday of Easter (Divine Mercy Sunday)** Acts of the Apostles 2: 42-47 Psalm 118: 2-4, 13-15, 22-24 1 Peter 1:3-9 John 20: 19-34

A reading from the Holy Gospel according to John::

On the evening of that first day of the week, when the doors were locked, where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you."

When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you."

And when he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them.

"Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained." Thomas, called Didymus, one of the Twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples said to him, "We have seen the Lord."

But he said to them.

"Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger into the nail marks and put my hand into his side, I will not believe."

Now a week later his disciples were again inside and Thomas was with them. Jesus came, although the doors were locked, and stood in their midst and said.

"Peace be with you."

Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands, and bring your hand and put it into my side, and do not be unbelieving, but believe."

Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!"

Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."

Now, Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples that are not written in this book. But these are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through this belief you may have life in his name

FR. ANTONY'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

HAPPY and BLESSED EASTER.

The first Easter was on that Sunday Morning when Jesus rose from the dead. When the women went to the tomb, they found it empty. They saw an angel at the tomb saying to them that Jesus is risen. When our Deacons and I celebrated the Easter Vigil we had the same feeling... Jesus is Risen and the church is empty.

Emptiness is negative if we doubt what is going to happen. But in the light of Easter, emptiness means that something unimaginable, something bigger than Death, the RESURRECTION is taking place. Though the virus has made us stick to our homes and made all public gatherings (even the gatherings of worshippers) empty, let us try to live the moments like Easter-people in HOPE and MIRACLE that can happen by all that we can do in good faith, that is, the great Healing in our social distancing and in praying in our families and receiving God's grace of Healing in body, mind and soul.

Thus Easter announces the time of Spring not only in Nature but also in the Soul. Nature that went to sleep during winter is springing up with new life. Likewise Easter, the feast of the Resurrection of Jesus from death, awakens in us the Hope and power to live a New and Everlasting life. For those who believe in Jesus, every moment of living is a moment of hope and newness. Especially at the time of the Corona virus the words of St. John Paul II invite us to celebrate Easter in encouragement and enthusiasm. "Do not abandon yourselves to despair. We are the Easter people and Hallelujah our song."

Let us come out of our fear and anxiety. Let us begin to live the fact of concern for each other. Let us face the moments of fear with faith. Let the words of Dwight Moody empower us to spring up with the mood of the Spring-time. "We are told to let our light shine and if it does we won't need to tell anybody it does. Lighthouses don't fire cannons to call attention to their shining –they just shine." Let us shine. Let us catch the revelation of Jesus in His resurrection. Let each of us not say merely 'Christ is Risen,' but 'I shall rise.'

On the lighter side especially at this time when we are stuck in our homes I just want to share with you some humorous lines my friend emailed to me.

- Homeschool day 1: wondering how I can get this kid transferred out of my class.
- This is the day dogs have been waiting for. They realize their owners can't leave the house and they get them 24/7. While dogs are rejoicing everywhere, cats are contemplating suicide.
- I wonder if God got so mad about all of our fighting down here that He sent us to our rooms!
- Don't know why my fishing buddy is worried about the coronavirus, he never catches anything!

Focus on Religious Freedom

A Theology of Religious Freedom

Religious freedom, the right of man to follow his conscience, is rooted in the nature of God and the nature of man. It is God's original design for humanity.

"God said, 'Let us make man in our image, after our likeness' (Gen 1:26) So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them" (Gen 1:27)

Therefore, human beings are created for relationship with God and God desires relationship with us. But a relationship with God can never be coerced or forced. Authentic relationships must be entered into freely. So, God Himself has given human beings freedom to embrace or reject him. Therefore, God's basic design for humanity gives rise to religious freedom. (1) (p.21)

Being made in God's image means, among other things, that we reflect what God is like through our creativity, capacity for reason, sense of moral responsibility, and ability to make choices. Being made in God's image means we're created with a unique capacity to enter loving relationships with one another and with God Himself. (p.24)

This, ultimately, is the origin of religious liberty. We can't have an authentic relationship with God unless we have the freedom to embrace or reject Him. And if God Himself doesn't coerce us, how much less should the government. When the government tries to prevent us from freely relating to God - it is elevating itself above God and violating the created order. (p. 28)

Hence, religious freedom requires that the government, within reasonable limits, leaves religion alone as much as possible. (p.38)

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

"We have 37 remote parishes of Native Alaskans, pretty much on 'lock down' that could benefit

enormously from the Pastoral Letter."

Catholic Long Islanders stand in the solidarity of the Risen Lord with Catholic Alaskans! This is just

another example of the global Catholic solidarity that our Holy Father Pope Francis models for us

and calls us to.

Thank you for continuing to support your parish and the vital ministries of our Church as your

spiritual and physical needs of people during this crisis. Weekly collections mailed or given online

will be critical to the sustaining and reemergence of our parishes.

Our Easter joy may be delayed this year, but our faith, hope and trust in the power of Jesus

Christ's death and resurrection must shine brighter than ever. The cross of this crisis offers us the

opportunity for a renewed and lasting appreciation for the gift of family and the transformative

power of faith.

Know that you and all your families are in my heart and in my prayers as we celebrate *The Great*

Week, Easter Sunday, the Easter Octave, Divine Mercy Sunday and the Easter Season.
